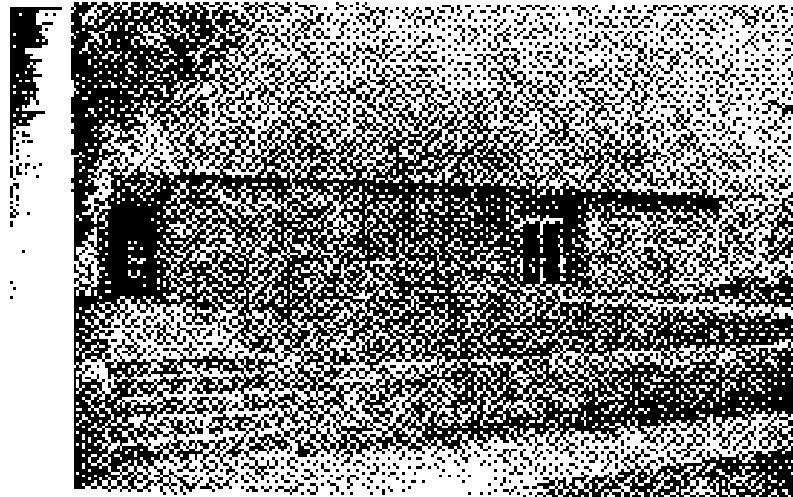

Starting July 1, 1925, H. B. Ashbaugh was appointed Executive Secretary of the Association with other space in the Department of Public Instruction in the State of South Dakota. Because of expansion by the Department of Public Instruction, and a consequent lack of space, it was necessary to move the SOUTH DAKOTA OFFICE State was under in the S. Charles Hotel, and the office was moved to the S. Charles Hotel, which it remained until November, 1927, when it was moved to permanent quarters in the SOUTH DAKOTA Building, at 411 B. Capitol Avenue in Pierre.

When the Association changed from an "Athletic Association" to an "Academy Association," it was necessary to give additional help. Dr. J. W. Rivers was named Assistant Executive Secretary July 1, 1932, and additional office space was secured in the S. Charles Hotel.

Looking back over the year, we believe it was a good year and we are quite proud of the progress shown in the many activities. There seems to be complete harmony existing, all conflicts almost entirely eliminated and we feel great progress has been made.

## 1967-1968 SDHSAA EVENTS

### ATHLETIC

#### 1967 COACHING SCHOOL

Hiram, August 14, 15, 16, 1967

The Annual Coaching School continued to be one of the outstanding schools of its kind in the nation. Over 243 attended all or part of the School. The talent was great. Eddie Crowder, Athletic Director and Football Coach at the University of Colorado, handled all football sessions, with Teddy Gross of Kansas taking care of the basketball, along with our own championship coach, Dave Wolby of Wichita and our Kansas of Trapp. Ray McGuire of Aurora, Colorado handled all sessions on wrestling.

For the third year the South Dakota Medical Association provided the coaches with a remarkable session on "Medical Aspects in Sports." Dr. Taylor of Huron, Dr. James of Mitchell and Dr. Henderson of the Mayo Clinic of Rochester headed up this part of the program. The entire School was an outstanding success.

All sessions were held in the air-conditioned "Blue Ballroom" in the Mayo-Hughitt Hotel.

### 1967 FOOTBALL RULES MEETINGS

With the exception of the World War II years, Football Rules Meetings for officials and coaches have been held continuously since 1938. The 1967 meetings were held in Aberdeen, Docksinger, Guston, Hill, Huron, Mitchell, Mitchell, Philip, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sully, Verillion, Wagner, Watertown and Winner.

35 officials, 352 coaches, and 343 others attended in football attended 42 meetings which were conducted by Mr. Welsch and Mr. Brown. These meetings will be repeated in 1968 at the same sites.

### 1967 CROSS COUNTRY RUN

Because of the number of contestants in the Annual Cross Country Run, it has become necessary to have elimination meets or increase the number of classes in Cross Country. The 1967 meet was run in three classes for the first time and worked out very well, except for rather cool and windy weather.

40 runners from forty schools competed in the "B" Class, with 14 runners from twenty-two schools taking part in the "A" Class, and 95 runners from sixteen schools in the "AA" event; thus making a total of 135 runners from 78 schools involved in the meet.

Loren Kandelak of Bristol won the "B" individual honors with Timber Lake edging the School for the first for the team championships in the "B" Class. In the "A" Class, Myron Young King of Pine Ridge was the individual champion with Clear Lake a rather easy team champion. In the "AA" Class, Rick Brigg, ground of the Henderson Indian School outperformed the field for individual honors, and the Pineblow Indian School was the team honors for the "AA" Class.

The meet was ably headed by Stock and Cross Country Coach Aubrey Dickey of South Dakota State University. A complete summary with pictures of winners will be found on other pages of this year's program.

### 1967 BASKETBALL RULES MEETINGS

Basketball Rules Meetings for officials, coaches, and other interested people were conducted by your Executive Secretary and Assistant Executive Secretary in eighteen different cities. Meetings were held in Aberdeen, Charlesburg, Docksinger, Hot Springs, Huron, Kripka, Lake Arrowhead, Madison, Mitchell, Mowbrige, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sully, Verilog, Wagner, Watertown, Winner, and Yankton.

At each of these meetings rule changes were discussed and explained, and the mechanics of officiating discussed. Six officials, 352 coaches, and 211 others attended the meetings.

## BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING

Pierre—November 17 and 18, 1967

The next regular meeting of the Board of Control for the 1967-1968 school year was held in Pierre on the day before the Annual Meeting of the Association. ## THE ANNUAL SDHSAA MEETING

Pierre—Buchanan School

Saturday, November 18, 1967

Twenty-nine (29) member schools of the SDHSAA were officially represented at the Annual Meeting of the Association. Reports on the previous year and an explanation of the audit were made by Executive Secretary R. M. Walzorb.

Two amendments were discussed at the meeting, and nomination for a regular five (5) year term on the Board of Control to succeed Chairman H. E. Ashbaugh, who was ineligible for reelection were made. Those nominated for the term were Principal Bruce Crockett of Mitchell, Supt. Leo J. Uken of Willow Lake, and Supt. Virgil Struenger of Centerville. For a four (4) year, unexpired term to which Supt. A. A. Champion of Pierre had been appointed, nominations were made for Supt. Thompson and Supt. Donald Piskay of Menno.

Supt. Maurice Klugland of Murdo was then nominated for an unexpired three (3) year term to which he had been appointed. His was the only nomination.

Supt. Roger M. Antelme was then nominated for an unexpired term of one year, to which he had been previously appointed. There were no other nominations.

## FOOTBALL SPECIAL COMMITTEE MEETING

Atlanta, Georgia

December 4 and 5, 1967

Your Executive Secretary was appointed to a Special Football Committee representing the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations which met with a similar committee from the NCAA Football Rules group at Atlanta, Georgia on December 4 and 5, 1967. The purpose of the meeting was to study differences in the two football codes to see if differences between the codes could be brought closer together. Progress was made as shown by changes in both codes.

Representing the High School Football Committee were Mr. Sam Burke of Georgia, Chairman of the National Alliance Football Committee, Mr. Clifford Fager of Chicago, Secretary of the National Alliance Football Committee, and Mr. Walzorb of South Dakota. The NCAA committee was made up of Mr. Jay Wilkinson of Wisconsin, Chairman of the NCAA Football Committee, Mr. Dave Nelson of Delaware, Secre-

**RESULT OF REFERENDUM VOTE ON AMENDMENTS  
AND  
ELECTION OF BOARD OF CONTROL MEMBERS**

---

As stated previously in the notes on the Annual Meeting of the Association, two amendments were discussed. According to the Constitution and By-Laws of the SMISA, voting on amendments and the election of Board Members is by mail ballot. When ballots were counted on January 2, 1968, both amendments received a favorable vote and will become effective July 1, 1968. The amendments briefly are: First, the size of the Board of Control will be increased by one member and certain size schools will be transferred on the Board in the future. The complete new amendment will be a part of the Constitution and By-Laws and will be printed in the new edition of the book, and therefore will not be explained here. The second amendment provides that there shall be three classes in Track. This also will be published in the new edition of the Constitution and By-Laws.

Board of Control members elected after the mail ballot, for as follows: For the one year term, Supt. Dean of Willow Lake. For the four year unexpired term Supt. Plakins of Menard. Supt. Haugland of Murdo was the only nominee for the unexpired three year term, and Supt. Antoine of Baltic was the only nominee for the unexpired one year term. They were automatically elected and their names were not on the ballots.

The 1985 Tournament was won by Winthrop with 78 points. Rapid City was second with 37 points. Third and fourth places were shared by Parkton and Gemma each with 38 points. Thirty-three schools scored one or more points in the Tournament, with 12 schools not scoring.

## BOARD OF CONTROL MEETING

Pierre—June 7 and 8, 1968

The last of three regularly scheduled meetings of the Board of Control for the school year of 1967-1968 was held in Pierre on June 7 and 8. The events of the year were reviewed and plans were made for 1968-1969. Much business was transacted and a rather complete summary of actions taken at all meetings follows:

The three regular meetings of the Board were in Pierre, November 17 and 18, 1967, in Sioux Falls March 13, 15, and 16, 1968 and in Pierre on June 7 and 8, 1968.

Officers of the Board for 1968-1969 were Supv. H. B. Ashbaugh, President; Chairman; Supv. A. I. Mortenson, Belle Poppeke, Vice Chairman and E. M. Walseth, Treasurer, as provided for in the Constitution of the SDHSAA. Since Mr. Ashbaugh's term on the Board of Control ends July 1, 1968, H. W. Auld of Yankton was elected Chairman for the year of 1968-1969. No Vice Chairman was elected at the June meeting and E. M. Walseth will continue as treasurer.

Following are actions taken by the Board at the meetings during the year. These actions are listed as they were made and not in the order of their importance.

- (1) Set dates for Coaching School in Huron—August 12, 13, 14, 1968.
- (2) Set date for 1968 Cross Country Run at Brookings—October 18.
- (3) Appointed members on Advisory Committee for Journalism and Speech.
- (4) Made a policy on newly reorganized districts and possible reorganizer school districts as for the student classification conference.
- (5) Elected Glenn Dillman of Manderson Indian School as a transfer student and therefore ineligible for one year.
- (6) Made minor changes in 1968-1969 "B" districts.
- (7) Reopened earlier dates for the State Wrestling Tournament, allowed visiting schools to have dual and meets in the last week of November.
- (8) Authorized E. M. Walseth travel to Atlanta, Georgia, at National Federation expense.
- (9) Approved for consideration by member schools athletic insurance.
- (10) Accepted Huron's invitation to host the 1969 State Wrestling Tournament.
- (11) Made slight changes in "D" districts for 1968-1969.
- (12) Appointed two new members to the Advisory Committee for Girls' Athletics.
- (13) Authorized a second meeting for this committee.
- (14) Accepted the Sioux Falls Invitational to host the 1968 "A" and "AA" State Basketball Tournaments.
- (15) Made several changes in the State Track Meet. They are as follows: (a) will in lanes; (b) allow two holders to compete in field events; (c) adopted standards for the "A" and "B" two mile run; (d) adopted standards for low boarding if run around a curve; (e) will run posthu-



issues in 800 yard run; (1) Change title of trials and trial sections; (2) 15 three preliminary heats per necessary quantity for final each heat plus two fastest times; (3) Make slight changes and awarded arbitration rule on claims; (4) Adopted Minnesota's rule on protests; (5) Review of Foranburg protest on narrow circumstances; (6) Mr. Althoff, Mr. Hagedorn, Mr. Gorman, and Mr. Wenzel to attend National Recreation Convention; (7) Made slight changes in methods of certifying officials; (8) Set salaries for Executive Secretary, Assistant Executive Secretary, and office help; (9) Rules that if girls have needs, no girl shall run any event longer than 220 yards, and competition be limited to three events; (10) Decided that for 1960 week, each of the three classes be divided into club regions; (11) Decided to hold the "A", "B", and "C" State Track Meets together; (12) Accepted Board Club's invitation to host the 1960 State Track Meet, the Girl Championships, and the Girls Wrestling; (13) Added an extra member to Advisory Committee on tracks; (14) Will provide medals for Region Girl Championships; (15) Will provide additional trophies for State Golf and Tennis; (16) Accepted several recommendations for girls facilities, including Region and State Track Meets and State Golf and Tennis; (17) Appointed Duane Roberts of Whitefish as South Dakota's representative to N.A.S.A. meeting in Chicago; (18) Appointed new members on Advisory Committees for Student Council, Speech, Paces and Mugs; (19) Appointed a new member to Wrestling Committee; (20) Changed some wrestling regulations; (21) Proposed various officers for Board of Control, Executive Secretary, Assistant Executive Secretary, and Advisory Committees; (22) Increased expense allowances of scorers and coaches to State Wrestling Championships; (23) Made changes in distribution of student tickets to State "B" Basketball Tournament; (24) Set up a trophy for girls to competing teams in the "B" basketball tournament; (25) Discussed the new regulations; (26) Appointed Capt. Kenneth Hauge as a member of the Board of Control to replace Mr. Mortenson who is retiring on July 1; (27) Approved the financial reports of the Treasurer for 1957-58 and discussed proposed budget for 1958-59; (28) Reached membership in the Association of schools which might have their own gymnasium; (29) Expressed thanks and appreciation to retiring Board Members Mr. Ashbaugh, Mr. Mortenson, and Mr. Thompson; (30) Set the date for the Annual Meeting of the Association as October 8, 1958 in Sioux Falls.

## RESULTS OF 1967 SDSAA CROSS COUNTRY RUN

South Dakota State University—Oct. 20, 1967

The 1967 (2250) Annual Cross Country Run was a great event. This year, for the first time, it was run in three classes with 129 runners from 49 schools competing in the "B" class; 134 runners from 22 schools took part in the "A" event; and 36 runners from 16 schools ran in the "AA" class.

Conditions for the meet were rather bad, a strong wind gusting to 35 miles per hour and a temperature of 59, handicapped the runners.

Following are summaries of the "B" event, the "A" event and the "AA" event. Chamber Lake won team honors in "B", Clear Lake in "A" and the Flandreau Indian School in "AA".

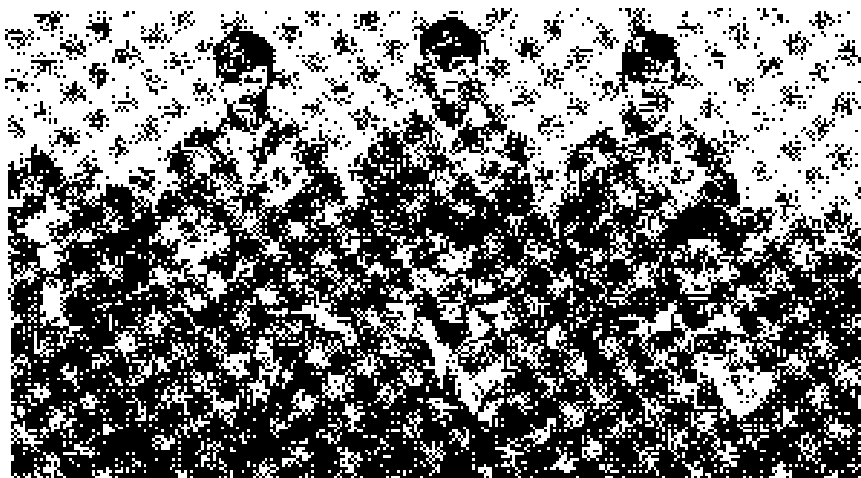

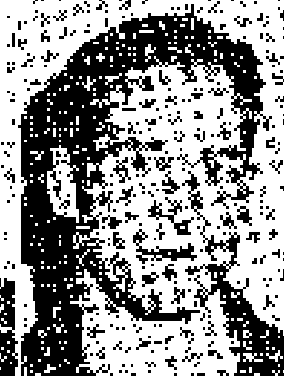

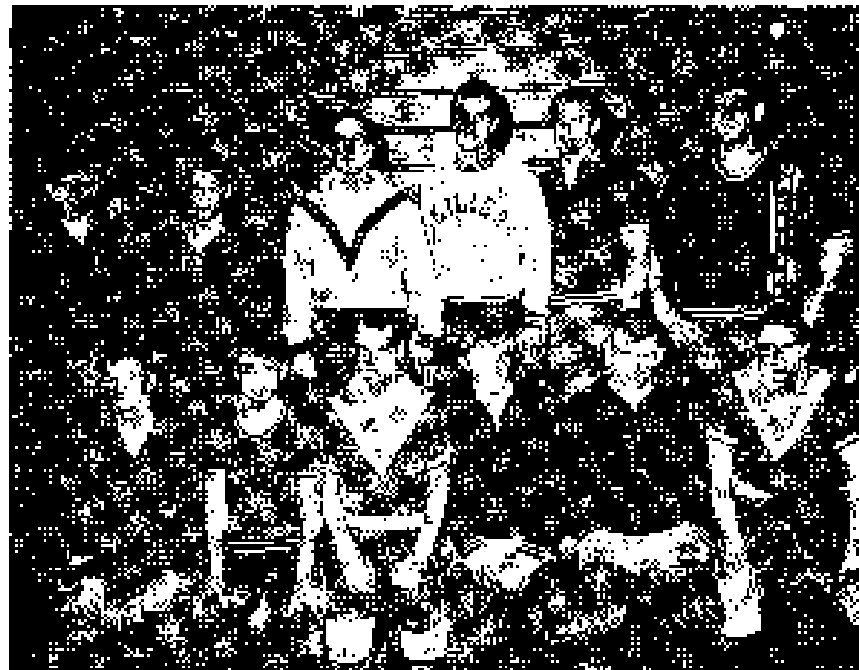

## 1968 TOURNAMENTS

The 1968 Basketball Tournaments are now history and while it may seem impossible, each tournament seems to get better. Games played are interesting and close, and the team and management also improve with age. New innovations keep cropping up to make each tournament better than preceding tournaments.

The 1968 tournaments produced two title championship teams—Arlington in the "B" and Brookings in the "A". Arlington defeated Clark in the first round of the "B" Tournament in a fine game, and then beat Onda in the semi-finals in a real good contest, and then took a great Finals game in the finals.

Brookings, the "A" Champion, was streaked by Lead in the first round, and then eliminated White town in the semi-finals in a game that was close up to the middle of the third quarter. In the Finals they defeated Sioux Falls Lutheran, a great team, in the clutch; part of the game.

Our congratulations to the schools and their coaches—P.R. Hennrich of Arlington and Ken Thoms of Brookings. They and their teams were ready to play.

On other pages of this YEAR BOOK you will find scores of all games in the two tournaments and pictures of all teams with their season's records.

## HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1903 and from that time until 1912 competition was purely track, football, on a statewide basis, in track and debate. In 1912, with permission of the SDHSAA, Pikes Peak College sponsored a state high school basketball tournament, open to all high schools in the State. This tournament was conducted annually in 1917, when, at the request of the College, the arrangement was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has been under the supervision and management of the Board since that time. The winners of teams in the State Tournament varied until 1924 when eight teams qualified. Since 1924 the State Tournaments have been eight team affairs, with exceptions in 1939, 1940 and 1941 when the "A" Tournaments were four team tournaments.

During the 1920's there was agitation for two classes, and in 1929 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. Under this plan the State was divided into 32 districts and the 32 districts were grouped into eight "A" Regions, and the eight Region winners then qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The 32 District winners qualified for eight "B" Regions, from which the eight winners qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan did not prove popular and was abandoned after the one year trial.

Agitation continued for two classes, and in the fall of 1935 an "A" and "B" plan was developed. Under this plan High Schools with an enrollment of 300 and over were classed as "A" schools and all other schools were "B" schools. Under this setup the top schools in the E.S.D. Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament, and the teams in the same division of the Conference played against the other "A" schools to determine the other qualifiers in the eight team State "A" Tournament. "B" teams with outstanding records were allowed to challenge into the "A" class for the right to enter the State "A" Tournament. The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in March of 1936.

With adjustments from time to time in the "A" setup, including taking away the right of a "B" school to challenge, and taking away the method of qualifying by being one of the top teams in the E.S.D. Conference, the present plan was adopted for the 1941-42 season. During the transition from 1936 to 1938 the four largest schools in four regional areas were classed as "A" schools and in each of the four sections, two teams from each section qualified for the State "A" Tournament by a double elimination method.

In 1938 the present plan was started whereby the 32 regional high schools, by enrollments, made up the "A" group and eight "A" sections were set up, and the winner of each of the eight section tournaments qualified for the State "A" Tournament. Also part of the present "A" setup is that, while enrollments might change, the teams were determined on the two-year basis, rather than having changes annually in each class.

For the 1962 "A" Tournaments a change was made in the method of qualifying teams in the State "A" Tournament. This change, briefly was as follows: The make up of schools in the "A" Sections was left as it had been in recent years. However a double elimination Section Tournament was played with two teams from each section qualifying for the new "sub-state" tournaments. Sections 1 and 2 formed Sub-State #1; Sections 3 and 4 formed Sub-State #2; Sections 5 and 6 formed Sub-State #3; and Sections 7 and 8 formed Sub-State #4. This placed four teams in each of the four Sub-State Tournaments; and again double elimination tournaments were played with two teams from each Sub-State Tournament qualifying for the State "A" Tournament.

The 1961 plan for "A" tournaments was discarded in 1962 and qualification for places in the State "A" Tournament was done by single elimination tournaments in each of eight (8) "A" Sections. The winner of each "A" Section qualified for the State "A" Tournament. This method was continued for the 1968 and 1969 Tournaments.

Since the start of the "A" and "B" classification in 1936 there has been little change in the "B" set-up. We have continued to have 32 "B" Districts and 8 "B" Regions with the eight "B" Region winners qualifying for the State "B" Tournament. Of course there has had to be changes in districts and regions but the basic plan has been kept over the years.

#### Region Music Contests

High school music contests in South Dakota are held only on a regional level with no advancement to a state contest. Contests were held in all eight regions again in 1937-38. In six of the regions solo and ensemble contests were completed in February and were followed by large group contests either the last week end in March or early in April. Region IV held all its contests during a two-day event in April. Region V . . . held its solo and ensemble contests in early April and its large group contest in May. Regions I, II, and V have separate vocal and instrumental contests in February.

#### Doland and Sioux Falls Washington Debaters Win State Titles

Debaters from Doland and Sioux Falls Washington took top honors in the state high school debate tournament which wound up the Association's speech program on the campus of Dakota Wesleyan University in Mitchell the latter part of March.

Doland won its fourth consecutive Class "B" debate title and eighth in 10 years by defeating Sioux Valley High School of Vega in the finals. Both schools went into the final round undefeated in state tournament competition. Don Mendel coached the Doland speakers and Mrs. Joseph Orter, the moderator. Sioux Valley debaters.

Sioux Falls Washington won the Class "A" championship by defeating Brookings in the final round. Both schools went into the championship debate with one loss during state tournament competition. This was the second state title for Washington in three years. District Panel coaches the winning Washington debaters and James Klassen, the manager-up Brookings squad.

Many schools competed in the Association's division forensics contests. This included 28 in Class "A" and 21 in Class "B." Class "A" schools qualifying for the state debate tournament were Brookings, Sioux Falls Washington, Mitchell Public, Rapid City Public, Watertown, Strong, Aberdeen Central, and Sioux Falls Lincoln. Qualifiers from Class "B" divisions included Salem Central, Avon, Doland, Highmore,odge, Sioux Valley, Newell, and Garretson.

The question for debate throughout the season and for the tournaments was Resolved: That Congress should establish uniform regulations to control criminal investigation procedures.

Results of the original oratory and extemporaneous speaking contests will be found elsewhere in THE YEARBOOK.

#### **All-State Band**

Dr. Leonard B. Smith, nationally known musician, conductor, and lecturer from Detroit, Michigan, was guest conductor of the 1968 All-State Band. Central High School in Aberdeen was host for the 1968 event, and E. Orville Evenson, Central's director of instrumental music, was general chairman.

One hundred and sixty-seven musicians from 74 high schools earned membership in the band through auditions conducted at eleven centers in the state. Auditions and the All-State event itself were planned and operated through the cooperative efforts of the South Dakota Bandmasters' Association and the SDHSAA.

Huron High School qualified the most performers for the band, nine. Aberdeen Central and Rapid City Public each qualified 8; Winner and Sioux Falls Lincoln 7 each; Clark, Flandreau, and Madison Central 6 each; Beresford and Hayti 5 each; and Canton and Vermillion 4 each. Thirteen more schools qualified members for the band than in 1967.

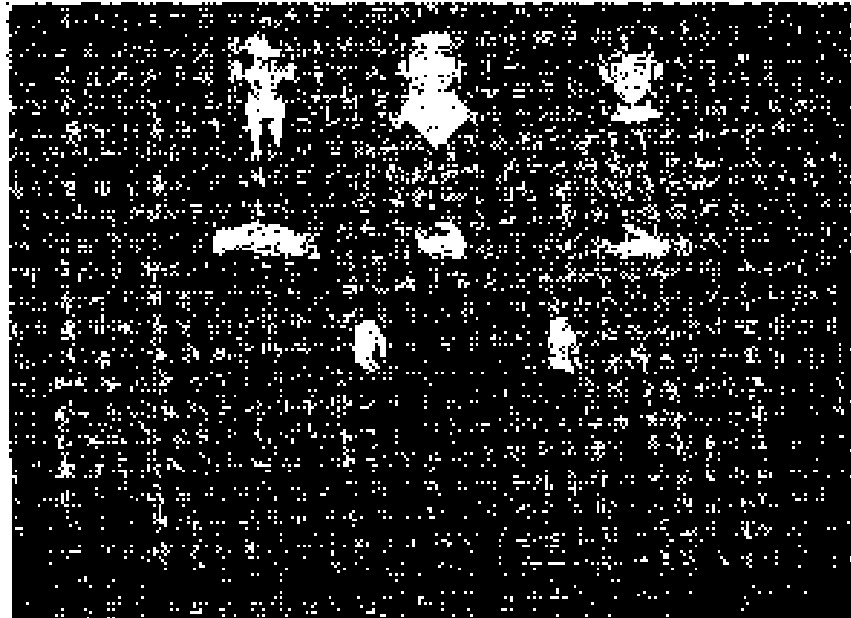

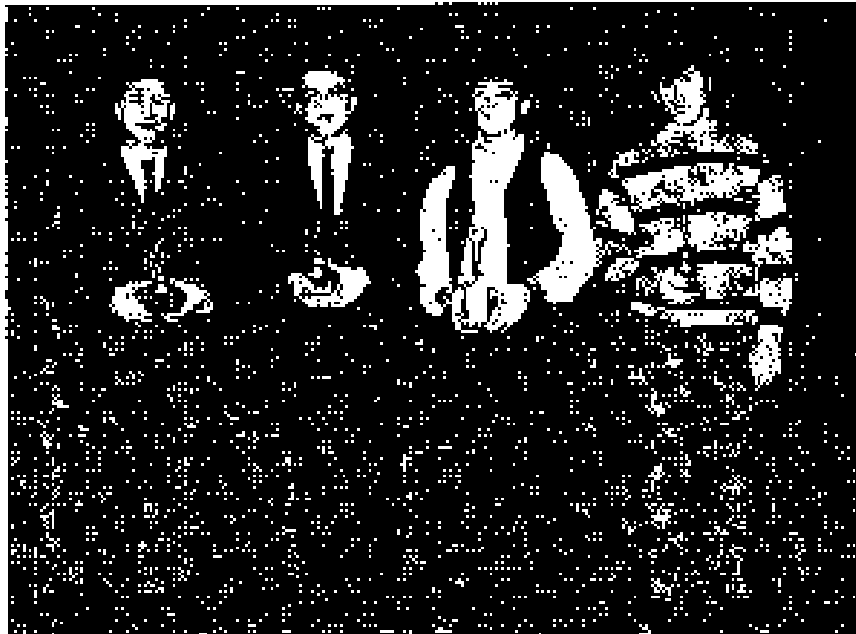

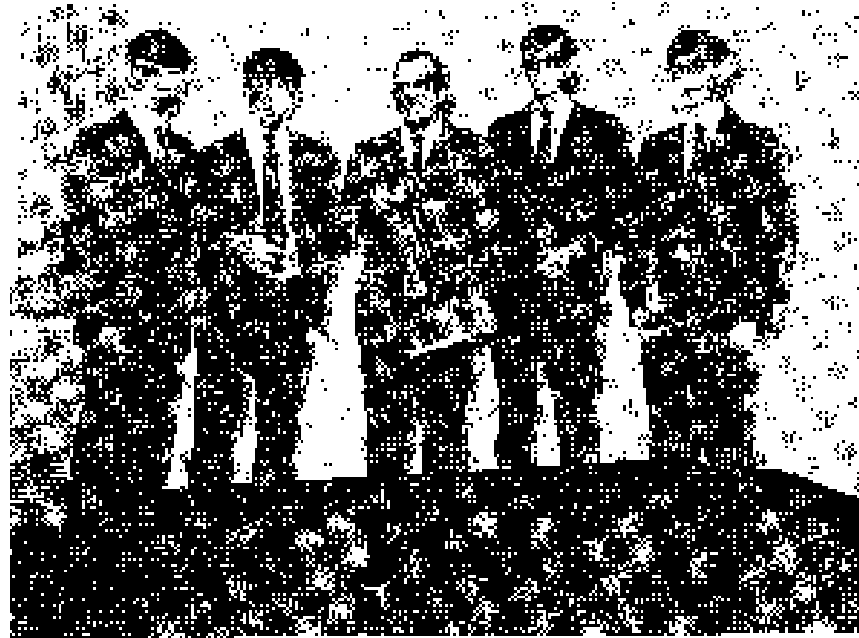
