FOREWORD

This Year Book serves as an Annual Report of the Executive Secretary and does provide each school with a complete history of the Association for the school year just closed. We attempt to accurately summarize all events in high school athletics during the year. All state-wide events are summarized and are listed in this book in the order in which they occurred.

Some of our Member Schools have a complete file of these Year Books, and by having this file, have a complete history of the Association back to the time of it's origin in 1905. This does not mean that a Year Book has been printed each year since 1905. The first was published in 1927 and contains a summary of all events back to the first annual Track Meet in the spring of 1906. The second of these was published in 1934. The third in 1940; the fourth in 1942 and the fifth in 1946. Since 1946 a Year Book has been printed and distributed to each member school each year.

Naturally we cannot provide additional copies of the older issues, but a few of the issues since 1946 are available to our Member Schools.

Starting with the 1953 issue, pictures of all teams and individuals who have participated in or who have won state-wide events are shown. We have missed a few of the pictures, but very few. We hope you will enjoy this issue of the Year Book and we also hope that it will be filed in your school with previous issues so that you will have a complete history of the SDHSAA.

SDHSAA HISTORY 1955-1956

The school year of 1955-1956, was one of the most successful and pleasant years in the long history of the SDHSAA. Participation, in athletics, seemed to be greater and without doubt the quality of all interscholastic athletics improved. We may have had, a few better teams in the past, and perhaps a few individual athletes who were better than this year, but never have we had so many good teams and individuals in all sizes of schools.

Our coaching seems to improve, not only in better teaching the fundamentals of the games, but a better understanding of the purpose of athletics. Sportsmanship among coaches, and players is at a very high level. Officiating is improving and fan interest remains keen.

Local programs, in individual schools have improved, showing interest in and a desire to have well rounded athletic programs, by the administration of member schools. By and large the school year of 1955-1956, athletically, is a high spot in the long history of high school athletics in South Dakota. Boards of Education, Superintendents, Principals, Athletic Directors and the Coaches, all have had a part in this remarkably successful year. The Board of Control and the Executive Secretary of the SDHSAA want to express their pleasure at the part everyone has played to make interscholastic athletics more worthwhile.

The event of the Association are, here, briefly mentioned in the order in which they took place and summaries of all events are to be found, along with many pictures, on the following pages of this report.

First events to be held in 1955-1956, which really belong to the year of 1954-1955 were the Tennis and Golf Tournaments in Brookings on August 2 and 3, 1955. A smaller number participated in the Tennis Tournaments than the year before, but about the same number took part in Golf.

The Annual Coaching School was, again, held in Huron August 16, 17, 18 and 19. About 215 attended all or part of the school. The number is considered very satisfactory, but all coaches should be there.

A series of 15 Football Rules Meetings was held in various parts of the state with over 1000 attending these meetings. For the first time, an Assistant was secured to handle six of the meetings, thus all but 3 of the meetings were completed before the first full Football date of the season. Again in 1956, Howard Connors of Vermillion, will assist in conducting these meetings.

Football in the High Schools of South Dakota increased. The number of 11-man teams was about the same in 1955 as in 1954. 6-man Football also kept about the same number, however there were about 20-25 8-man teams playing last fall, some of these schools had previously played 6-man football, but the number going up to 8-man was offset by new 6-man teams. Therefore, there probably was quite a sizeable increase in the number of schools and the number of boys playing football.

Since 1955 was an "off" year as far as SDEA Convention was concerned, there was no biennial meeting of the SDHSAA and consequently no changes in the Rules and Regulations of the SDHSAA. Superintendent Vern Hutchinson of Arlington was nominated, by petition, to succeed himself as a member of the Board of Control. No other petitions were filed, so Mr. Hutchinson was ree-lected without a ballot.

A series of 20 Basketball Rules Meetings, all conducted by the Executive Secretary, were held in 20 different areas of the state. The meetings were attended by about 1500 officials, coaches, players and fans. The number is greater than in other years. Also, the number of officials certified for 1955-56 was greater than ever before.

Interest in basketball remained high. There was a slight decrease in attendance at the District, Region and Section Tournaments, but the State "A" and "B" Tournaments drew more people than ever before.

Despite a cold, dismal spring, the track program continued to grow, and while in the 1956 State Track Meet no meet records were broken, two of the better records, both Hurdies, were tied. To show the quality of competition, the Aberdeen Relays were postponed because of ice and snow and were re-scheduled on a date after the State Meet. 15 records were broken.

The State Meet was held in Huron, May 18 and 19, with 262 boys from 46 "A" Schools and 270 boys from 97 "B" schools, actually taking part in the State Meet.

TENNIS AND GOLF August 2-3, 1955

The twenty-fourth Annual Golf and Tennis Tournaments were held in Brookings on Auugst 2 and 3 with L. A. "Lefty" Johnson and H. B. MacDougal of Brookings managing the Tennis Tournaments, which were played on the State College Courts. L. D. Horrigan and N. A. Johnson of Brookings handled the Golf Tournament, which was played at the Brookings Country Club Course.

Ten (10) players participated in the singles Tennis Tournament, which was won by John Simko of Sioux Falls. Simko defeated his teammate from Sioux Falls, Mike Rost, in the finals. Five tennis teams took part in the doubles Tournament with Simko and Rost of Sioux Falls, defeating Herb and Harold MacDougal of Brookings for the doubles Championship.

Thirty-two(32) high school golfers, teed off in the Golf Tournament, eighteen holes were played on August 2 and eighteen on August 3. At the conclusion of the firing, Ed "Butch" Olson of Aberdeen was the individual Champion, shooting a good 154 for 36 hole total. John Steen of Brookings was second with 157. In team competition, Olson with 154 and Norman Scott of Aberdeen with 160 had the low total score of 314. Mike Gibson and Wes Plumber of Sioux Fallis were next with a total of 327.

1955 COACHING SCHOOL August 16, 17, 18, 19, 1955

A total of well over 200 Coaches attended all or part of the 1955 Tuition Free Coaching School. All expressed themselves as pleased with the school and the individual instructors.

"Milt" Bruhn, Line Coach at the University of Wisconsin, handled the football part of the school. Milt knew his material and was pleasing to the Coaches. He was very willing to talk football, after his lectures, with individuals or small groups. (Note: Milt has, since his visit to our School, become the Head Football Coach at Wisconsin University.)

"Bucky" O'Connor of Iowa University was a very popular instructor in basketball. His high school experiences and experience as Freshman Basketball Coach at Iowa, before becoming the Head Coach, all worked together to make his lectures and demonstrations benefical to the coaches. His enthusiasm was so intense that coaches couldn't help but be benefited.

H. V. Porter of Chicago, Executive Secretary of the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations, Secretary of the National Federation's Football Rules Committee and Secretary of the National Basketball Committee of the United States and Canada, appeared on the program twice. He told of High School Athletic problems on a nation-wide basis—then conducted a session on the Football Rules and another session on Basketball Rules. His appearance was much appreciated.

Dan Lennon of the University of South Dakota handled the track part of the School. His first session was of the lecture type with movies of the 1955 State Meet. His second session, a double session, was at the track, where he lectured and demonstrated and then used some of his own track men to tell more and show how they performed in their favorite events. The track part of the school was very good and unusual.

Howard Kortmeyer of Volga and Jack Friedel of Plankinton, both very successful six-man football coaches, handled a couple of sessions on six-man football. Reports tell of excellent instruction and lots of material covered.

R. "Kickapoo" Logan of Los Angeles entertained as well as giving sound instruction in the care of and prevention of injuries. His popularity was attested by the fact that the Coaches recommendation for talent for the 1956 School, included him at the top of their list. (Note: He will again appear in 1956)

Wally Diehl of Sioux Falls and Fred Littau of White River, Coaches of the 1955 "A" and "B" Basketball Champions, divided one period, giving their ideas on basketball and how they prepared their teams for the tournaments. Both men did excellent jobs and both were again represented at the 1956 Tournaments, with Diehl's team, again winning the "A" Tournament.

In addition to the above, a professional team of Trampoline Preformers, lectured on and demonstrated the ways the trampoline could be used in a secondary school's Physical Education program. After their lectures they put on a real demonstration of how a professional could perform on a trampoline. The Coaches are indebted to the Nissen Trampoline Company for this part of the program.

The SDHSAA is deeply indebted to Huron groups and individuals

who made the school a decided success. They included Dr. D. E. Kerr, Dr. N. N. Spencer, W. W. Trusler and Jim Long of Huron College; J. W. Slocum, G. G. Bell and Paul Marschalk of Huron High School; and to Bill Tredway and Bob Johnson who served as the Recreation Committee representing the City of Huron.

Another feature of the School was a dinner, given by the Service Clubs of Huron, with each member of the various clubs having one of the visiting coaches as his guest. Each member of the Coaching School staff spoke briefly.

1955 FOOTBALL RULES MEETINGS

Well over 1000 Officials, Coaches, players and fans attended the 1955 Football Rules Meetings. For the first time since the sart of the meetings in 1937, an assistant was used. The assistant, Howard Connors of Vermillion, bandled six of the meetings with the Executive Secretary of the SDHSAA handling the other nine. The Football season, in South Dakota, is short and with one man handling the meetings, most schools have played three games before the meetings are over. By the use of an extra man, we are able to hold twelve meetings before the first main football date and the other three meetings before th second football date. We feel that this was a decided improvement over previous years.

1955 CROSS COUNTRY RUN

October 22, 1955

Forty-nine runners from thirteen different high schools, took part in the Annual Cross Country Run. The number was down from the meet of 1954. For the first time since the beginning of the event, it was not run on Hobo Day at Brookings. The purpose of this was to avoid congestion, and to see is participants were entering the event so they could attend the Hobo Day festivities and Football game. The number of schools entering would indicate that there is interest in the event.

Weather conditions were good, and the course was in excellent condition. The course record was not broken but Harvey Pequette of the Flandreau Indian High School won in the excellent time of 11:50.3. Ivan Red Horse also of the Flandreau Indian School was second and Bob Shuck of Sioux Falls was third.

In team competition (first three from a school to finish) the Flandreau Indians were first, Sioux Falls second, and Rapid City third. A complete summary of the meet will be found on other pages of this publication.

BASKETBALL RULES MEETINGS

Starting October 17th, your Executive Secretaary conducted a series of Basketball Rules Meetings. There were twenty of these meetings with the last meeting scheduled December 1st. All changes in the Rules were discussed, officiating methods were studied and the new Basketball Film "Basketball Today" was shown.

Approximately 1500 attended the meetings and it was very gratifying to find that a greater number of Basketball Officials than ever before attended the meetings.

On November 25th your Executive Secretary also conducted two Basketball Rules Meetings at the North Dakota Basketball Coaching School at Valley City. One meeting for all who attended the Clinic and one meeting for officials only. There were about 250 attending these sessions.

NO BIENNIAL MEETING

Since 1955 was the "off year", there was no biennial meeting of the SDHSAA. No changes were made in the "Rules and Regulations" of the Association.

Nominating petitions, as required by the "Rules and Regulations" of the SDHSAA in "off years" were properly presented for Supt. Vern Hutchinson of Arlington to succeed himself as a member of the Board of Control. No other petitions were filed so Mr. Hutchinson was automatically reelected to a 5 year term to expire July 1, 1961.

NATIONAL FEDERATION FOOTBALL RULES MEETING

Your Executive Secretary, as a member of the High School Football Rules Committee, attended the annual Rules Meeting in Nashville, Tennessee on January 5, and 6, 1956. Few changes in the Football Code were made and these will be discussed at the 1956 Football Rules Meetings, starting August 29, 1956.

BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

Each year we think that the tournaments could not be better and each year they have been better. Attendance was as great as possible, apparently limited entirely by the capacity of the Arenas where the tournaments are held. Better than the large crowds, however, has been the attitude of these crowds, there seems to be a higher degree of sportsmanship among the fans as well as the student bodies, the Coaches and the players themselves.

The management at both tournaments has been wonderful. In both Aberdeen and Huron, past experience has helped with present management and we are constantly amazed at the new ideas and new refinements the management has come up with yearly.

Howard High School won the "B" Tournament defeating a fine Cresbard team in the finals. Washington High School of Sioux Falls repeated as Champions in the "A" Tournament, but only after a terrific battle with Rapid City in the finals. More complete details on both the "A" and "B" Tournaments will be found on other pages in this report.

NATIONAL BASKETBALL RULES COMMITTEE

For the second year, your Executive Secretary was appointed, by the National Federation's Executive Committee, to be one of the four High School Rrepesentatives on the National Basketball Committee of the United States and Canada and because of this to attend the annual meeting of this Committee, this year in Chicago on March 24 and 25, 1956.

At the meeting there were several rather major rule changes made, some supported and some opposed by the High School representatives. These major changes in the rules will be discussed at our local Rules Meetings starting in mid October.

One change which was to be effective for High Schools starting with the 1957-1958 season has to do with floor markings at the free throw lanes, by widening the lanes from 6 feet to 12 feet. After the change was announced there was strong sentiment to put the rule into effect for the 1956-57 season. Therefore, the member schools of the Association were polled and the result as follows: About 200 schools returned their ballots and only 13 opposed the immediate change. Therefore, starting with the basketball season of 1956-57 all basket ball in South Dakota will be played on courts using the wide lanes.

STATE TRACK MEETS

The 49th Annual Track and Field Meet produced no new State Meet Records, although two records were tied, however this did not detract from the meet, all races were close and one of the finest meets in the 49 year history was held. 532 boys actually took part in the Meet.

Athletic Director, Paul Marschalk of Huron, charged with the responsibility of making the meet run off smoothly, did a beautiful job. His staff was well organized and because of this the meet was run off smoothly and efficiently. The weather man, who had not cooperated well for early meets, provided excellent weather for the State Meet.

Washington High School of Sioux Falls, again, won th "A" Meet and Tyndall High School, repeated as the "B" Meet Champions.

Complete summaries, with picture of the winners will be found on other pages of this Year Book. Colored movies, with sound, were taken of all final events in the Meet.

BOARD OF CONTROL ACTIONS

1955-1956

(1) Officers of the Board of Control for 1955-56 were elected as follows: Supt. Vern Hutchinson, Arlington, Chairman; Coach A. A. Quintal of Mitchell, Vice Chairman; Supt. C. H. Holgate, of Aberdeen, Treasurer. Supt. G. D. Hendickson, Philip and Supt. E. E. Grunwald of Sturgis are the other members of the Board of Control.

Note: Two vacancies now exist on the Board of Control. G. D. Hendrickson and Vern Hutchinson have both left their positions as superintendents of schools and therefore disqualified themselves as members.

- (2) Agreed to loan \$50,000.00 to S.D.E.A. for construction of a permanent building, the SDHSAA Offices to be housed in this new building. Before loan is to be made, terms are to be worked out.
- (3) Eliminated fee for broadcast rights to "A" and "B" tournaments.
 (4) Set dates for annual Coaching School August 20, 21, 22 & 23,
- (5) Set dates and sites for 1957 tournaments as follows: "B"— Huron, March 7, 8, 9, 1957. "A"—Aberdeen, March 14, 15, 16, 1957.

(6) Decided to eliminate coaches meeting for drawing prior to State Track Meet.

- (7) Participation placques for teams in the 1957 "A" and "B" State Basketball Tournaments to be ordered.
- (8) Authorized the use of an assistant to handle six Football Rules Meetings.
- (9) Set dates for Tennis and Golf Tournaments as follows: Sioux Falls August 3, 4, 1956.
- (10) Decided 1957 Tennis and Golf Tournaments to be at the date and site of State Track Meet.
- (11) Set dates for Cross-Country Run for 1956. Brookings, 1:00 p.m. Friday, October 19th.
- (12) Did not name the site of 1957 State Track Meet. To study costs at locations other than Mitchell and Huron. Will name site at October Board Meeting.
- (13) Studied possibilities of changing dates for the State Meet and also the possibility of separating the "A" and "B" Meets.
- (14) Raised rate of pay for "A" and "B" State Tournaments Officials from \$100.00 plus expenses to \$125.00 plus expenses.
 - (15) Adopted a budget for 1956-1957.
 - (16) Made rulings on several eligibility cases.

FILMS: "A" AND "B" STATE BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS AND "A" AND "B" STATE TRACK MEET

During the Basketball Tournaments for several years, parts of the tournament have been recorded on film. These films are all on file at the Film Library at S. D. State College, and are for the use of member schools of the SDHSAA. The first films were taken in 1953 and again in 1954. In 1955 all first round games and the Championship games in both tournaments were taken. In 1956 only the final games were filmed, but three copies of each game, that is the Howard-Cresbard game and the Sloux Falls-Rapid City game, are available. The 1956 films are in sound.

The 1955 and the 1956 State Meet finals were taken in color with sound attached and these films are also on file at S. D. State College.

The films are property of the SDHSAA, but are kept at the State College, because they are equipped to handle the films, clean and repair them and better equipped to distribute them. The films are for the use of our member schools so please do not hesitate to ask for any of these films.





TOURNAMENT RESULTS 1956

On other pages of this bulletin, you will find results of district, region, section and State Touraments including financial reports. You will notice a healthy interest in basketball in our state and we hope and believe this interest will continue, and it will if we, the school men, in the state keep it on the high level of sportsmanship that we have enjoyed. We can never let up. Keep the pressure on your teams, coaches and student bodies, see that they are constantly kept aware of the fact that interschool basketball, including tournaments, is a definite part of our secondary school program and that it must be kept that way.

Looking back over our 32 district, 8 region and 8 section tournaments and the 2 state tournaments, we believe we have never had more pleasant tournaments, sure there were heartaches, disappointments, but in reality, these are part of our training program. We are constantly faced with difficult problems, sometimes they are in our favor and sometimes they are not, but we have to take them as they come and become better because of them.

Each year, we feel that we have completed the best possible tournaments and each year the tournaments seem better. The 1956 "A" and "B" State Tournaments, were well played, the teams were soundly coached, sportsmanship was at its peak, but we are now looking forward to even better tournaments next year, thanks to you coaches and administrators for the great job you are doing.

As all the state knows, the Howard High School "Tigers" are the new State "B" Champions and reviewing the tournament there is no reason to believe that they did not earn that honor. They came into the tournament with a fine season's record and they played good basketball in the State Tournament. They had poise, determination, they knew what they could do and then went out and got the job done. While there were individual stars on the team, it was a well knit team effort that caused them to come out the Champions. Our congratulations to Coach Hon Freemole and bis "Tigers".

When there is a champion, there must also be a runner-up and the fine Cresbard team and their coach Roald Ness deserve as much credit as does Howard. They never gave up. They were terrific.

Again our congratulations to the champ and also to each of the eight teams in the tournament.

In the "A" Tournament, a fine team from Washington High School of Sioux Falls came out the winner. This marks the second consecutive "A" Championship for the Washington High School Warriors and speaks highly of the team and the masterful job of coaching done by Wally Diehl. As in the "B" Tournament, the WHS "Warriors" bleased with a number of real fine players, won because of their team play and their good "bench". Since the "Warriors" were the defending champions, each of their opponents was working harder than ever to eliminate them from the championship play. This team showed its greatness by its poise, almost perfect playing, their terrific rebounding and fine shooting. They had all that a champion needs.

While Washington High School is the champion, please remember that the final score in the championship game was 55-53 over the Rapid City "Cobblers" which indicates that everything that was said about Washington High also fits for Bill Mitchell's fine Rapid City team. After all the only difference between these teams was the fact that the "Warriors" were ahead when the game ended.

Again our congratulations to Wally Diehl and his great team.

HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 and from that time until 1912, competition was pretty much limited, on a statewide basis, to track and debate. In 1912, with permission of the SDHSAA, Huron College sponspored a state high school basketball tournament, open to all high schools in the State. This tournament was continued annually to 1917, when at the request of the College, the management was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has been under the supervision and management of the Board since that time. The number of teams in the State Tournament varied until 1924 when eight teams qualified. Since 1924 the State Tournaments have been eight team affairs, with exceptions in 1939, 1940 and 1941 when the "A" Tournaments were four team tournaments.

During the 1920's there was agitation for two classes, and in 1930 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. Under this plan the State was divided into 32 districts and the 32 district winners went to eight "A" Regions, and the eight Region winners then qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The 32 District runners-up qualified for eight "B" Regions from which the eight winners qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan did not prove popular and was abandoned after the one year trial.

Agitation continued for two classes, and in the fall of 1935 an "A" and "B" plan was developed. Under this plan High Schools with an enrollment of 300 and over were classed as "A" schools and all other schools were "B" schools. Under this set-up the top schools in the E.S.D. Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament, and the teams in the second division of this Conference played against the other "A" schools to determine the other qualifiers in the eight team State "A" Tournament, "B" teams with outstanding records were allowed to challenge into the "A" class for the right to enter the State "A" Tournament. The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in March of 1936.

With adjustments from time to time in the "A" set-up, including, taking away the right of a "B" school to challenge, and taking away the method of qualifying by being one of the top teams in the E.S.D. Conference, the present plan was adopted for the 1951-1952 season. During the transition from 1936 to 1951, the four largest schools in four geographical areas were classed as "A" schools and in each of the four sections, two teams from each section qualified for the State "A" Tournament by a double elimination method.

In 1951 the present plan was started whereby the 32 largest high schools, by enrollments, made up the "A" group and eight "A" sections were set up, and the winner of each of the eight section tournaments qualified for the State "A" Tournament. Also part of the present "A" set-up is that, while enrollements might change, the teams were determined on the two-year basis, rather than having changes annually in each class.

Since the start in 1936, there has been little change in the "B" setup, this class continuing with 32 districts and eight regions with the eight region champions qualifying for the State "B" Tournament.

"A" and "B" Tournaments in 1952, 1953, 1954, 1955 and in 1956 have proven very satisfactory and will be continued.

STATE "A" AND "B" BASKETBALL FILMS

For the last three years the SDSHAA has had movies taken of parts of the "A" and "B" State Tournaments and the Championship games in each of the 1956 Tournaments were filmed. The films are for use of our member schools and may be obtained from the Film Library at South Dakota State College in Brookings, South Dakota.

Experience has shown that the demand for the Championship games in the three previous tournaments, has been much greater than first round games or consolation games, therefore for the 1956 tournaments, only the Championship games were filmed, but 3 copies of each are now available so that more schools can see the Championship games.

Please remember these films are the property of the SDHSAA and are taken expressly for your use, and they are kept in the Film Library at SDSC, because they are equipped for taking care of the films and better equipped to handle the routing of these films, so do not hesitate to order them.




