In addition to the "name" coaches in Football and Basketball, Bill Cramer of Kansas discussed Training methods, Wes Evans of Rapid City discussed his methods of "T" formation quarterbacking, Bob Burns of Sioux Falls discussed the spinner series in a single wing attack, Bill Welch of Claremont lectured and demonstrated on Six Man Football and Harold White discussed the "Lane Attack" in Basketball.

Huron College and Huron High School handled all local arrangements for the Coaching School and again did a marvelous job.

1952 CROSS COUNTRY RUN OCTOBER 18, 1952

Fifty-Six runners from 14 schools started the 1952 Cross Country Run. The number was a slight drop from 1951, but better than several other years in which the event has been run. Since its inauguration in 1946 it has been an annual event and has always been held in Brookings on "Hobo Day", State College's Annual Homecoming Event. Jim Emmerich, Track Coach at State College has handled the event each year since its inception and has done a marvelous job.

In 1952 Wayne Ragatz of Frankfort really broke all previous existing records when he raced to first place and in doing so, established a record of 12 minutes, 17½ seconds which is 24½ seconds faster than the time set by George Blackman of Cheyenne in 1951. Running Wolf and Cox of the Flandreau Indian School were second and third respectively.

In team competition the Flandrau Indian School was the winner with 2nd, 3rd, and 4th places. Monroe's team was second with Stoux Falls, third.

BIENNIAL MEETING OF THE ASSOCIATIONS OCTOBER 21, 1952

The regular Biennal Meeting of the SDHSAA was held Tuesday, Oct. 21, 1952, in Sioux Falls, Actions were discussed in the History for 1952-53 on other pages of this Year Book. Complete minutes of the meeting will be published prior to the next Biennial Meeting of the Association.

BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

Basketball interest may have waned in some sections of the country but not so in South Dakota, if attendance at District, Region, Section and State Tournaments can be used to judge interest. Figures on elimination Tournaments and the State Tournaments are the highest in the history of basketball in South Dakota.

The second year of the new "A" and "B" set up dispelled any doubts as to interest especially in the "B" class of basketball. The "B" Tournament was held in the new spacious Arena in Huron and the most optimistic estimates on crowd attendance were that the building would be filled for the finals. This estimate was knocked in the head for the opening session. In fact, for each championship session the place was filled to capacity and over.

The "A" Tournament in Sioux Falls, after a rather poor opening session, was also filled to capacity for each championship session.

Onida, a smooth well-coached team came through the "B" Tournament with the Championship. All round team play won this Tournament, each individual on the team playing championship ball.

Aberdeen, because they were ready, won the "A" Tournament in a convincing manner. Far from the favorite at the start, they improved as they went along and truly deserved the championship. They were soundly coached and their ability to change their type of play led to their winning of the championship.

TRACK MAY 15-16, 1953

Four records fell, in the State Meet and the largest number of competitors ever to participate took part in the Meet at Mitchell this spring. A. A. "Joe" Quintal, veteran Athletic Director and Coach, ran this Meet off in a remarkable manner. Never was there a hitch and the weather man was most cooperative.

Washington High School of Sloux Falls won the "A" Meet and Tyndall and Burke tied for the Championship in th "B" Meet,

Records broken in the Meet were in the 880 Yard Relay, the 120 Yard High Hurdles, the 180 Yard Low Hurdles and the Pole Vault.

HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 and at that time until 1912, had competition on a statewide basis in track and debate. In 1912 Huron College sponsored a state high school basketball tournament, which was open to all high school teams. This tournament continued until 1917 when, at the request of Huron College, it was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has been managed by the Board since that time. The number of teams in the state tournament varied until 1924 when eight teams participated. Since 1924 the state tournament has been an eight team affair with the exceptions of 1939, 1940 and 1941 when four team "A" tournament was tried.

when four team "A" tournaments were tried.

From the mid 1920's there was agitation for two classes and in 1930 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. The 1930 plan was as follows: The state was divided into thirty-two districts. The thirty-two winners went to eight "A" regions and from there the eight winners qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The thirty-two runners-up in the district tournaments went to eight "B" regions and the eight winners thereof qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan was not popular and was used but once. Agitation continued, however, and in the fall of 1935 an "A" and "B" plan was developed whereby the schools with enrollments of 300 or over were the "A" schools and all others were the "B" schools. Under this plan the top teams in the Eastern South Dakota Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament and the lower teams in the Conference competed with the other "A" schools to eliminate down to the number needed to put eight teams in the State "A" Tournament. "B" teams were given the right to challenge "A" teams for the right to enter the "A" Tournament. From this plan the present plan has developed.

The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in 1936.

Starting with the 1951-52 season, another change was made in the "A" and "B" setup. Basically the plan is as follows: The 32 largest member schools, by enrollment, are the "A" schools; thus the number of "A" schools was increased from 16 to 32. All other schools are "B" schools, and the "B" set-up was basically the same as in the past several years except for considerable redistricting.

For the "A" schools the state was divided into eight (8) four-team sections, single elimination tournaments were played in each section with the eight (8) section winners qualifying for the State "A" Tournament. The plan is to run two years. For 1952 the new plan was very successful.






