FOREWORD

This yearbook is published annually after the close of the current school year. Its purpose is to serve as an annual report of the Executive Secretary and to provide a complete review of events sponsored during the year by the Association. ATHLETIC

23rd ANNUAL COACHING SCHOOL

Huron, August 5, 6, 7, 1974

Three hundred seventy-five coaches registered at the twenty-third Annual Coaching School. For the first time, sessions were added for the coaches of Girls' Sports. Forty women coaches took advantage of the clinic instruction. We were fortunate to secure outstanding instructors for both the boys' and girls' programs. Dolores Paulson, head gymnastics coach at Jamestown High School, Jamestown, N. D., was the gymnastics clinician. Coleen Horschman, girls' track coach at Alameda High School, Alameda, Colo. handled the women's portion of the track sessions. Coaches of boys' sports were instructed by George Wemeier, head football coach at Washburn High School, Minneapolis, Minn.; Gordon Fosness, basketball coach at Dakota Wesleyan University, Mitchell, S. D.; Chuck Patten, wrestling coach at the University of Northern Iowa; Jay Dirksen, track coach at South Dakota State University and Jim Emerich, well known coach and trainer.

All clinicians did outstanding jobs in presenting their materials and in helping coaches with their problems. We owe our special thanks to the South Dakota Chapter of the American College of Surgeons, especially Dr. A. J. Janusz and Dr. H. L. Saylor for arranging the training portion of our program.

HISTORY OF BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 and from that time until 1912, competition was pretty much limited, on a statewide basis, to track and debate. In 1912, with permission of the SDHSAA, Huron College sponsored a state high school basketball tournament, open to all high schools in the State. This tournament was continued annually to 1917, when, at the request of the College, the management was taken over by the Board of Control of the SDHSAA and has been under the supervision and management of the Board since that time. The number of teams in the State Tournament varied until 1924 when eight teams qualified. Since 1924 the State Tournaments have been eight team affairs, with exceptions in 1939, 1940 and 1941 when the "A" Tournaments were four team tournaments.

During the 1920's there was agitation for two classes, and in 1930 an "A" and "B" plan was tried. Under this plan the State was divided into 32 districts and the 32 district winners went to eight "A" Regions, and the eight Region winners then qualified for the State "A" Tournament. The 32 District runners-up qualified for eight "B" Regions, from which the eight winners qualified for the State "B" Tournament. This plan did not prove popular and was abandoned after the one year trial.

Agitation continued for two classes, and in the fall of 1935 an "A" and "B" plan was developed. Under this plan High Schools with an enrollment of 300 and over were classed as "A" schools and all other schools were "B" schools. Under this set-up the top schools in the E.S.D. Conference qualified for the "A" Tournament, and the teams in the second division of this Conference played against the other "A" schools to determine the other qualifiers in the eight team State "A" Tournament. "B" teams with outstanding records were allowed to challenge into the "A" class for the right to enter the State "A" Tournament. The first "A" and "B" Tournaments were held in March of 1936.

With adjustments from time to time in the "A" set-up, including, taking away the right of a "B" school to challenge, and taking away the method of qualifying by being one of the top teams in the E.S.D. Conference, the present plan was adopted for the 1951-1952 season. During the transition from 1936 to 1951, the four largest schools in four geographical areas were classed as "A" schools and in each of the four sections, two teams from each section qualified for the State "A" Tournament by a double elimination method.

In 1951 the present plan was started whereby the 32 largest high schools, by enrollments, made up the "A" group and eight "A" sections were set up, and the winner of each of the eight section tournaments qualified for the State "A" Tournament. Also part of the present "A" set-up is that, while enrollments might change, the teams were determined on the two-year basis, rather than having changes annually in each class.

For the 1961 "A" Tournaments a change was made in the method of qualifying teams to the State "A" Tournament. This change, briefly was as follows: The make up of schools in the "A" Sections was left as it had been in recent years, however a double elimination Section Tournament was played with two teams from each section qualifying for the new "Sub-State" tournaments. Sections 1 and 2 formed Sub-State #1; Sections 3 and 4 formed Sub-State #2; Sections 5 and 6 formed Sub-State #3; and Sections 7 and 8 formed Sub-State #4. This placed four teams in each of the four Sub-State Tournaments and again double elimination tournaments were played with two teams from each Sub-State tournament qualifying for the State "A" Tournament.

The 1961 plan for "A" tournaments was discarded in 1962 and qualification for places in the State "A" Tournament was done by single elimination tournaments in each of eight (8) "A" Sections. The winner of each "A" Section qualified for the State "A" Tournament. This method has been continued through the 1971 Tournaments.

Since the start of the "A" and "B" classification in 1936 there has been little change in the "B" set-up. We have continued to have 32 "B" Districts and 8 "B" Regions with the eight "B" Region winners qualifying for the State "B" Tournament. Of course there has had to be changes in districts and regions but the basic plan has been kept over the years.

MUSIC

ALL-STATE CHORUS AND ORCHESTRA

Stevens High School Gymnasium was the site for the All-State Chorus and Orchestra held in Rapid City on November 1-2, 1974. The statistics for the event as follows:

Guest conductor for the chorus was Dr. Leonard Van Camp. He has been Director of Choral Activities at Edwardsville Campus since he joined the Department of Music in 1963. Dr. Van Camp has directed church choirs, community choruses and industrial choirs as well as junior high school, high school and college groups. He is well known as a festival conductor, choral clinician and adjudicator.

Guest conductor for the orchestra was A. Clyde Roller. He was the former Resident Conductor of the Houston Symphony Orchestra and is Conductor and Professor of Music at the University of Houston. He is also Musical Director and Conductor of the Lansing Symphony in Michigan.

Competition on the local level determines which students will attend the chorus. Each school may send one or more quartets based on the enrollment of the school. The orchestra members were selected by auditions which included performance and a written test.

The South Dakota Music Educators' Association cooperated with the SDHSAA in planning and operating this All-State event.

ALL-STATE BAND

The 1975 All-State Band was held in Pierre at the Riggs High School Auditorium on March 20-21-22, 1975. The members of the Band held their first rehearsal on the evening of the 20th. This allows the band members to get ready for a full two days of rehearsal the next two days. The Grand Concert was held on Saturday night.

The 25th All-State Band was under the direction of W. Francis McBeth. Mr. McBeth is Professor of Music, Resident Composer and Chairman of the Theory-Composition Department of the Ouachita University in Arkadelphia, Arkansas. Mr. McBeth is also the composer of the commissioned number that was played by this year's Band. The South Dakota Bandmasters Association received a grant from the South Dakota Bicentennial Commission for the commissioned number. The composition that made its debut at the Concert reflects the spirit of South Dakota. It is being presented as a part of the Bicentennial activities in South Dakota.

Schools represented in this year's Band are: Rapid City Stevens with fifteen students, followed by Huron with nine, Yankton has eight, Watertown and Aberdeen Central each have seven. Four schools, Beresford, Brookings, Freeman and Madison each have five students in the Band. Arlington, Milbank, Sioux Falls Washington and Webster follow with four students in the Band. Schools with three or fewer students in the Band are: Armour, Bridgewater, Bristol, Canton, Centerville, Chamberlain, Chester, Clark, Corsica, Cresbard, Dell Rapids Public, Elk Point, Eureka, Faulkton, Flandreau, Gettysburg, Gregory, Groton, Hayti, Hecla,

In the 1975 All-State Band there are 87 seniors, 53 juniors, 24 sophomores and 3 freshmen.

The All-State Band had one student who received a gold medal for being a member of the Band for the past four years. She was Renee Swanhorst from Cresbard High School.

REGION MUSIC CONTESTS

The member schools of the SDHSAA are divided into eight regions for conducting music contests. Actually these contests are in the nature of a festival, as each individual or group is striving for a rating with no restrictions placed upon the judges as to the number of superior ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

All eight regions held contests in 1974-75. In seven of the regions solo and ensemble contests were held in February. In Regions III, V, there were no large group contests. Region IV held both the solo and ensemble contest and large group contest on the same weekend in April.

SPEECH PROGRAMS FOR 1974-75

ORAL INTERPRETATION

The Speech program with the largest participation is the Oral Interpretation program. The schools are divided into Class "A" and Class "B" with the Class "B" students starting competition at the district level. District winners meet the class "A" contestants at the division level and the divisional winners all move to the State Contest. Statistics continue to show that the students from the Class "B" schools hold their own with those from the Class "A" schools in both the division and state Oral Interpretation contests.
