FOREWORD

This yearbook is published annually after the close of the current school year. Its purpose is to serve as an annual report of the Executive Secretary and to provide a complete review of events sponsored during the year by the Association. All statewide events in which championships are determined are summarized and listed in the order in which they occurred.

A complete file of yearbooks published gives a complete summary of the activities of the Association since it was organized in December 1885. This does not mean that a yearbook has been published each year since 1905. The first one was published in 1927 and contained a summary of events from the beginning of the organization through the school year 1926-27. Additional yearbooks were published in 1934, 1940, 1942, and 1946. Each covered the activities of more than one year. Since 1946 the yearbook has been an annual publication.

1970-1971 SDHSAA EVENTS

ATHLETIC

1970 COACHING SCHOOL

Huron, August 30, 31, 32, 1970

Over 250 coaches attended the 1970 Annual Tuition-Free Coaching School. The talent consisted of high school coaches with outstanding records in their respective fields. John Dan, Lincoln, Wyo, and Jim Gustafson, Albert, LaSalle, Minn., conducted the football sessions. Don King, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and Jim Storey of Cheyenne, Wyo were the basketball instructors. Wrestling was handled by Len Lyrdine of Scottsbluff, Neb. Floyd Farnum, coach of the State "A" Champions and Larry Hutchens, coach of the State "D" Champs, were an added attraction of the program.

For the sixth year, the South Dakota Medical Association provided the island for the training session. Dr. A. J. Janusz of Aberdeen and Dr. H. L. Taylor of Huron arranged to have G. L. "Gordy" Graham, Head Athletic Trainer at Minnesota State, act as instructor. Mr. Graham did such an outstanding job that the coaches have asked to have him on the program again this year.

1970 FOOTBALL RULES MEETINGS

The 1970 meetings were held in Aberdeen, Brookings, Custer, Faith, Huron, Mitchell, Mobridge, Philip, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sturgis, Vermillion, Wagner, Watertown and Winter.

Four hundred sixteen officials, 426 coaches and 219 others interested in football, rules attended the meetings which were conducted by Mr. Evans and Mr. Liljeven. These meetings will be continued in 1971 at the same sites.

1970 BASKETBALL RULES MEETINGS

As for football, the SDHSAA has had meetings on rules for basketball coaches, officials and others interested in the rules, continuously since 1926 with the exception of the World War II years. The 1970 meetings were conducted by Executive Secretary E. W. Evans and Assistant Executive Secretary Clair Liljeven in 15 different locations. Meetings were held at Aberdeen, Tabor, Hot Springs, Huron, Kadoka, Lake Andes, Madison, Mitchell, Mohrville, Pierre, Sioux Falls, Sisseton, Sturgis, Watertown, Winner and Yankton.

At each of the meetings, rule changes, old rules and officiating procedures were discussed. For the first time, Certified Officials were used as instructors. These fellows did a fine job of explaining meanings and answering questions.

For the 1970 meetings, 439 officials, 247 coaches and 108 others, totaling 794 attended the meetings.

1970 WRESTLING RULES MEETINGS

Eight wrestling rules meetings were held prior to the start of the wrestling season. These meetings were held at Aberdeen, Miller, Mohrville, Rapid City, Sioux Falls, Watertown, Winner and Yankton. Clair Liljeven, Assistant Executive Secretary, acted as conductor. Ninety-seven officials, 161 coaches and 131 other interested persons attended.

1971 NATIONAL ALLIANCE FOOTBALL RULES MEETING AND EXECUTIVE OFFICERS MEETING

Anaheim, California—Jan. 2-3, 1971

Executive Secretary E. W. Evans and Assistant Executive Secretary Clair Liljeven were the official delegates from South Dakota to this Annual Meeting. Mr. Evans is an official member of the Alliance Football Rules Committee and a member of the Games Administration Committee. Mr. Liljeven is a member of the Equipment Committee. Both men attended the Rules Meetings and the several sessions of the Executive Officers at this nation-wide meeting.

1971 TRACK CLINIC

Mitchell—March 27, 1971

The Thirteenth Annual Track Clinic was held at the Junior High School in Mitchell on March 27th. The 138 coaches in attendance were impressed with the information presented by Bob Brennan and Bill Perrin, University of Wisconsin Track Coaches. A group of Girls' Track coaches were in attendance for the first time. Future Track Clinics will be held in conjunction with the fall Coaching School.

HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 and from that time until 1912, competition was pretty much limited, on a statewide basis, to track and debate. In 1912, with permission of the SDHSAA, Huron College sponsored a state high school basketball tournament, open to all high schools in the State. This tournament was conducted annually to 1917, when, at the request of the College, the management was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has been under the supervision and management of the Board since that time. The number of teams in the State Tournament varied until 1924 when eight teams qualified. Since 1924 the State Tournaments have been eight team affairs, with exceptions in 1929, 1940 and 1941 when the "A" Tournaments were four team tournaments.

During the 1920's there was agitation for two classes, and in 1928 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. Under this plan the State was divided into 32 districts and the 32 district winners went to eight "A" Regions, and the eight Region winners then qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The 32 District winners qualified for eight "B" Regions, from which the eight winners qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan did not prove popular and was abandoned after the one year trial.

Agitation continued for two classes, and in the fall of 1935 an "A" and "B" plan was developed. Under this plan High Schools with an enrollment of 200 and over were classed as "A" schools and all other schools were "B" schools. Under this set-up the top schools in the F.S.D. Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament, and the teams in the second division of this conference played against the other "A" schools to determine the other qualifiers to the eight team State "A" Tournament. "B" teams with outstanding records were allowed to challenge into the "A" class for the right to enter the State "A" Tournament. The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in March of 1938.

With adjustments from time to time in the "A" set-up, including taking away the right of a "B" school to challenge, and taking away the method of qualifying by being one of the top teams in the F.S.D. Conference, the present plan was adopted for the 1951-1953 season. During the transition from 1938 to 1951, the four largest sections in four geographical areas were classed as "A" schools and 1 each of the four sections, two teams from each section qualified for the State "A" Tournament by a double elimination method.

In 1951 the present plan was started whereby the 32 largest high schools, by enrollment, made up the "A" group and eight "A" sections were set up, and the winners of each of the eight section tournaments qualified for the State "A" Tournament. Also part of the present "A" set-up is that, while enrollments might change, the teams were determined on the two-year basis, rather than having changes annually in each class.

For the 1981 "A" Tournaments a change was made in the method of qualifying teams to the State "A" Tournament. This change, nearly was as follows: The make up of schools in the "A" Sections was left as it had been in recent years, however a double elimination Section Tournament was played with two teams from each section, qualifying for the new "Sub-State" tournaments. Sections 1 and 2 formed Sub-State #1; Sections 3 and 4 formed Sub-State #2; Sections 5 and 6 formed Sub-State #3; and Sections 7 and 8 formed Sub-State #4. This placed four teams in each of the four Sub-State Tournaments and eight double elimination tournaments were played with two teams from each Sub-State tournament qualifying for the State "A" Tournament.

The 1961 plan for "A" tournaments was discarded in 1962 and qualification for places in the State "A" Tournament was done by single elimination tournaments in each of eight (8) "A" Sections. The winner of each "A" Section qualified for the State "A" Tournament. This method has been continued through the 1971 Tournaments.

Since the start of the "A" and "B" classification in 1960 there has been little change in the "B" set-up. We have continued to have 8 "B" Districts and 8 "B" Regions with the eight "B" Region winners qualifying for the State "B" Tournament. Of course there has had to be changes in districts and regions but the basic plan has been kept over the years.

The guest conductor for the 1971 All-State Band was (Clarence) Arnold D. Gabriel. He is the conductor of the United States Air Force Band, Symphony Orchestra and the Singing Sergeants in Washington, D. C. The host for the event was Mitchell High School and Mr. Harold Winkler, director of bands at Mitchell High School, was the general chairman.

One hundred sixty-six musicians from 81 schools earned memberships in the band through auditions conducted at 11 audition centers in the state. Auditions and the All-State event itself were planned and operated through the cooperative efforts of the South Dakota Bandmasters Association and the SDMSAA.

Again this year Rapid City Stevens students earned the most chairs with 24. Then follows Waterman with 10, Arlington 8, Bereaford 8, Clark and Groton, each with 7, Vermillion 6 and Huron, Lead, Mitchell, Rapid City Central, Sisseton and Burdick with 5 from each school. The member schools of the South Dakota High School Activities Association are divided into eight regions for conducting music contests. Actually, these contests are in the nature of a festival in that each individual or group is striving for a rating with no restrictions placed upon the judges as to the number of superior ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

Contests were held by all eight regions again in 1970-71. In six of the regions solo and ensemble contests were completed in February and were followed by large group contests either the first or third weekends of April. Region IV held all its contests during the two-day event the first weekend in April. Region VII held its solo and ensemble contest in early April and its large group contest the first Saturday in May. Regions I, II, and V had separate vocal and instrumental contests in February. Region III had no large group contest.

Starting July 1, 1917, H. M. Walsell was appointed Executive Secretary of the Association, with office space in the Department of Public Instruction in the Merchants Hotel. Because of expansion in the Department of Public Instruction, and a consequent lack of space, it was necessary to move the SDASA office. Plans were made in the El Charles Hotel and the office was moved in January of 1918, where it remained until November 1927. Then it was moved to permanent quarters in the SDASA building at 411 E. Capitol Avenue in Pierre.

With the association changing from an "Athletic Association" to an "Antirival Association," it was necessary to add additional help. Mr. D. W. Evans was named Assistant Executive Secretary July 1, 1922, and additional office space was secured in the SDASA building.

Because of the increased activities of the SDASA, the Board of Control decided to add another man to the staff and Carl Lilovjen, formerly Athletic Director at the Watertown High School, was added to the staff on July 1, 1929. With the addition of Mr. Lilovjen, additional office space was necessary and in June of 1929 the offices were moved to the lower level in the SDASA building.

Ralph Wilstrom, former principal at Redbridge High School, assumed the non-athletic duties previously handled by D. W. Evans. Mr. Evans became Executive Secretary of the Association on July 1, 1931 as H. M. "Bud" Walsell, who so competently directed the affairs of the Association for thirty-three years, retired.
