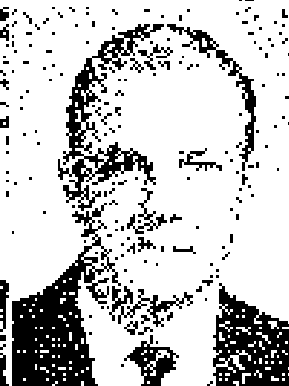

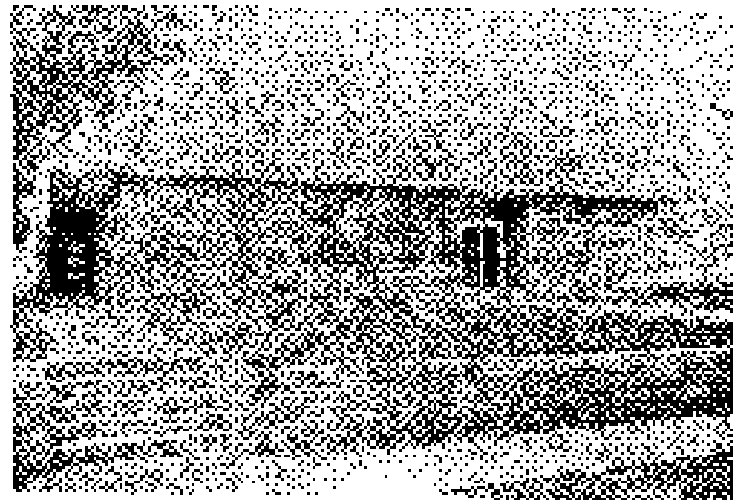

FOREWORD

The Year Book, published annually since the start of the school year, serves as an annual report of the Executive Secretary and does provide a non-biased review of events in the school year of 1936-1937. Starting July 1, 1927, R. W. Worrens was appointed Executive Secretary of the Association with office space in the Department of Public Instruction in the State House. Gene E. Highway of Agona was appointed Chairman of Public Instruction, and a consequent change of space became necessary. In 1928 the BSEBA's office space was rented in the St. Charles Hotel and was later moved in January of 1930, where it remained until November 1937. Then it was moved to permanent quarters in the SBEA Building at 111 S. Capitol Avenue in Peoria.

With the Association changing from an "Agricultural Association" to an "Educational Association" it was necessary to get additional help. Mr. R. W. Kears was named Assistant Executive Secretary July 1, 1932, and additional office space was secured in the SBEA Building.

REVIEW OF SDHSAA EVENTS FOR 1966-1967

This volume of the "YEAR BOOK" will contain complete summaries of the events and business of the SDHSAA for the school year of 1966-1967. On the next few pages you will find brief summaries of these events with the summaries and pictures in the proper order further back in the book.

1966-1967 was the sixth year that the Association has been operated as an Activities Association and therefore the events mentioned and summarized are for 1966. The Athletic and Non-Athletic events. The Athletic summaries and pictures are in the first section of this volume with summaries and pictures of Non-Athletic events in the second section of the Book.

We can look back on the year of 1966-1967 with a certain amount of pride as we believe the year was a good one for the Association. There seems to be complete harmony existing in the several organizations and a part of this "Activities Association" athletic program continues to be strong and growth in the so-called "other sports" has been apparent. Local management and control of individual school programs are good sound and solid. There also seems to be steady and healthy growth in the Non-athletic portion of the program. More and more work in the management and control of these activities has been devolved to the Association office.

Even with local control and direction the programs, both Athletic and Non-Athletic, could not be effectively administered without the use of committees charged with the responsibility of managing and processing the numerous tournaments, meets and contests leading up to the state events. The Board of Control, the Executive Secretary, and the Assistant Executive Secretary wish to thank the many people serving so efficiently on these committees. You have done a great job and again thank you.

The inter-school athletic program seems to improve with age. Football continues to gain in the number of schools participating and in the number of participants. Each year it seems that the number of eleven-man teams increases, by six-man teams changing to eleven-man football, and more eight-man teams appearing to take up the slack.

Cross-country continues to gain in popularity, in fact, after several seasons of two classes, the number competing in each class has grown so large that either region eliminations were necessary or another class added, so for 1967 we will try three classes.

Wrestling continues to have normal growth. During 1966-67 the number of schools in each of the regions has grown so rapidly that for 1967-68 it will be necessary to divide each of the four regions into two districts. Four from each district will qualify for regional eliminations and then four from each region will qualify for the State Tournament.

Each Association school, even for the School of the Blind and the South Dakota Training School do compete in the "B" district or "A" section basketball competition, so the growth in the number of teams is suggested by the number of member schools. However, there is an increase in the number of boys playing in interschool competition because of an increased number of lower classification teams in member schools.

Track continues to make amazing gains. This year more schools than ever before entered region competition and we had the greatest number of boys in the "A" and "B" State Meets than ever before had participated in these two events. And, further, records continue to be shattered.

Golf continues to gain. Region competition has grown and forty-nine boys did qualify for and compete in the State Golf Tournament. Only Tennis does not seem to have any appreciable gain. About the same number of schools participate annually in the State Tennis Tournament.

The transition of the Athletic Association to an Activities Association has apparently been good for the Non-Athletic events, since they all seem to show gains in the quantity as well as quality of participation. The Press Association Convention in Brookings was very well attended and outstanding work was exhibited, and no doubt those attending were well informed with ideas about how to better prepare their papers, year books, etc.

The All-State Chorus and Orchestra, because of limitations, could not get larger, but it did get better. This event is managed by the Music Educators Association, who work closely with the SDHSAA. The event was outstanding.

More students than ever before participated in the three Student Council workshops held in Huron, Sioux Falls and Rapid City. All three were very well attended. Robert Lutz of Charles City, Iowa and Dr. George Matthes of Denver were the consultants at the workshops. Response to the meetings was enthusiastic.

Speech work on an interschool level in the form of Declamatory work in the fall, One-Act Plays in the winter, and Debate in the winter and early spring was an outstanding success. More schools continue to be added to those with previous speech programs.

Region Athletic Conventions continue to draw large crowds, and when there is no state competition the quality of the tournaments seems to get better, if possible.

The All-State Sport, like the All-State Chorus, is not completely an Association affair, but the Band Masters Association works closely with our Association. This sport, organized by the SDHSAA is a great event.

1966-1967 SDHSAA EVENTS

ATHLETIC

1966 COACHING SCHOOL

Huron, August 15, 16, 17, 1966

Attendance-wise the 1966 Annual Coaching School was a tremendous success, as about 700 did attend the event. Not only was the attendance the greatest, but the talent was some of the best ever to appear at the school. Jack Moulthrop of Purdue handled the Football, Ralph Miller of Iowa was the instructor in Basketball, and Frank Powell of Adams State of Colorado handled the Wrestling end of the school.

In addition, for the second year the South Dakota Medical Association provided the coaches with a session on "Medical Aspects in Sports". Their featured speaker was Dr. Lincoln, an orthopedic surgeon who is also team physician for the professional Minnesota Vikings Football club. The entire school was an outstanding success.

All sessions were held in the "History House Motel Inn" and the use of their air conditioned meeting rooms was greatly appreciated.

NEW MEMBER SCHOOLS

As a result of the decision of the South Dakota Supreme Court, the following private and/or parochial schools became new members of the South Dakota High School Athletic Association with the opening of the 1934-1935 school year. They are alphabetically as follows: Abundant, Rapid City; Del Rapids, St. Mary's Freeborn Academy, Furon, James Valley Christian; Maple, St. Paul; Miller, Sunshine; Ridge Academy; Mitchell, Notre Dame; New Holland, Dakota Christian; Pine Ridge, Holy Rosary; Frankfort, Lincoln; Rapid City, Cathedral; Rapid City, St. Martin's; St. Francis, Salem; St. Mary's, Sioux Falls; O'Gorman, Stephen, Immaculate Conception; and, Tunkton, Mt. Sion.

St. Martin's of Rapid City and Mt. Mary of Tunkton are girls schools, but did compete in all or most of the Non-Athletic events of the Association. All other of the above-named schools did participate in the many events of the Association, both Athletic and Non-Athletic.

The schools have been fine additions to the membership of the Association.

1935 FOOTBALL RULES MEETINGS

With the exception of the World War I years, Football Rules Meetings for coaches and officials have been held continuously since 1908. The 1935 meetings were held in Aberdeen, Brookings, Chatter, Huron, Lake Andes, Lemmon, Mitchell, Moorhead, Philip, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sully, Vermillion, Watertown and Yankton.

Mr. Walseth conducted eight of the meetings and Mr. Evans had seven. Attendance was good. A total of 1026 attended the meetings. These meetings will be continued in 1936.

BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING

Sioux Falls—October 5, 1935

The first regular meeting of the S.D.H.S.A.A. Board of Control was held in Sioux Falls on October 5, 1935, the day before the regular Annual Meeting of the S.D.H.S.A.A. Reports were made by Mr. Walseth and Mr. Evans, routine business was carried on, and plans and duties of the Board members at the Annual Meeting of the Association were discussed and assignments made. A complete summary of actions of the Board will be found on other pages of this YEAR BOOK.

THE ANNUAL S.D.H.S.A.A. MEETING

Sioux Falls—Washington High School Auditorium

Thursday, October 6, 1935

Seventy-four (74) member schools of the S.D.H.S.A.A. were officially represented at the Annual Meeting of the Association. Reports on the previous year and a financial report were made by Executive Secretary H. M. Walseth, Assistant Executive Secretary D. W. Evans reported on progress of the Non-Athletic events of the Association.

Several amendments were considered at the meeting, and Supt. L. E. Thomas of Lake Andes and Supt. Donald Lockwood of Plankinton

were nominated for membership on the Board of Control in various U. S. Part of storage whose term expired the year to start July 1, 1967 and end July 30, 1972. Mr. Thomas was elected by unanimous ballot.

Amendments considered at the meeting are roughly as follows: (1) Change to schedule all games off, provide six days or more. To not a student to drop out of school while a semester. This amendment passed. (2) Amend provision football practice without pads. This amendment failed. (3) To change "A" basketball schedule. This amendment failed.

A resolution was passed asking the Board to appoint a committee to study distribution of Board of Control districts by school sizes, and asked that the committee submit an amendment on the above. The committee was appointed, did meet, and has submitted such an amendment, which will be presented to the members schools in the fall of 1967.

CROSS COUNTRY RUN

For 12th year the Cross Country event has been run with "A" and "B" classes on the Trinity-Her Annual Cross-Country Run was conducted the same way. There were 180 runners from 35 schools in the "A" event and 160 runners from 29 schools in the "B" event, making a total of 340 runners from 64 schools. This is quite a sizeable gain over the 1966 event when a total of 211 from 51 schools took part. Joe Plymhouse of Detroit was the "A" man and Myron Young King of The Ridge Ocala was the "B" man.

Stephen Adams was team honors in the "A" and McLush was the top team in the "B". An interesting and unusual sight in the 1967 Cross Country Run is that Andy Zacher of the Elmwood Middle was the Coach of the team runners in the "A" meet and the brother Dick was the Coach of Detroit, the team winner in the "B" event.

These meetings were held as follows: August 11 in Huron, October 2 in Sioux Falls, February 25 in Huron, March 11, 15, and 18 in Sioux Falls, with the final meetings on June 8 and 9 in Sioux Falls.

Officers for 1967-1968 were L. N. Pier, Moderator, Chairman; H. H. Aschbaugh, Vermillion, Vice Chairman; and R. M. Walseth, Treasurer, as provided for in the SASSA Constitution and By-Laws. State Chairman Peter's term was expiring on July 1, 1967, officers for 1967-1968 were elected as follows: H. H. Aschbaugh, Vermillion, Chairman; A. H. Morrison, Belle Fourche, Vice Chairman; and R. M. Walseth, continuing as Treasurer.

(8) Rescinded previous action on scheduling State Wrestling Tournament dates. Dates for 1968 to correspond with 1967. (9) Granted KSOO-TV and KRFL-TV request to televise Friday and Saturday night games of the "A" Championships. (10) Authorized Evans and Walseth to attend National Federation Convention if they wished. (11) Authorized Wrestling Committee to set up eight districts in four regions in Wrestling. (12) Considered Frank Committee request. Keep standards as of 1966 the same except reduced standards in D'arus Throw five feet in each class. (13) Reassigned "A" Track schools. (14) Added two-mile run to list of events in Region and State Meets. (15) Denied committee's request for substitutions on relay teams. (16) Asked Track Committee to study possible elimination of Relay Relay and replace with Two-halt Relay. (17) Discussed proposal of Track Committee. (18) Decided to have two races in Cross Country. (19) Appointed a nominator as recommended at Annual Meeting to assign school representation on the Board of Control. (20) Decided L. T. Thomas, who was elected to succeed Mr. Pier on the

1967 TOURNAMENTS

After winning the 1967 "A" and "B" Tournaments, it is hard to believe that we have had better tournaments or will have better tournaments. After the conclusion of these events there were two (two) champions crowned. Tripp won the "B" going away, and Milbank won the "A" Championship. Both of these schools are champions for the first time.

Our congratulations are extended to Tripp and Milbank. They deserved to win. The going in each tournament was not easy, especially in the "A". Tripp had trouble only in the first round, and then let serious trouble, finally beating Bayshore 75-67. On the other hand, Milbank had close games all through the tournament, finally coming from behind to beat Rapid City in the finals 80-43.

Both of the champions were ready to play and were excellent teams. Coach Stevens of Tripp and Coach Wolsky of Milbank had their teams prepared. They knew what they were doing, both offensively and defensively, and their preparations, along with the power of these teams, brought away championships.

On other pages of this YEAR BOOK you will find scores of all games in the two tournaments and the pictures and season's records of the sixteen teams that played in the 1967 "A" and "B" Tournaments.

HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 and from that time until 1912 competition was pretty much limited on a statewide basis to track and debate. In 1912, with permission of the SDHSAA, Huron College sponsored a state high school basketball tournament open to all high schools in the State. This tournament was continued annually in 1913, when, at the request of the College, the management was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has been under the supervision and management of the Board since that time. The number of teams in the State Tournament varied until 1924 when eight teams qualified. Since 1924 the State Tournaments have been eight team affairs, with exceptions in 1929, 1940 and 1941 when the "A" Tournaments were four team tournaments.

During the 1930's there was agitation for two classes and in 1930 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. Under this plan the State was divided into 32 districts and the 32 district winners went to eight "A" Regions, and the eight Region winners then qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The 32 District runners-up qualified for eight "B" Regions, from which the eight winners qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan did not prove popular and was abandoned after the one year trial.

Amateurism continued for two classes, and in the fall of 1935 an "A" and "B" plan was developed. Under this plan High Schools with an enrollment of 500 and over were classed as "A" schools and all other schools were "B" schools. Under this set-up the top schools in the S.S.D. Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament, and the teams in the second division of this Conference played against the other "A" schools to determine the other qualifiers in the eight team State "A" Tournament. "B" teams with outstanding records were allowed to challenge into the "A" class for the right to enter the State "A" Tournament. The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in March of 1936.

With adjustments from time to time in the "A" set-up, including taking away the right of a "B" school to challenge, and taking away the method of qualifying by being one of the top teams in the S.S.D. Conference, the present plan was adopted for the 1951-1952 season. During the transition from 1936 to 1951, the four largest schools in four geographical areas were classed as "A" schools and in each of the four sections, two teams from each section qualified for the State "A" Tournament by a double elimination method.

In 1951 the present plan was started whereby the 32 largest high schools, by enrollments made up the "A" group and eight "A" sections were set up, and the winner of each of the eight section tournaments qualified for the State "A" Tournament. Also part of the present "A" set-up in 1951, while enrollments might change, the teams were determined on the two-year basis, rather than making changes annually in each class.

For the 1961 "A" Tournaments a change was made in the method of qualifying teams to the State "A" Tournament. This change, briefly was as follows: The make up of schools in the "A" Section was left as it had been in recent years, however a double elimination Sectional Tournament was played with two teams from each section qualifying for the new "Sub-State" tournaments. Sections 1 and 2 formed Sub-State #1, Sections 3 and 4 formed Sub-State #2, Sections 5 and 6 formed Sub-State #3, and Sections 7 and 8 formed Sub-State #4. This planed four teams in each of the four Sub-State Tournaments and again double elimination tournaments were played with two teams from each Sub-State tournament qualifying for the State "A" Tournament.

The 1961 plan for "A" tournaments was discarded in 1962 and qualification for places in the State "A" Tournament was done by single elimination tournaments in each of eight "A" Sections. The winner of each "A" Section qualified for the State "A" Tournament. This method was continued for the 1963 and 1964 Tournaments.

Since the start of the "A" and "B" classification in 1936 there has been little change in the "B" setup. We have continued to have 32 "B" Districts and 8 "B" Regions with the eight "D" Region winners qualifying for the State "B" Tournament. Of course there has had to be changes in districts and regions but the basic plan has been kept over the years.

Cheryl Hess, a junior at Clark High School, was South Dakota's representative to the Student Burgessess at Williamsburg, Virginia, in February. No representatives were sent to the National Student Council Conference in Pennsylvania.

1966 Press Convention

Dr. George Phillips and his staff in the School of Education and Journalism at South Dakota State University did their usual fine job of hosting the annual high school press convention on October 7. Highlight of the convention was the announcement of the results of the annual competition in school newspapers and yearbooks.

Little Missouri High School emerged the winner in the newspapers competition. It tied all-State on both its newspaper and its yearbook and headed the list of six schools with double all-State honors by having the highest point total.

Runners-up in the competition were Weston Consolidated, St. Ambrose, Spearburg, Highmore, Lead, and Sioux Falls Washington. A complete list of the award winners in the contest will be found later where in THE YEARBOOK.

Region Music Contests

Each school music contests in South Dakota are held only on a regional level with no advancement to a state contest. Contests were held in all eight regions during 1966-67. In six of the regions solo and ensemble contests were completed in February and were followed by large group contests in April. Region IV held all its contests during a two-day event in April. Region V's solo and ensemble contests in early April and its large group contests in May. Regions II and 7 have separate vocal and instrumental contests in February.

Watertown and Doland Debaters Win State Titles

Debaters from Watertown and Doland took top honors in the state high school forensic tournament which wound up the Association's speech program on the campus of South Dakota State University in Brookings the latter part of March. This was the first time in many years that the tournament had been held at a site other than Rapid.

Watertown won the Class "A" championship by defeating Sioux Falls Washington in the final round. Washington was attempting to repeat its victory of a year ago. Watertown swept through the two rounds of debating without a loss. Douglas Roberts coached the winning Watertown debaters and Bob Patten, the returning Washington student.

Doland took its third consecutive Class "B" debate title and seventh in nine years by winning over Tripp in the final. The Doland debaters, too, were undefeated in state tournament competition. Tom Mandel coached the Doland speakers and Wayne Klinger, the leader of Tripp debaters.

Thirty-three schools competed in the Association's divisional debate contests. This included 20 in Class "A" and 13 in Class "B". Class "A" schools qualifying for the state debate tournament were Sioux Falls Washington, Rapid City, Pierre, Sioux Falls Washington, Chamberlain, Watertown, and Yankton. Qualifiers from Class "B" divisions included Doland, Avon, Conzerville, Salem, Groton, Tripp, Newell, and Higdonville.

The question for debate throughout the season and for the tournaments was incorrect: "That the foreign aid program of the United States should be limited to non-military assistance."

Results of the original debate and extemporaneous speaking contests will be found elsewhere in THE YEARBOOK.

All-State Band

Dr. Donald R. McFadden, professor of music at Ohio State University School of Music and Director of the concert band there, was guest conductor for the 1967 All-State Band. Harlan High School was host for the 1967 event, and Stewart Guddalausen, Harlan's Director of Instrumental music, was general chairman.

One hundred sixty-five musicians from 61 high schools served members of the band through auditions conducted at eight centers in the state. Auditions and the All-State event itself were sponsored and operated through the cooperative efforts of the Iowa Music Teachers Association and the SDMSIA.

Iberston and Rapid City High Schools qualified the most performers for the band with 16 each. Mendota Park and Harlan each qualified 8, Madison and Vermilion 7 each; Aberdeen Central, Mitchell, and Spencer 6 each; Sioux Falls Lincoln, Sioux Falls Washington, and Wilcox 5 each; and Scotland and Webster 4 each.

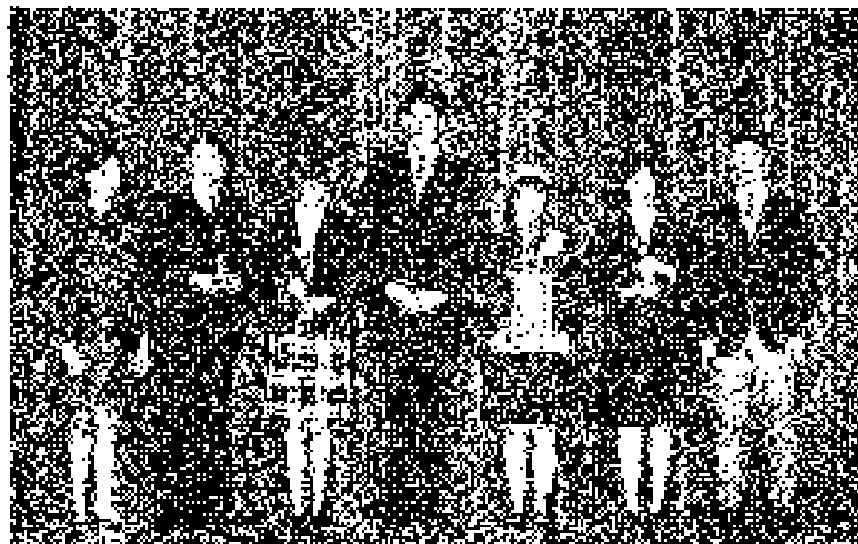

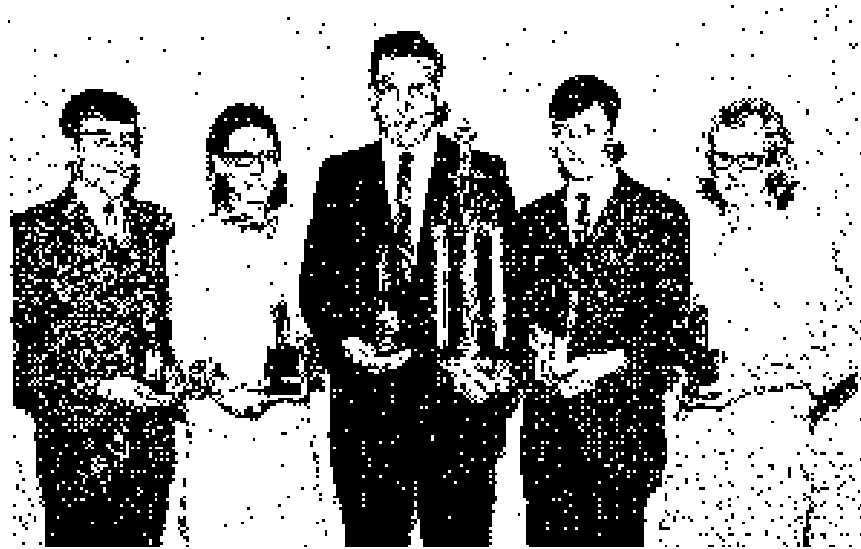

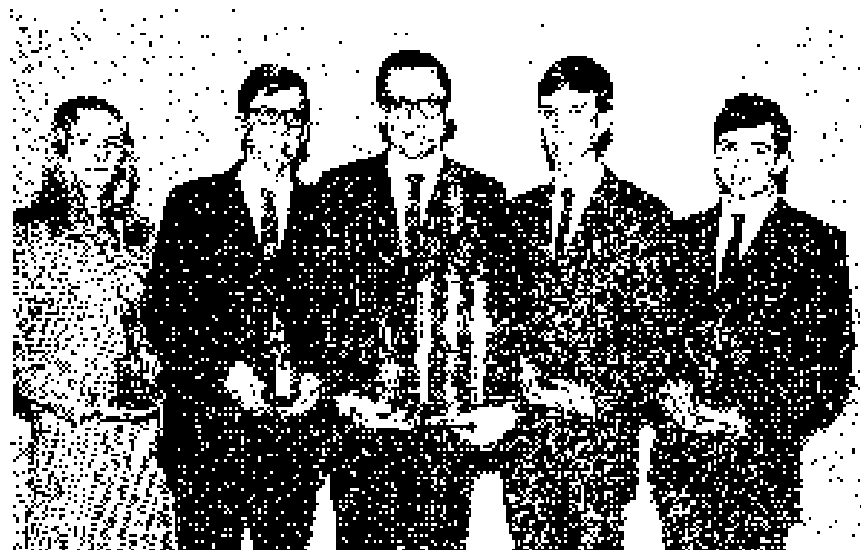

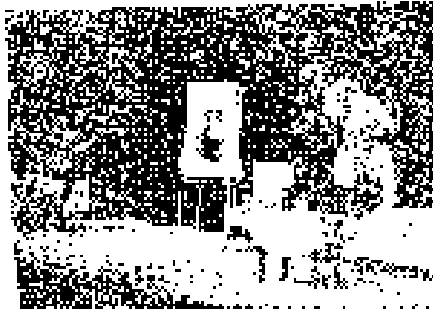
