#### FOREWORD

This Year Book is prepared annually so that member schools may have a convenient and complete history of the events of the South Dakota High School Athletic Association. Most member schools should have copies of all previous Year Books. They have been published in 1924, 1927, 1934, 1940, 1942, 1946, 1947, 1948, 1949, and 1950. Of the early editions, none are available for distribution. However, a few copies of the recent Year Books are available and can be furnished member schools upon request.

#### HISTORY

#### 1950-1951

The school year of 1950-51 has been quite unusual and a very interesting year for those interested in High School athletics. Athletic competition has improved tremendously. Large numbers participated in the Tennis and Golf Tournaments, the Cross County Run held its own, and Basketball improved. There were more good "B" Basketball teams during the year than ever before. The "A" Basketball teams, after a very mediocre start, showed as much class, if not more, by tournament time than the "A" schools in the past. It seems impossible to improve, but we have thought that yearly.

The largest number of boys to ever participate in the State Track Meet was on hand in Huron for the Meet; 257 from "B" schools actually participated in the State Meet and 243 boys from the "A" schools took part, making a total of 500 individuals in the State Meet.

Amendments submitted before the biennial meeting and voted upon after the meeting, have changed the basketball program in the state somewhat. First, no member school shall play more than eighteen games on or after December 1, exclusive of tournaments and the "A" and "B" setup has been altered so that the 32 largest member schools by enrollment will be the "A" schools for the next two years. This removed the 16 largest "B" schools which necessitated re-districting of the "B" class.

Supt. R. E. Hald of Faulkton was elected to a position on the Board of Control to succeed A. P. Sonstegaard, now of Redfield, who had resigned from the Board when he moved from Bridge-water a town of less than one thousand population, to Redfield. The same thing has now happened to Mr. Hald who will move to Clark to take over the Superintendency there, a town of more than 1000 in population, thus again creating a vacancy on the Board of Control.

The events of the Year are briefly described in chronological order:

### Tennis and Golf

The 19th annual Golf and Tennis Tournaments were played on August 8 and 9, 1950. The number of participants in these fine events was somewhat increased and fine Tennis and Golf were played.

Don Grebin, of Washington High School in Sioux Falls, was the Singles champion in Tennis, defeating Gerald Kambestad of Aberdeen in the finals of the tournament.

In the doubles Tournament, the Washington High School team, Don Grebin and Dean Belbas, defeated the Mitchell team of Jerald Shaw and Richard Roth in the finals of the Doubles Tournament.

In the 19th annual Golf Tournament, George Andree, of Watertown shot sensational golf on the 2nd and 4th rounds to win the individual event from Bob Binder of Yankton. In team competition, Andree and his team-mate Jerry Crump had a decisive margin over Cyrus Richards and Giles Phelps of Aberdeen.

#### 1950 Coaching School

The largest Coaching School ever held was in Huron on August 15, 16, 17, and 18, 1950. Not only was it the largest in attendance but we believe the best aince the school was renewed following World War II. Don Faurot, of the University of Missouri, the father of the now famous "Split T" was the football instructor. Bruce Drake of the University of Oklahoma, handle the basketball sessions and showed the workings of the famous Drake "Shuffie", but more important gave the Coaches many ideas on fundamentals and how the game should be played. H. R. Dieterick of the Teachers College at Maryville, Mis-

souri, rendered great service to the Six-Man Football coaches of the state, and Lloyd Stein, head trainer from the University of Minnesota, for the third straight year, showed the assembled coaches new ideas in taping and treatment of athletic injuries.

Huron College handled local arrangements for the school and handled their end beautifully.

### Cross Country Run

In an event which attracted fifty-one starters from twelve schools, Dennis Ragatz of Frankfort ran away from the pack to pick up the individual honors in the annual event. Pearson of Madison Central was second and Wylie of Sioux Falls was third.

Rapid City won the team event with their runners coming in as follows: Osness, 4th; Kiel, 5th; and Clair, 6th for 15 points. Madison and Sioux Falls tied for second with 24 points each.

### Biennial Meeting of the Association

The Biennial Meeting of the Association was held at Rapid City on Oct. 24, 1950, at the time of the State SDEA Convention as provided for in the Rules and Regulations of the Association. Four amendments were submitted. Briefly, they are as follows: No. 1—An amendment to limit a member school to 16 basketball games exclusive of tournaments after Dec. 1. This was amended at the meeting to read 18 games. The amendment as amended passed upon referendum voting and for the school year of 1951-52 and in subsequent years, no member school can play more than 18 games on or after December 1st, exclusive of tournament games during the basketball season.

Amendment No. 2 would have prohibited a team from a member school from participating in more than one Conference, County, or Invitational Tournament. This amendment failed, so for 1951-52 there is no change in the tournament rules. A school may participate in as many tournaments as they so desire.

Amendment No. 3 changed the exchange of eligibility lists for 1951-52. Eligibility lists must be sent only to the Executive Secretary's office. This must be done before any contest with another school is played. Additions and subtractions to the list must be made and sent to the Executive Secretary's office before such students can participate. Amendment No. 4 provided that the 32 largest schools should be the "A" schools and that they be divided into 8 regions of 4 teams each and the winner of each tournament to qualify for the State "A" Tournament. This amendment was amended at the biennial meeting so that the 32 largest schools were to be the "A" schools for two years, and that representatives from each of the 32 schools and the Board of Control shall meet and set up the "A" plan for the two-year period. This amendment passed and on May 17, 1951, such meeting was held in Huron, and the result was that the 32 schools were divided into 8 Regions, each Region to play a single elimination tournament with the winner of each of the 8 Regions qualifying for the State "A" Tournament. Following is the arrangement of schools:

 7. Custer, Hot Springs, Rapid City, Sturgis.
 8. Belle Fourche, Deadwood, Lead, Spearfish.

Nominations for members to the Board of Control were made as follows: Supt. Vern Hutchison of Arlington was nominated to succeed himself to a regular five year team expiring July 1, 1956. There was no opposition. For the unexpired term ending July 1, 1953, the member to be from a town or city of 1000 or less in population, Supt. R. E. Hald of Faulkton and Supt. A. L. Stoddard of Selby were nominated and in the subsequent voting, Mr. Hald was elected.

#### Basketball Tournaments

In two of the best basketball tournaments in history, Harrold High School won the 1951 "B" Crown, and Sturgis won the 1951 "A" Title. Both tournaments were filled with outstanding games and individual stars were numerous.

Harrold, the new "B" champion, did what Emery did in 1950, that is, they entered the tournament for the first time in history and after a few rocky moments in their first game, went on to win in a very systematic manner. Sturgls, one of the smaller "A" schools established a remarkable record by winning the championship for the second time in six years and in addition were the runner-up in 1948. Sturgls was a remarkable team which improved as the tournament progressed and really hit their peak in the championship game playing near perfect precision basketball.

#### Track

In the 1951 State Meet history was really made. First, more boys participated in the State Track Meet than ever before, and second, three teams tied for first place in the "A" Meet, Sioux Falls, Brookings, and Vermillion, wound the two-day Meet with 21 points each, and in the "B" Meet, by winning the last event, the Mile Relay, DeSmet tied with Springfield, each having 26 points to tie for first place.

In the Meet, outstanding performances were the rule and not the exception. Two State Meet records were broken and most of the others were menaced. It was truly a great Meet.

Complete summaries of the Tennis and Golf Tournaments, the Cross Country Run, the Basketball Tournaments, and the Track Meets will be found on other pages in this Year Book.

#### **EVENTS FOR 1951-1952**

The Tennis and Golf Tournaments will be held in Sloux Falls on Friday and Saturday, August 10 and 11.

The Annual Coaching School will again be in Huron on August 14, 15, 16, and 17.

The Cross Country Run will be held in Brookings again on Hobo Day.

The State "B" Basketball Tournament will be in Sloux Falis on March 6, 7, 8, 1952.

The State "A" Tournament will be in Mitchell on March 13, 14, 15, 1952.

The State Track Meet will again be in Huron May 16, and 17, 1952. There will be no biennial meeting of the Association since this is the off year and no statewide convention of the SDEA. However, nominations for membership on the Board of Control are to be by nominating petitions. There will be two positions to be voted on—first, for a regular term ending July 1, 1957. The incumbent is Principal C. H. Holgate of Aberdeen. The second, for an unexpired term ending July 1, 1953, the member to be from a city or town whose population is 1000 or less.

Nominating petitions containing signatures of representatives from at least ten different member schools must be prepared. These nominating petitions are to be in the hands of the Executive Secretary not later than Nov. 10, 1951. Article V. Section 3, of the Rules and Regulations of the SDHSAA.




