FOREWORD

The Year Book, published annually after the close of the school year, serves as an annual report of the Executive Secretary and does provide a complete review of events in the school year of 1960-1961. Starting July 1, 1937, R. M. Walseth was appointed Executive Secretary of the Association with office space in the Department of Public Instruction, in the Statehouse in Pierre. Because of expansion in the Department of Public Instruction and lack of space the office was moved to the St. Charles Hotel in January of 1946, where it remained until November 1, 1957, when it was moved to permanent quarters in the SDEA Building at 415 E. Capitol Avenue in Pierre. The new building is pictured on Page 3 of this Year Book.

REVIEW OF S.D.H.S.A.A. EVENTS 1960-1961

Following you will find a very short review of the events and happenings of the SDHSA A for 1960-1961. All state-wide events are briefly mentioned here, and complete summaries, stories, and pictures will be found on the following pages, in the order in which the events took place.

Athletically, 1960-1961 was a good year. Our teams seem to continue to improve, and certainly, the management of local athletic programs has shown good progress. Schools have cooperated well with the Board of Control, sportsmanship at local contests and tournaments has been excellent, showing hard and diligent work on the part of school administrators, directors, and coaches. We firmly believe that we, in South Dakota, have one of the finest, sanest inter-school athletic programs in the nation.

Our interscholastic athletic program seems to get better. There are more boys participating in football, cross country brought out more competition than ever before. In addition to the annual SDHSA A Cross Country Run, there has been an increasing number of smaller Cross Country events.

Basketball, of course, continues to be the big sport. Each member school does participate, and while the number of varsity teams cannot increase, the number of boys and girls playing inter-school games of basketball seems to grow annually.

Wrestling has shown some gain. 1961 saw the fourth State Wrestling Tournament, the second of which was an Association sponsored event. With the increase in new facilities, it looks as if the event will continue to grow. The Tournament in 1962 will be subsidized further by the SDHSA A. The SDHSA A will pay the same allowances toward expenses to competitors in the State Wrestling Tournament as now is paid for contestants in Track, Tennis, Golf, and Cross Country.

Track continues to grow and improve. While the number of qualifiers to the State "A" and "B" Meets is about constant, there is much more participation in track. Decagonal, undecagonal, and duodecagonal meets have increased. More schools now send their runners to Region Meets and the large relay carnivals. While weather continues to be a strong factor toward discouraging track, our records continue to be broken. This speaks highly of the competitors and their coaches.

Golf and tennis, while not major inter-school sports, show gains especially golf.

The Annual Summer Coaching School, and the Third Annual Spring Track Clinic were continued in 1960-1961, and thank or at least of these affairs was very gratifying.

Football and Basketball State Meetings for Coaches and Officials were continued with excellent attendance at all meetings. So that the Football Meetings could be completed before the first "big" football date of the fall, Howard Conners of the University of South Dakota, handled several of the Football Meetings. Mr. Conners will again assist in 1961.

The regular Annual Meeting of the SDHSA A was held in Sioux Falls during the SDEA Convention. Several amendments were up for consideration, and Mr. R. W. Morsfere was nominated to succeed himself as a member of the Board of Control. This was possible under the Rules of the SDHSA A since Mr. Morsfere was first elected to an unexpired term.

The demand for tickets for the "A" and "B" Tournaments was the greatest ever. Orders for more than 10,000 tickets for the "B" Tournament were received, with a seating capacity of 6,200. Many people were disappointed when they received no tickets.

The two tournament double elimination plan for qualifying teams to the "A" Tournament was used for the 1961 "A" Tournament. This, apparently, was not popular, since the "A" schools decided to return to the one tournament, single elimination Section Tournament for 1962.

The State "A" and "B" Track Meet was one of the best meets ever held. On Thursday and on Friday morning and afternoon, it looked as though weather would ruin the State Meet. Preliminaries, however, were run off on Friday night, with remarkably good marks on a rather muddy track. Saturday was a beautiful day. The weather conditions were ideal, the track became fast, and the competitors responded by breaking several of the better records.

The Tennis and Golf Tournaments were held in conjunction with the Track Meet, and while weather on Friday interfered with both events, the Tournaments were completed on Saturday with amazingly good displays of both Golf and Tennis.

During 1960-1961 a major change was made in the set-up for all interschool activities. The State Association of Secondary School Principals had worked for several years to organize the various individual "activities" into one association, to be governed by one Board of Control, rather than by several different boards. In August of 1960 the plan, including a constitution, was presented to the superintendents, who, in turn, approved this constitution by an overwhelming majority in a referendum vote. Thus, starting July 1, 1961, the new Association will be the South Dakota High School Interscholastic Activities Association, with the Board of Control of the SDHSAA becoming the first Board of Control of the new "Activities Association."

EVENTS OF 1960-1961

1960 Coaching School

Huron, August 17, 18, 19, 1960

A total of 222 coaches attended the 1960 SDHSAA Annual Coaching School, and they were well rewarded for their attendance. Dave Nelson of Delaware handled football, and since Mr. Nelson is considered the originator of the interesting "Wing T" offense in football, the attending coaches learned from the master how this offense functioned. Mr. Nelson also spent a lot of time on defense. In fact, his sessions were "terrific."

John Kundla of the University of Minnesota was the main instructor in basketball. Since Mr. Kundla's experience has been so varied, having coached high school, college, professional, and university basketball, he had much to offer the coaches.

In addition to lectures and demonstrations, the second day was divided into two sessions, both morning and afternoon. While Mr. Nelson was lecturing to the group on football, Mr. Kundla had a smaller group of basketball coaches in a conference room. This procedure was repeated during both the morning and afternoon sessions. The plan seemed popular and will be repeated in 1961.

In addition to the headlines in football and basketball, Coach Warren Williamson of South Dakota State College had two sessions on wrestling. These sessions were well attended and very well handled. We certainly appreciate Mr. Williamson's work.

As has been the custom for several years, the two coaches of the "A" and "B" State Championship teams for 1960 were also on the program. Aljo Storz of Hardisty and Bill Mitchell of Rapid City did terrific jobs.

All sessions were held in the Huron Arena, and we appreciate the efforts of Mr. Mikolajec, Supt. of Schools; Mr. Walsh, Arena Manager, and Mr. Cotton, Athletic Director at Huron High School, in making the school a success.

AUGUST ADMINISTRATORS MEETING

Perhaps the following story is misplaced in the chronological order of events. However, the Annual Administrators Meeting followed the Coaching School, and was before the opening Football Rules Meeting. It was at this meeting when the new Activities Association was discussed, and then voted upon by mail following the meeting. The schools voting gave the new South Dakota High School Interscholastic Activities Association an overwhelming majority vote, and therefore, on July 1, 1961, it will become operational. More details on the new association will be given in later and more appropriate sections of this Year Book.

1960 FOOTBALL RULES MEETINGS

Each year, since 1938, with the exception of three World War II years, the S.D.H.S.A.A. has sponsored a series of Football Rules Meetings, based upon rules and officiating for coaches, officials, players and fans. In 1960, Meetings were held in Aberdeen, Brookings, Custer, Eagle Butte, Huron, Lake Andes, Lemmon, Mitchell, Mobridge, Philip, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sisseton, Vermillion, Watertown, and Waukegan. A thousand or more attended these meetings.

In South Dakota, because of uncertain weather, the football season starts early and ends early. In setting up our Football Rules Meetings, we try to have the meetings completed before the first "big" football date of the season. To accomplish this, it has been necessary to go to two important men—your Executive Secretary and Howard Connors of Vermillion. We are fortunate in having Mr. Connors available, since he is an active official and has taught University classes on Rules and Officiating. We believe the coaches and officials need their rules discussions before their first game of the season.

1960 CROSS COUNTRY RUN

On a mild and hot sunny day, 168 runners from 24 schools took off in the Fifteenth Annual S.D.H.S.A.A. Cross Country Run. As in each of the previous years, the event was on the South Dakota State College golf course at Brookings. The number of runners exceeded the 1959 number by twenty. However, only one more school was represented.

Walter Thirionsson of Clear Lake was the individual winner, running the course in record time of 11:27.1. He was followed closely near the finish line by Norman White Flint of the South Dakota School for the Deaf, Jerry Faldut of Watertown was third.

The Handrean Indian School team was first with 20 points, Milbank was second with 23 points, and Clear Lake finished third in team totals with 44 points.

The Handrean team was made up of Virgil Monvaine (capt), Gerald Small and Ivan Mckenzie.

Glen Robinson, Coach and Cross Country Coach at State College, ably managed the meet.

A complete summary of the Cross Country Run along with photos, will be found on other pages of this Year Book.

1960 BASKETBALL RULES MEETINGS

Starting on October 17 and ending December 1, your Executive Secretary conducted 25 Basketball Rules Meetings in the following towns in the various sections of the State: Aberdeen, Chamberlain, Eagle Butte, Gettysburg, Hot Springs, Huron, Rapid, Lake Andes,

Lemmon, Madison, Mitchell, Mobridge, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sisseton, Sturgis, Watertown, White River, Winner and Yankton. The meeting scheduled at Watertown was cancelled because of snow and ice. About 1,200 coaches, officials, players, and fans attended the meetings.

At each meeting, rule changes were discussed and explained. Old rules were reviewed and the methods and mechanics of officiating were discussed. We believe we are gradually getting a better understanding of the rules and officiating is becoming more uniform.

BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING, November 1, 1960

Since the November 1, 1960 meeting was the first after July 1, the officers of the Board were named as follows: Chairman, D. W. Evans, Kadoka; Vice Chairman, R. W. Monfore, Tripp; and Treasurer, C. H. Holgate, Aberdeen. Routine business was taken care of at the meeting. A complete list of Board actions at all meetings will be found on other pages of this Year Book.

REGULAR ANNUAL MEETING, SDHSAA

November 3, 1960—Sioux Falls, South Dakota

A large number of amendments to discuss, and the formation of the new South Dakota High School Interscholastic Activities Association brought out a record attendance for the Annual Meeting.

All amendments, save one, were defeated by the membership of the Association in the referendum mail vote following the Annual Meeting. **Unsuccessful** amendments were: (1) Admission of the State Training School; (2) To make registration of football and basketball officials mandatory; (3) To change the transfer rule; (4) To have eligibility unaffected by a transfer from a non-member school to a member school or vice-versa; (5) and (6) About changing the opening of pre-season football practice; (7) About granting permission for girls' basketball tournaments; (8) About changing "A" and "B" Basketball and Track set-ups to three classes; (9) About changing enrollment for "A" and "B" classes in Track; (10) Changing "A" and "B" classes in Track to "A", "B" and "C" classes; and (11) About dividing basketball into three classes.

Each of the above-mentioned eleven (11) amendments failed. The one Amendment which did pass, was about the formation of the South Dakota High School Interscholastic Activities Association. This was merely an amendment to get the new Activities Association Constitution, already approved, into the Rules and Regulations of the SDHSAA, thus having a more complete Constitution and By-Laws for the new Association. The Amendment in no way changed the action previously approved by the Administrators, following their August meeting.

At the Regular Annual Meeting, Supt. R. W. Monfore of Tripp was the only nominee for the position on the Board of Control. Since Mr. Monfore was elected previously to an unexpired term, he was eligible for reelection.

NATIONAL ALLIANCE FOOTBALL RULES MEETING

Four years ago the name of the National Federation Football Rules was changed to the National Alliance Football Rules. This means that there has been a union of three groups—the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations; the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA); and the National Association of Junior

Colleges. Each group has representatives on the Football Rules Committee. There is no danger of loss of control by the high schools, since all states represent the High School Group.

The 1961 Football Committee met in Chicago early in January. Few changes were made in the Rules. All rule changes have been sent to member schools and all will be discussed at the '61 Football Rules Meetings.

BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING, January 12, 1961

The reason for the Board of Control Meeting was the South Dakota High School Interscholastic Activities Association. No definite plans for the operation of the new Association had ever been presented to the Board of Control, so preliminary work had to be done and plans tentatively formulated.

It was decided that no officers or officers of these Associations affected by the merger, would be interviewed, and after these interviews more definite action could be taken.

1961 STATE WRESTLING TOURNAMENT

The Second Annual SDHSAA Wrestling Tournament was held in Spearfish on February 24 and 25, 1961. This was actually the fourth State Tournament, however, the second official tourney. The SDHSAA was not financially involved except for the purchase of medals for the winner and runner-up in each of the 12 weight classes, and a team championship trophy. After expenses for rental, officials, etc. was deducted from the gate receipts, the balance was prorated back to the competing schools.

A complete summary will be found on other pages of this Year Book. We are sorry we do not have pictures of the winners. Spearfish won the Tournament with 27 points, with Rapid City the runner-up with 23 points.

BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING, March 15, 1961

A regular meeting of the Board of Control was held in Huron on March 15, 1961, just prior to the "A" State Basketball Tournament.

Routine matters were handled and the sites for the 1962 State Tournaments were determined. The "B" Tournament will be at the new Park House in Sioux Falls on March 8, 9, 10, 1962 and the "A" Tournament will be at Huron on March 15, 16, 17, 1962. The Coliseum Committee from Sioux Falls met with the Board and agreed to take the "B" Tournament under the same terms as used in Huron; that is, 10% of the gate receipts, plus a 5% Admits Tax. It was also understood that Washington High School personnel would manage the Tournament.

1961 STATE BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

Complete summaries of the various basketball tournaments will be found on other pages of this Year Book, therefore, there will be just a brief mention here. Edgewood and Aberdeen were the 1961 "B" and "A" State Champions.

Both Tournaments were excellent affairs. Attendance was better than ever. Offsetting was good and the Tournament management by the Huron staff was the best ever.

"A" Basketball Plan for 1961

For the "A" Tournament in 1961, the method of qualifying teams was different than in the past. There were two double elimination tournaments for "A" schools. After the one year trial, the "A" schools voted to return to the one tournament single elimination method of qualifying teams for the State "A" Tournament.

1961 TRACK CLINIC

The Third Annual Track Clinic was again held in Mitchell on Saturday, March 25, and over 100 coaches took the opportunity to attend.

We were fortunate in being able to secure one of the "Deans" of track coaching, George L. Rider of Miami University, Oxford, Ohio. Mr. Rider covered a lot of events and was so popular that he was almost forced to run nearly two hours overtime.

The location, date, and talent for the 1962 Clinic have not been decided.

NEW BASKETBALL FILM

Your Executive Secretary was appointed as a "Technical Advisor" for the making of the new Official Sports Film Service basketball film "Official Basketball." The film was made in the high school gym at Ames, Iowa during the first week in April. We believe the film will be a good one and will be shown at all Basketball Rules Meetings.

1961 STATE TRACK MEETS

Despite unfavorable weather for preliminaries, the 1961 State "A" and "B" Track Meets were among the best meets ever held. Rain made the track rather soft for the Friday night preliminaries, but the weatherman cooperated on Saturday and gave us a beautiful day. Contestants responded to the favorable weather and several all-time records were broken, and most were not merely broken, but smashed. New "All-Time" records were set in the Mile Run, the Shot Put, and in the Medley and Mile Relays. South Dakota kids are great competitors.

Washington High School of Sioux Falls was the winner of the "A" Meet, with Rapid City in second place. In the "B" Meet, Onida was the champion, with Selby and Woonsocket tied for second. The Meets were ably managed by Mylo Jackson and his crew from Central High School in Aberdeen.

A complete summary of the "A" and "B" Meets, along with pictures of all winners will be found on other pages of this Year Book.

1961 GOLF TOURNAMENT

Weather played a part in the opening rounds of the 1961 SDHSAA Golf Tournament. However, 75 golfers from 28 schools did participate and shot excellent golf.

Terry Comstock of Washington High School, Sioux Falls, and Dave Hanten of Huron, tied for individual honors, both shooting good 148's. They were closely followed by the 1960 Champion, Alan Cooke of Sioux Falls, Keel Coddington, also of Sioux Falls, and James Olson of Aberdeen.

In team scoring, the Sioux Falls combination of Comstock and Cooke were the champions with 303; Huron's Hanten and Milford were close seconds with 309.

Dean Shortridge, pro at the Aberdeen Country Club did a marvelous job keeping the Tournament going.

1961 TENNIS TOURNAMENT

While the number of tennis players continues to be small, a very successful tournament was played. Jeff Clark of Sioux Falls won the singles tournament, defeating his fellow townmate, Tom Weber in the finals 6-1 and 6-0.

In the doubles competition, Clark and Weber of Sioux Falls defeated the Aberdeen team of Jerry Loeber and Bob Thompson in the finals.

Lyck "Bud" Belk managed this Tournament and handled it well. A complete summary will be found on other pages of this Year Book.

BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING, June 2 & 3, 1961

The final Board of Control Meeting of the 1960-1961 school year was held in Sioux Falls on June 2 and 3. Considerable time was spent on plans for 1961-1962. A budget for the coming year was adopted and other actions will show in the Summary of Board Meetings which follows.

NATIONAL FEDERATION CONVENTION

The National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations Annual Convention was held at French Lick, Indiana, on July 2 to July 5 inclusive.

Board of Control members D. W. Evans, Knudsen, R. W. Monroe, Tripp, and Executive Secretary R. M. Walzeta of Terre attended this National Convention. Representatives from over 40 states and Canadian provinces attended and participated in the Convention. Your Executive Secretary was on the same program.

BOARD OF CONTROL ACTIONS

1960-1961

During the school year of 1960-1961, the Board of Control had three regular meetings and one special meeting. The first meeting was in Sioux Falls on November 1, 1960 during the SDEA Convention. The second meeting, the extra meeting, was in Pierre on January 12, 1961. The third meeting was in Huron on March 15, 1961 and the last meeting was in Sioux Falls on June 2 and 3, 1961.

Officers of the Board of Control for 1960-1961 were elected by the Board as follows: Supt. D. W. Evans, Knudsen, Chairman; Supt. R. W. Monroe, Tripp, Vice Chairman; and Supt. J. H. Hoggala, Vanden, Treasurer.

Authorized the use of Forward Councils of Verification to conduct several Football Rules Meetings in late August and early September.

Discussed and ruled on several eligibility cases.

Appointed a Wrestling Committee made up of Bert Dent, Mobridge, Board Member, Chairman; Ken Greeno, Redfield; Tom Long of Rapid City; and Executive Secretary, R. M. Walseth, Pierre. An increase of two additional members was later authorized. The new members are Dr. H. B. Goodell, South Dakota School of Mines and Technology, and Coach Warren Williamson of South Dakota State College. This Committee was charged with the responsibility of working out details on weight control and other matters related to wrestling. This Committee did set up regulations which will be published and sent to all schools in August.

Further on wrestling, since there has been definite growth in the sport, the SDHSIAA will guarantee partial expenses of competitors and coaches to the 1962 Wrestling Tournament in Huron. These partial expenses shall be the same as the allowance made for the State Track Meet, the State Golf and Tennis Tournaments, and the State Cross Country Run.

Activities Association: Decided that for 1961-1962, the Activities Associations now operating will continue to function as they have in the past, except that dues will be collected by the SDHSIAA and bills for events at the state level would be paid from the SDHSIAA Office.

Decided not to hire an assistant Executive Secretary during 1961-1962, and authorized hiring of extra clerical help in the office.

Basketball: Awarded the 1962 "B" Tournament to Sioux Falls, terms same as Huron, 10% of gate receipts plus 5% Field House Tax, and that Washington High School staff be the host school and managers of the Tournament.

Awarded the "A" Tournament for 1962 to Huron. Terms the same as in 1961, that is, 10% of gate receipts plus 5% Arena Tax, and the management of the Tournament to be by the Huron High School staff.

Discussed ticket distribution for the tournaments for 1962, but made no definite decision.

Made some realignment on distribution of schools of "A" classification, and also made some changes in "B" districts.

Track: Assigned the 1962 State Track Meets to Watertown. Preliminaries will be held in the evening of May 18, 1962.

Decided to continue the no substitution rule for relay teams.

Authorized a study of complete rearrangement of "A" and "B" regions for Track.

Set the starting heights for the "A" and "B" pole vault and high jump.

Golf and Tennis: Awarded the 1962 Tournaments to Watertown and continued study for methods of elimination for golfers.

Miscellaneous: Authorized Board of Control Members and the Executive Secretary to attend the National Federation Meeting in French Lick, Indiana July 2-5, 1961.

Authorized Executive Secretary's out-of-state travel to Basketball Interpretation Meeting in Chicago October 9, and to St. Louis for National Alliance Football Rules Meeting in January of 1962.

Discussed advisability of incorporation for the SDHSIAA.

Adopted a budget for 1961-1962.

HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 and from that time until 1912, competition was pretty much limited, on a statewide basis, to track and debate. In 1912, with permission of the SDHSAA, Huron College sponsored a state high school basketball tournament, open to all high schools in the State. This tournament was continued annually to 1917, when, at the request of the College, the management was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has been under the supervision and management of the Board since that time. The number of teams in the State Tournament varied until 1924 when eight teams qualified. Since 1924 the State Tournaments have been eight team affairs, with exceptions in 1939, 1940 and 1941 when the "A" Tournaments were four team tournaments.

During the 1920's there was agitation for two classes, and in 1930 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. Under this plan the State was divided into 32 districts and the 32 district winners went to eight "A" Regions, and the eight Region winners then qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The 32 District runners-up qualified for eight "B" Regions, from which the eight winners qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan did not prove popular and was abandoned after the one year trial.

Agitation continued for two classes, and in the fall of 1935 an "A" and "B" plan was developed. Under this plan High Schools with an enrollment of 300 and over were classed as "A" schools and all other schools were "B" schools. Under this set-up the top schools in the E.S.D. Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament, and the teams in the second division of this Conference played against the other "A" schools to determine the other qualifiers in the eight team State "A" Tournament. "B" teams with outstanding records were allowed to challenge into the "A" class for the right to enter the State "A" Tournament. The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in March of 1936.

With adjustments from time to time in the "A" set-up, including, taking away the right of a "B" school to challenge, and taking away the method of qualifying by being one of the top teams in the E.S.D. Conference, the present plan was adopted for the 1951-1952 season. During the transition from 1936 to 1951, the four largest schools in four geographical areas were classed as "A" schools and in each of the four sections, two teams from each section qualified for the State "A" Tournament by a double elimination method.

In 1951 the present plan was started whereby the 32 largest high schools, by enrollments, made up the "A" group and eight "A" sections were set up, and the winner of each of the eight section tournaments qualified for the State "A" Tournament. Also part of the present "A" set-up is that, while enrollments might change, the teams were determined on the two-year basis, rather than having changes annually in each class.

For the 1961 "A" Tournaments a change was made in the method of qualifying teams to the State "A" Tournament. This change, briefly was as follows: The make up of schools in the "A" Sections was left as it had been in recent years, however a double elimination Section Tournament was played with two teams from each section qualifying for the new "Sub-State" tournaments. Sections 1 and 2 formed Sub-State #1; Sections 3 and 4 formed Sub-State #2; Sections 5 and 6 formed Sub-State #3; and Sections 7 and 8 formed Sub-State #4. This placed four teams in each of the four Sub-State Tournaments and again double elimination tournaments were played with two teams from each Sub-State tournament qualifying for the State "A" Tournament.

Since the start in 1936, there has been little change in the "B" set-up, this class continuing with 32 districts and eight regions with the eight region champions qualifying for the State "B" Tournament.

"A" and "B" Tournaments in 1952, 1953, 1954, 1955, 1956, 1957, 1958, 1959, 1960, and in 1961 have proven very satisfactory and will continue.

THE 1961 TOURNAMENTS

Two crowd pleasing tournaments, in which good teams, excellent games and great individual performances featured, have been conducted and are now history. Bridgewater won the "B" Tournament and Aberdeen became the new "A" Champion. Bridgewater, while not new to "B" in recent play, had never won the Championship and Aberdeen came through with their Championship, the first since 1953. The 1961 Champions add their to the long line of previous Champions.

The Bridgewater team was a very outstanding team featuring a tough defense along with a good offense. The team made few mistakes and had the ability to capitalize on errors by their opponents. The "Wild Cats" were a well coached team, thoroughly versed in sound fundamentals and displayed courage and discipline in methodically going along doing their work. Our congratulations to the Bridgewater team and their coach. They are a worthy addition to the long line of the "B" Champions.

The Aberdeen "Golden Eagles" came to the tournament intending to play, which they certainly did. They had to go the hard way, eliminating the rest of the way. While their season's record was rather ordinary, there was nothing ordinary about the way they swept through the "A" tournament.

Again, a good defense proved important to a good basketball team and the Aberdeen defense set up many offensive maneuvers which turned into points. The team played the way their coach trained them. They kept their poise and are fine Champions.

Too much credit cannot be given the coaches of these fine Championship teams Merle Gramm of Bridgewater and Lyle Bell of Aberdeen. Both men ran their teams "wacky" for the tournaments. They were soundly coached teams, always alive and alert, both offensively and defensively, both rebounded well, and handled the ball in a manner seldom seen in high school basketball. Both of these fine coaches are a credit to their profession, they are real teachers, they both had control of their teams and handled their players like adults.

We feel highly honored to even know Merle Gramm and Lyle "Bud" Bell.

Again our congratulations to Bridgewater and Aberdeen. They deserved the Championships and all honors that go with winning. We know that their coaches will keep their feet on the ground and the game of basketball will be benefited by these two fine young men!

Before forgetting the tournaments, we must remember that there were seven other teams in each tournament and hope teams on given nights could have beaten the Champs. In both tournaments the teams were evenly matched. In the "B" we had boys from Indian High Schools participated and were crowd pleasers as well as good teams.

Whether or not because of the new method of qualification for this "A" tournament, the teams in this event have not been as evenly matched for years. Several of the teams in the tournament would have been fine Champions and easily could have been the Champs.

On other pages of this "Tournament Bulletin" you will find complete results of District, Region, Section, Sub-State and State Tournaments, including financial reports. These reports show that basketball is our most popular sport and we believe that this interest will continue if we, the school men, in charge of high school athletics continue our never ending fight to keep the game on the high plane of sportsmanship it now enjoys and to keep control of high school athletics in our schools.

While our tournaments have been pleasant and very popular, we must continue to keep constant pressure on our fans, student teams

and coaches so that they don't lose sight of the fact that basketball is but a part of our secondary school program and that it must be kept that way.

We know that, in some places, during the season there have been unpleasant experiences but we must strive to keep them to a minimum and we can't let up. Experiences in some of our neighboring states have shown that we can't become complacent. Also experiences in some of our College and Universities have shown that the high school groups are doing the best job, however we cannot be satisfied, we must do a better job in educating. We, it is very apparent, must be leaders and establish a pattern of sportsmanship for those who are "supposedly" more advanced. Constant education of the public must be continued.

Tournament management at all levels has continued to improve, which naturally means better tournaments. The management of our two state tournaments, both in Huron this year, was wonderful and we of the SDHSAA sincerely thank the local management in Huron. They have performed beautifully and are to be highly complimented.
