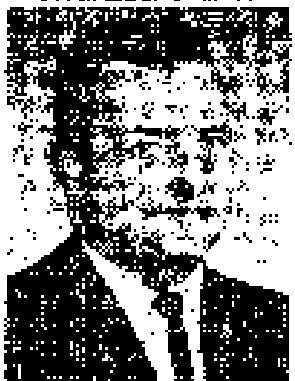

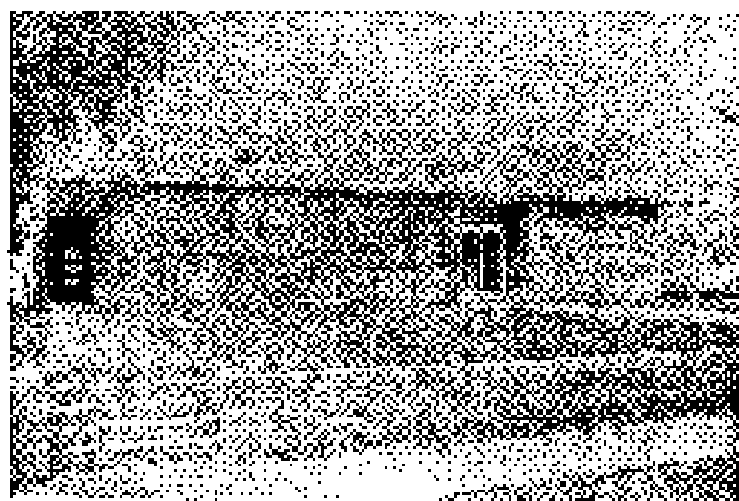

## FOREWORD

---

The Year Book, published annually after the close of the school year, serves as AN ANNUAL REPORT of the Executive Secretary and Staff, provides a complete review of events in the school year of 1968-1970. We sincerely hope each school has been and will continue to be their copies of the Year Book as a rather complete history of the Association will be on file in each member school.

Starting July 1, 1907, H. L. Waserth was appointed Executive Secretary of the Association, with office space in the Department of Public Instruction in the Statehouse in Pierre. Because of expansion in the Department of Public Instruction, and a consequent lack of space, it was necessary to move the SDEAA office. Space was rented in the St. Charles Hotel, and the office was moved in January of 1913, where it remained until November 1913. Then it was moved to permanent quarters in the SDEA building on 111 E. Central Avenue in Pierre.

With the Association changing from an "Athletic Association" to an "Activities Association," it was necessary to add additional help. Mr. L. W. Burns was named Assistant Executive Secretary July 1, 1932, and additional office space was secured in the SDEA building.

Because of the increased activities of the SDEAA, the Board of Control decided to add another man to the staff and Clair Ferguson, formerly Athletic Director at the Watertown High School, will be added to the staff on July 1, 1939. With the addition of Mr. Ferguson, additional office space was necessary and in June of 1939 the offices were moved to the lower level of the SDEA Building.

The new SDEA building is pictured on page 2 of this "YEAR BOOK."

Ralph Wilkinson, former principal at Montrose High School, will assume the non-athletic duties previously handled by D. W. Evans. Mr. Evans will assume Executive Secretary of the Association on July 1, 1938 as R. M. "Eug" Waserth, who has so competently directed the affairs of the Association for thirty three years, will be retiring.

## REVIEW OF SDHSAA EVENTS FOR 1969-1970

This volume of the "YEAR BOOK" contains complete summaries of the statewide events and the business of the SDHSAA for the school year of 1969-1970. The annual audit of the Association's finances is not included because of the time of the year, but the audit is published each year in the Annual Meeting Bulletin which will be issued in mid-September.

On the next few pages you will find mention of these events, with complete summaries and pictures in the proper order later in the book.

1969-1970 was the fourth year that the Association has been operated as an "Activities Association" and therefore the events mentioned are summarized not only for all activities, but only athletes. The athletic summaries and pictures are in the first section of the YEAR BOOK, and the section on the other activities in the second section of the book.

Looking back over the year, we believe it was a good year, and we are quite proud of the progress shown in the many activities. There seems to be complete harmony existing, all conflicts seem to be amicably eliminated and we feel great progress has been made.

Even though all activities are directed from a central office, these activities could not so effectively administered without the use of committees made up of the dedicated people who are interested in seeing that the particular activity does go well. Think of the many conventions, meets and contests leading up to the state events. They could not be properly operated without your great help. Our Board of Control, the Executive Secretary, and the Assistant Executive Secretaries wish to say many people so enthusiastically setting up the numerous committees. You have done a great job and again, "Thank you!"

The interscholastic program seems to improve with age. There is evidence of greater participation by more athletes each year in all activities. We will not try to single out any activity, but all seem to grow and get better.

We believe the transition from an Athletic Association to the Activities Association was good, and with your continued cooperation there is no reason why the entire program should not get better.

## 1969-1970 SDHSAA EVENTS

### ATHLETIC

#### 1969 COACHING SCHOOL

August 11, 12, 13, 1969

Over 250 coaches attended the 1969 Annual Tutor-Free SDHSAA Coaching school and were well rewarded for their attendance. We believe the school was great and continues to be one of the best in the Nation. The talent consisted of high school coaches with outstanding records in their respective fields. Sid Cooby, Fargo Branch and Tom Hancock of Lakewood, Colorado headed the football program. Basketball sessions were conducted by Walt Farnham of Wynnton High School of Kansas City and Duane Dugelan of Illinois, Minnesota. Wrestling was handled by Bob Slodens of Waterloo, Iowa. An added attraction, Dave Stuart, coach of our own State AA Champions, took part in the basketball presentations.

For the fifth year the South Dakota Medical Association provided the Monday afternoon session of the Clinic with Dr. H. L. Saylor of Huron arranging the session. Dr. Burton Onofrio, Neurosurgeon from the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota, presented a fine program on "Protecting the Health of the Athlete."

All sessions were in the new air-conditioned Huron High School.

### **1969 FOOTBALL RULES MEETINGS**

Since 1938, with the exception of a couple of World War II years, Football Rules Meetings have been held continuously. The 1969 meetings were held in Aberdeen, Brookings, Custer, Faith, Huron, Mitchell, Mo-bridge, Philip, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sturgis, Vermillion, Wagner, Water-town, and Winner.

383 officials, 368 coaches, and 192 others interested in football rules attended the meetings which were conducted by Mr. Evans and Mr. Walseth. These meetings will be continued in 1970 at the same sites.

### **THE ANNUAL SDHSAA MEETING**

**Washington High School Auditorium**

**Sioux Falls—October 8, 1969**

Seventy-five (75) member schools of the SDHSAA were officially represented by one or more delegates to the Annual Meeting of the Association. Reports were made, the budget for 1969-70 was presented and the Annual Audit was reviewed.

But one amendment to the Athletic By-Laws of the Association had been presented, and this was discussed from the floor at the meeting. In later balloting (by mail) this amendment was passed by a large vote. Briefly, the amendment provided for a three-day advance in the start of pre-season football practice—these three days to be devoted entirely to conditioning, with no contact and with no pads.

There was to be one vacancy on the Board, and the incumbent, Supt. Kenneth Hauge of Sturgis did not wish to be nominated. Supt. Dale Vance of Spearfish was then nominated and there were no other nominations, so Mr. Vance was declared elected. His term is to start July 1, 1970 and to run for six years.

### 1960 CROSS COUNTRY RUN

Brookings, South Dakota - October 17, 1960

The 1960 (1961) Annual Cross Country Run was a splendid event. For the first time the event was run in three classes. 152 runners from 21 schools taking part in the "B" division, 129 runners from 18 schools in the "A," while 223 runners from 17 schools participated in the "AA" Class.

Team championships were won by the Florsheim Indian School in Class "AA," Cheyenne Falls State in Class "A" and St. Francis in Class "B."

- ◆ Set up guidelines for a Policy Handbook for Board of Control and Staff Members.

- ◆ Assigned the 1970 Cross-Country Run to Herington.

- ◆ Authorized securing uniform medals for District, Region, and Section Basketball Tournaments, such medals to be ordered and paid for by the individual District, Region, and Section Tournament Committees.

- ◆ Named Assistant Executive Secretary D. W. Evans as the Executive Secretary, replacing Executive Secretary R. H. Waseeth, effective July 1, 1970. - ◆ Approved television for Championship round games in the State "A" Basketball Tournament and for the last two nights of the "A" Tournament.

- ◆ Set the annual dates for the Cross-Country Run as the last Friday in October.

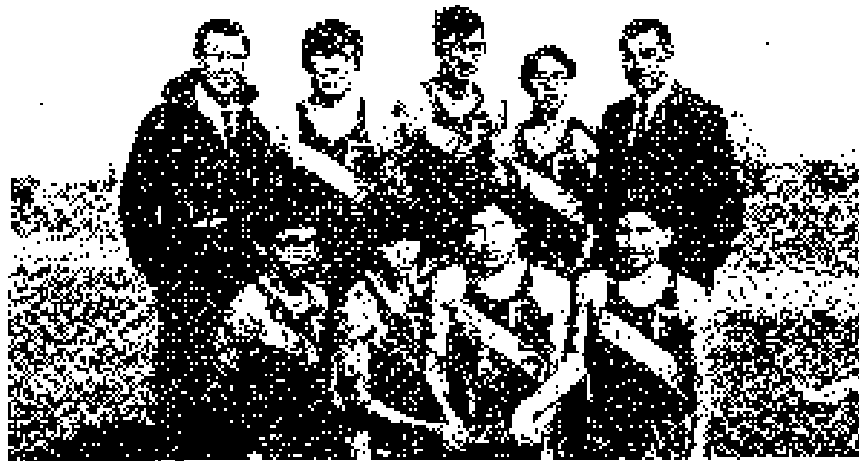

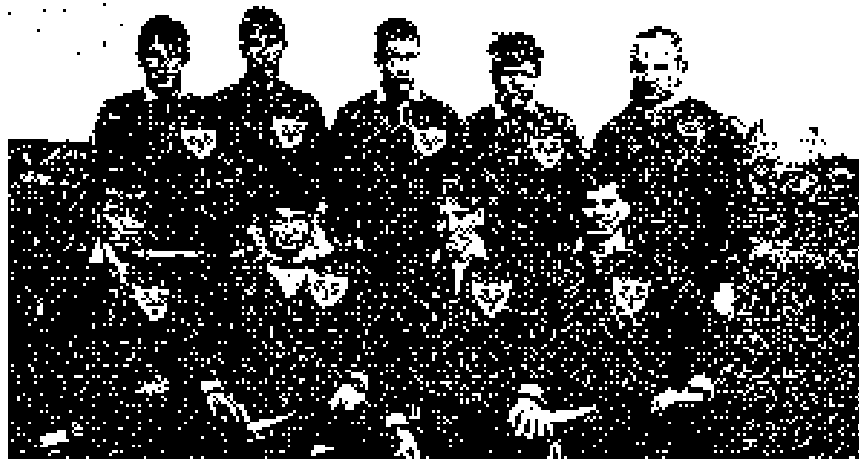

### 1970 TOURNAMENTS

At the conclusion of play in the 1970 State Basketball Tournaments, two new champions were crowned and these were fine teams, well coached, physically strong and each had the necessary desire and manpower. De Smet defeated Clark in the first round, eliminated Hurley in the semi-finals, before meeting Stickney in the final game.

Sioux Falls Lincoln, the "A" champion, defeated Rapid City Central in the first game, then took care of Spearfish in the second round and edged a strong Yankton team in the finals. The final game was a contest between two fine teams, each blessed with outstanding individuals. The game itself was one of the best final games in any State Tournament.

Our congratulations to the schools and their coaches— Larry Luitjens of De Smet and Floyd Farrand of Sioux Falls Lincoln. These coaches had their teams ready to play.

Wally Diehl and his staff, as usual, did a great job of putting on two outstanding tournaments.

On other pages of this "Year Book" you will find scores of all games in the two tournaments and pictures of the teams with their season's records.

## HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1896 and from that time until 1912, competition was strictly limited on a statewide basis to track and football. In 1912, with permission of the SDHSAA, Huron College sponsored a state high school basketball tournament open to all high schools in the State. This tournament was continued annually to 1917, when, at the request of the College, the management was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has since been the responsibility and management of the Board since that time. The number of teams in the State Tournament varied until 1921 when eight teams qualified. Since 1921 the State Tournaments have been eight team affairs with exceptions in 1938, 1940 and 1941 when the "A" Tournaments were four team tournaments.

During the 1890's there was agitation for two classes and in 1900 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. Under this plan the State was divided into 22 districts and the 22 highest schools went to eight "A" Regions and the eight region winners then qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The 22 District runners-up qualified for eight "B" Regions from which the eight winners qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan did not prove popular and was abandoned after the one year trial.

Agitation continued for two classes and in the fall of 1907 an "A" and "B" plan was proposed. Under this plan High Schools with an enrollment of 300 and over were classed as "A" schools and all other schools were "B" schools. Under this plan the top schools in the S.S.D. Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament, and the teams in the non-conference districts (Coaches only) played neutral. In other "A" schools to determine the other qualifiers in the eight team State "A" Tournament. "B" teams were outstanding schools were allowed to challenge and tie "A" class. On the right to entry into state "A" tournament. The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in March of 1908.

With adjustments from time to time in the "B" series including taking away the right of a "B" school to challenge and taking away the method of qualifying by being one of the top teams in the S.S.D. Conference the present plan was adopted for the 1912-1913 season. During the transition from 1907 to 1912, the four largest areas in four geographical areas were classed as "A" schools and in each of the four sections two teams from each section qualified for the State "A" Tournament by a double elimination method.

In 1917 the present plan was started whereby the 22 largest High schools by enrollment made up the "A" group and eight "A" sections were set up, and the winner of each of the eight section tournaments qualified for the State "A" Tournament. Also part of the present "A" set-up is that with adjustments made through the years were determined on the two year basis rather than trying changes annually in such cases.

By the 1967 "A" Tournaments a change was made in the method of qualifying teams to the State "A" Tournament. This change, briefly was as follows. The make up of schools in the "A" Section was left as it had been in recent years, however a double elimination Section Tournament was played with two teams from each section qualifying for the new "Sub-State" tournaments. Sections 1 and 2 formed Sub-State #1; Sections 3 and 4 formed Sub-State #2; Sections 5 and 6 formed Sub-State #3 and Sections 7 and 8 formed Sub-State #4. This placed four teams in each of the four Sub-State Tournaments and seven double elimination tournaments were played with two teams from each Sub-State tournament qualifying for the State "A" Tournament.

The 1961 plan for "A" tournaments was discarded in 1962 and qualification for places in the State "A" Tournament was done by single elimination tournaments in each of eight "B" Sections. The winner of each "B" Section qualified for the State "A" Tournament. This method has been continued through the 1978 Tournaments.

Since the start of the "A" and "B" classification in 1948 there has been little change in the "B" setup. We have continued to have 22 "B" Districts and 8 "B" Regions with one eight "B" Region winners qualifying for the State "A" tournament. Of course there has had to be changes in districts and regions but the basic plan has been kept over the years.

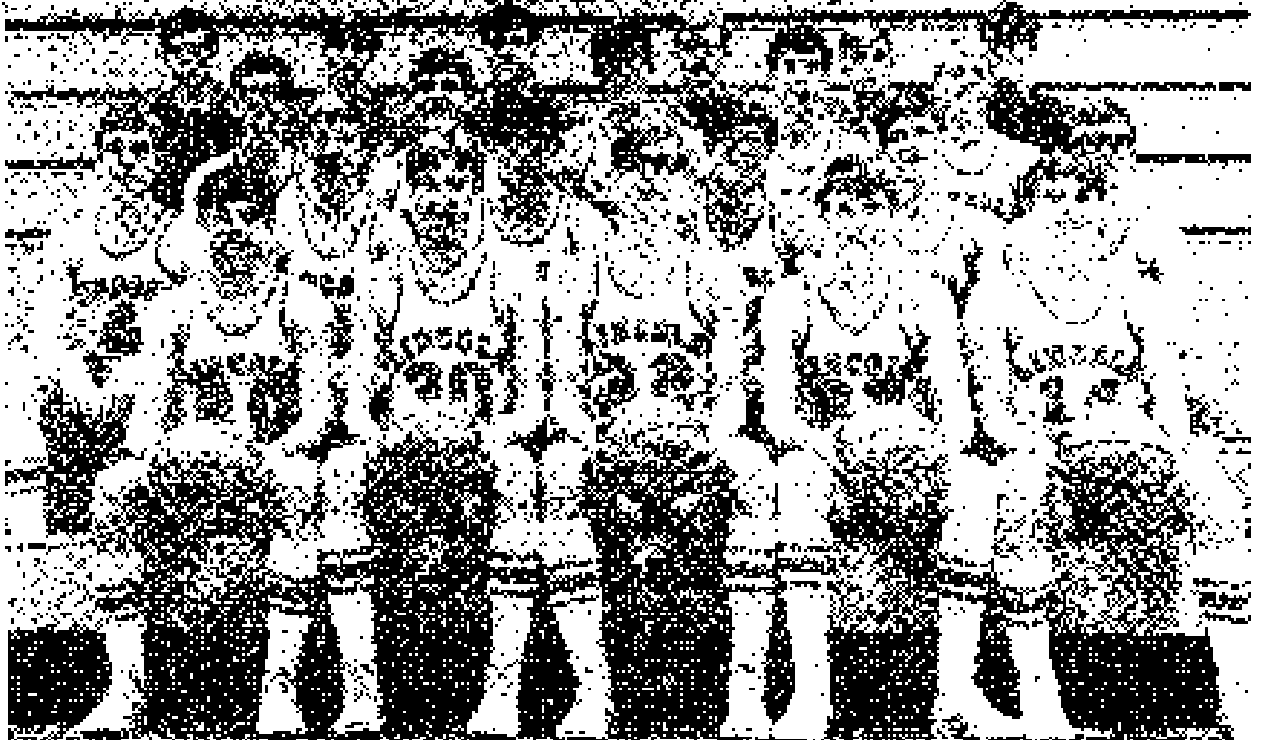

### 1963 Press Convention and Publications Competition

Again, the big event for high school journalists in South Dakota was the annual press convention held at the South Dakota State University campus in Hot Springs on September 27. Dr. George Halling and his staff at the University planned and operated the convention in their usual efficient manner. High light of the convention was the announcement of the results of the annual competition in school newspapers and yearbooks.

For the third consecutive year Sioux Falls Premier won the trophy-stakes award. Its newspaper was rated the top one in the contest, and its yearbook ranked third among the All-State selections. Only two schools carried double All-State honors with their publications.

### REGION MUSIC CONTESTS

Membership of the South Dakota High School Activities Association is divided into eight regions for conducting music contests. Actually, these contests are in the nature of a festival in that each individual or group is striving for a rating with no best efforts placed upon the judges as to the number of superior ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

Contests were held in all eight regions again in 1969-70. In six of the regions solo and ensemble contests were completed in February and were followed by large group contests either the first or third week of April. Region IV held all its contests during a two-day event the first weekend in April. Region VIII held its solo and ensemble contests in early April and its large group contest the first Saturday in May. Regions I, II and VII held separate vocal and instrumental contests in February. Region III had no large group contests.

#### Milbank and Salem Debaters Win State Titles

Debaters from Milbank and Salem took top honors in the state high school debate tournament which wound up the Association's speech program on the campus of Northern State College at Aberdeen the middle of March. These championships were "firsts" for both Milbank and Salem.

Salem, after being runner-up the previous year, defeated Groton in the finals to take the Class "B" crown. Carl Swerwin coached the Salem debaters, and John Westly, the coach at Groton, squeaked.

Milbank went through the state tournament unopposed to win the Class "A" championship. In the championship debate Milbank defeated Watertown 4 to 1. Cal Cooper coached the winning Milbank team, and James Roberts, the coach at Watertown, signed.

Fifty schools competed in the Association's division I intensive contests. This included 26 in Class "A" and 24 in Class "B". Class "A" schools qualifying for the state debate tournament were Sioux Falls Lincoln,

Tarkenton, Sturgis, Yankton, Madison, Mitchell, Rapid City Central, and Watertown. Qualifiers for Class "B" included: Weymouth, Salsburg, Telling, Baltic, Clara Lacey, Wagner, Crown, and Newell.

The question for debate throughout the season and for the championships was, How can that Congress should prohibit unilateral United States military intervention in foreign countries.

Results of the original trials and simultaneous speaking contests will be found elsewhere in "THE YEARBOOK".

#### All-State Band

Mrs. Johnson, director of bands at St. Olaf College, Northfield, Minnesota, was guest conductor for the 1970 All-State Band. Westport High School was host for the 1970 event, and Doug Carpenter, director of bands at Westport High School was general chairman. Ed secretary-treasurer of the South Dakota Bandmasters Association, Ed Carpenter was in charge of all activities for the band.

One hundred six of five musicians from 38 schools earned membership in the band through auditioning procedures at 11 schools in the state. Auditions and the All-State event itself were planned and operated through the cooperative efforts of the South Dakota Bandmasters Association and the SDBSAA.

Ray's City Stevens High School qualified the most performers for the band: 14; Clark 12; Watertown 9; Aberdeen Central and Clinton 8 each; Redfield and Linn 5 each; and Arlington, Fortified Cannon, Hayti, West, Wobesche, Sioux Falls Washington, and Vermillion 4 each.

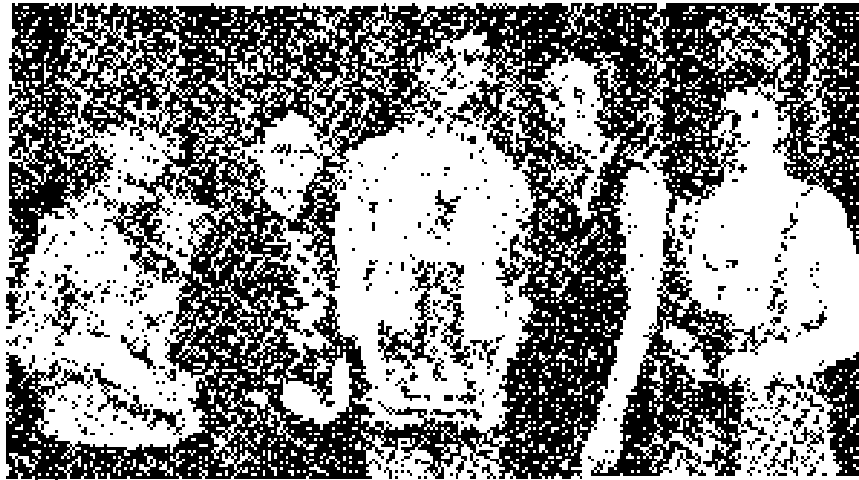

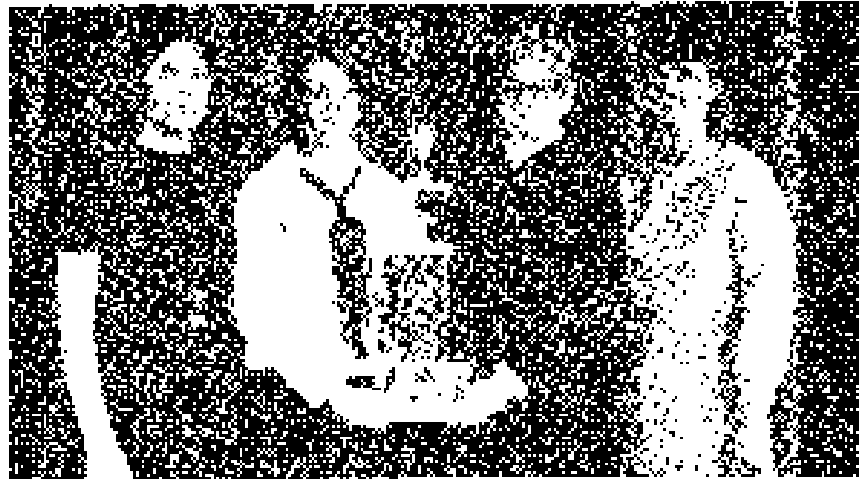

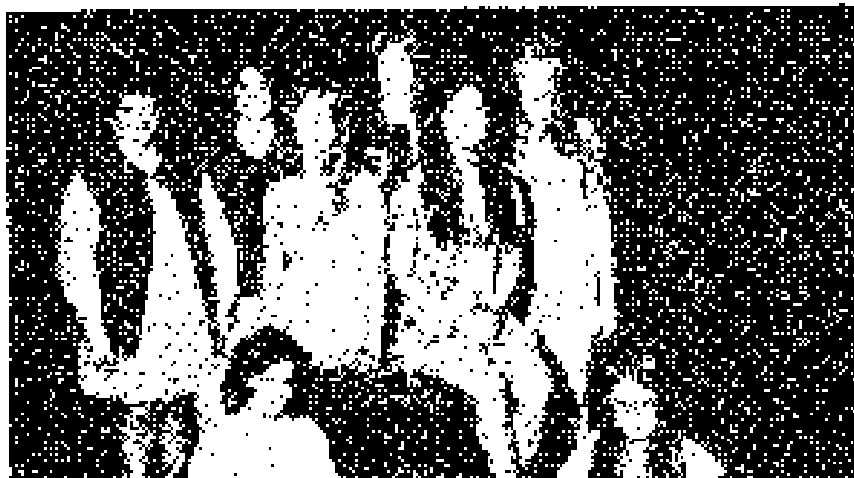

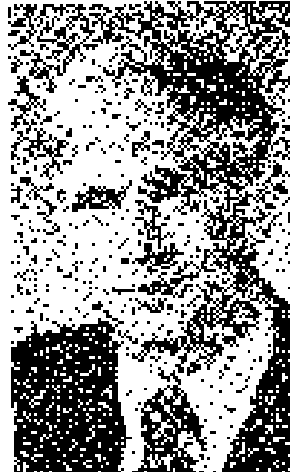
