FOREWORD

Since the war the Year Book has been published in the same volume as the Rules and Regulations of the Association, however, this year, with the new Revised Rules and Regulations, it was thought advisable to make two volumes, one volume containing only the Rules and Regulations and the other volume the Year Book for the school year of 1949-1950.

The Year Book is prepared annually so that schools may have a convenient and complete history of the events of the South Dakota High School Athletic Association. Previous Year Books have been published in 1924, 1927, 1964, 1940, 1942, 1946, 1947, 1948, and 1949. Only office copies of the early editions are available and, therefore, it is not possible to furnish a school with any of the early editions. However, should any school need a copy of the 1946, 1947, 1948, or 1949 Year Books, a limited number are available and can be furnished upon request.

HISTORY

1949-1950

1949-50 was a pleasant although very eventful year in the history of the Association. As in 1948-49, there was apparently more participation in all branches of athletics and as much, if not greater, fan interest than ever before. Schools seemed to be back to normal for the first time since the war, all schools had full-time coaches and the coaching, in turn, showed definite improvement with teams on a whole better or equal to any team since pre-war days. The growth of athletics in South Dakota has been very rapid, sound, and, we believe, in a healthy condition.

The events following are described briefly in the order of which they occurred:

Tennis and Golf

The eighteenth annual Golf and Tennis Tournamenta were again held in Brookings August 9th and 10th, 1949. Participation increased slightly in the Tennis Tournament and the Golf Tournament attracted a very satisfactory entry list.

Bob Hoffman of Pierre was the singles champion in tennis, defeating Jerry Popowski of Aberdeen in the finals of the singles tournament. A doubles team from Aberdeen, composed of Jerry Popowski and Gerald Kambestad, won the doubles tournament, defeating the Rapid City team of Wallace McCullen and Kenneth Urban.

George Andree of Watertown won the medal Golf Tournament and with his team-mate, Merle Griffin, won team championship.

1949 Coaching School

At the request of the coaches, the 1949 Coaching School was moved to a more central location, meeting this year at Huron College, Huron, South Dakota. The talent for the School was as follows: Clarence "Biggie" Munn, Head Football Coach at Michigan State University, handled football; Coach Ev. Shelton, Head Basketball Coach at the University of Wyoming, handled basketball; Ray Duncan of the Department of Public Instruction of Illinois handled & Man football; and Lloyd Stein of the University of Minnesota took care of training problems and demonstrated how to care for injuries and how to prevent injuries. The School was very well attended and we feel that it was one of the best coaching schools conducted any place in the United States.

Cross Country Run

On October 20th, the fourth annual Cross Country Run was held at Brookings. The event was won by Jim Wylie of Sioux Falls, with Robert Snyder of Rapid City being second. Rapid City won the team championship with 12 points placing men. Second, third and seventh, Sioux Falls, was second in team competition, placing men in first, fourth and twenty-first positions for 26 points.

Biennial Meeting of the Association

According to the regulations of the South Dakota High School Athletic Association, there is no meeting in the odd years when there is no general meeting of the SDEA and, in the Fall of 1949, there was no general meeting of the South Dakota High School Athletic Association; therefore, no amendments could be submitted and, as a consequence, the Rules and Regulations for 1950-1951 are exactly the same as for 1948-1949.

In the alternate years when there is no meeting of the Association, nominations for members of the Board of Control are made by nominating petitions. The regular term of Sup't R. V. Hunkins of Lead was to expire, so a nominating petition was filed for him to succeed himself as a member of the Board of Control. Another vacancy occurred with the death of the late Howard Wood of Sioux Falls, to which position no one had been appointed. Nominating petitions for Coach E. N. Cobb of Rapid City and Coach A. A. Quintal of Mitchell were presented and, in the subsequent election, Mr. Hunkins was elected to succeed himself with no opposition and Coach Quintal of Mitchell defeated Coach Cobb of Rapid City for the vacancy on the Board.

Basketball Tournaments

Emery won the 1950 "B" Basketball Tournament and Mitchell was the winner of the 1950 "A" Basketball Tournament. Both tournaments were outstandinging.

Emery, the "B" Champion, did something few, if any other teams, have been able to do; that is, enter a state tournament for the first time in the history of the school and win the championship.

In the "A" Tournament, Mitchell came through in flying colors. The 1950 "A" Tournament was somewhat different than the 1949 Tournament in that there were several changes in teams representing their schools in the State "A" Tournament.

Emery and Mitchell were and are very good teams. Attendance at the "A" and "B" Tournaments did not quite reach the record high of 1949, however, both tournaments were close and exceptionally well played.

Track

The 1950 State Track Meet was held in Aberdeen. The number of participants in the Track Meet was larger than any other State Track Meet in the history of the Association. The quality of the competitors was also very good.

Aberdeen won the "A" Track Meet, and Egan won the "B" Track Meet.

Complete results of the basketball tournaments and other events will be found on other pages in the Year Book.

EVENTS FOR 1950-1951

The Tennis and Golf Tournament will be held in Watertown on August 8th and 9th, 1950.

The Coaching School will again be in Huron, starting August 15th and running through August 18th.

The Cross Country Run will again be at Brookings on October 21st.

The State "B" Basketball Tournament will be in Mitchell on March 8th, 9th, and 10th, 1951, with the "A" Tournament the following week in Sloux Falls.

The 1951 State Track Meet will be in Huron on the 18th and 19th of May, 1951.

Since 1960 is the year in which the South Dakota Education Association Meeting is held, therefore, according to the Rules and Regulations of the SDHSAA, there will be a regular Biennal Meeting of the Association in Rapid City on Tuesday, October 24th.

Should member schools wish to submit amendments to the Rules and Regulations of the Association, such amendments must be in the hands of the Executive Secretary not later than 30 days prior to the date of the Biennial Meeting.

Nominations for members of the Board of Control will be made from the floor at the Biennal Meeting.




