26th ANNUAL COACHING SCHOOL

Rapid City, August 8, 9, 10

The twenty-sixth Annual Coaching School exceeded all previous clinics with approximately 339 coaches and school officials in attendance from 102 High Schools and Colleges of South Dakota. A very informative clinic was presented by seven (7) outstanding people. They were: Sid Cichy, a very successful football coach at Fargo Shanley in Fargo, North Dakota and recent retiree from coaching; Al Bauman, basketball coach at Little Falls, Minnesota; Mary Ann Mahoney, gymnastics coach at Westminster High in Colorado; Dave Griffith, track coach at Burnsville High in Minnesota and ex-South Dakota coach of track at Bristol; Judi Hood, volleyball coach at Mount Marty College; Dale Bahr, Assistant wrestling coach at Iowa State; and the sessions for athletic training and care of injuries were conducted by Kathie Courtney, athletic trainer at Dakota State College.

WHAT IS THE ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION?

Purpose

The purpose of the South Dakota High School Activities Association is to direct and coordinate interscholastic activities carried on by the member high schools of South Dakota.

It shall have the duty and obligation to control, coordinate, and direct the operation of the interscholastic activity programs of its member schools. Among these programs shall be those in athletics, speech, music, student council, publications, and such like or related programs of activities as now or hereafter may be organized among member schools.

It shall also attempt to equalize activity opportunity by standardizing qualifications for participants, coaching and directing procedures, and treatment of visiting teams and participants in connection with activities.

SDHSAA Contribution to Athletics

In the good old days, anybody could play on the high school team, even the coach, principal, or a college athlete on vacation. Age, school status, reason for being in the district, and related factors were nobody's business. When game brawls and community feuds made conditions bad enough, school administrators awoke to the need for organized action. Since that time, not only in South Dakota but throughout the nation, state athletic and activities associations have proved their worth. Every student in every high school in the state is now assured that he competes under standards that are the same as those that exist in every other high school that voluntarily agrees to be a member of SDHSAA.

The SDHSAA has not been developed or dominated by any outside individual or group. Rather it has been created and is being expanded by school people because earlier unfavorable experiences have proved it necessary for the welfare of the school program. The amateur spirit cannot survive pressures which develop when controls are not provided.

History

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 for the purpose of managing and fostering high school athletics on a high plane. At that time a Board of Control of three members was chosen to administer the affairs of the Association. They were G. E. Miller, Superintendent of Hurley High School; R. L. Kirk, Superintendent, Aberdeen High School; and A. A. McDonald, Superintendent, Sioux Falls High School.

Initial concerns were primarily in track and field. During the ensuing years it became evident that the SDHSAA should assume the initiative for a well-balanced athletic program to meet the needs of all schools and all students desiring to participate in athletics.

In 1922 the Association became a member of the National Federation of State Athletic Associations which now includes all state associations and several Canadian provinces.

Down through the years each non-athletic school activity formed its own organization. In 1961, largely through the efforts of the South Dakota High School Principals' Association, the member schools voted to become an Activities Association. This step merged all of these organizations into one association which is the present South Dakota High School Activities Association.

Organization

All memberships are voluntary. Any high school in the state, whether public,

private, parochial, or institutional, if accredited by the South Dakota Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, may become a member of the Association by making formal application that is authorized by its Board of Education and by subscribing to the rules and bylaws of the Association. Membership once attained is continuous, provided requirements are met and annual dues paid.

The legislative body of the Association consists of the entire membership, which meets once each year. Each member school has one vote whether the voting is done at the annual meeting or by mail ballot.

The executive body is the Board of Control, which is made up of seven members, six of whom are high school principals or superintendents. The seventh member is a school board member elected by the Associated School Boards of South Dakota. The Board of Control meets at least four times each year and is charged with interpreting the Constitution and By-Laws, organizing and directing tournaments and meets, determining penalties and forfeitures for violations of rules, settling disputes, registering sports officials, establishing the state office, and employing an executive secretary and staff to administer the Association.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS

The South Dakota High School Activities Association has established a Distinguished Service Award to recognize South Dakotans who have given outstanding service to the youth of the state through various high school activities programs. Candidates for the award are nominated by the schools with the final selection being made by the Board of Control. These awards fall into three categories: Service Through the News Media, Service Through School Programs, and Service Through Community Support. Awards for 1978 are as follows:

Service Through the News Media: Hod Nielsen, KYNT Yankton Radio Sports Announcer, and for more than three decades a friend and benefactor of South Dakota Teachers, Students, and Administrators.

Service Through School Programs: Dave Evans, Pierre, life-long school man as teacher, coach, superintendent, and fifteen years in the SDHSAA office; Ken Greeno, Redfield, taught and coached athletics for 45 years in public school systems of South Dakota; Carold Heier, deceased, outstanding teacher, coach, and administrator before his untimely death in 1977; Paul Marschalk, Pierre, successful teacher and coach for over 30 years and a strong supporter of high school activities after his retirement; Bob Ormseth, Colton, retired principal who has been very active in the track programs of South Dakota for 25 years; Buell Woodle, Sturgis, thirty-five years in one school system as coach, teacher, and administrator.

Service Through Community Support: Dr. B. T. Otey, Flandreau, over 20 years of giving physical exams to the athletes from Flandreau and the surrounding communities.

FOUNDER'S AWARD

Mavis Haverly, newspaper adviser at Britton High School was the recipient of the 1977 Founder's Award.

Mrs. Haverly has taught in Britton for 27 years and has advised the school newspaper for 21 of those years and the yearbook for 5 years. During that time, her journalism students have produced excellent publications and have earned top ratings in the annual South Dakota High School Publications contest.

During her years as adviser of school publications, Mrs. Haverly has attended

workshops for advisers and has served as president of Supervisors of School Publications (1975 - 76). She was named this year to the Journalism Advisory Committee of the South Dakota High School Activities Association for a five-year term.

A graduate of Jamestown College, Jamestown, North Dakota, Mrs. Haverly has also attended Northern State College, Aberdeen and has taken graduate work in Colorado. She teaches business subjects at Britton High School.

MUSIC

ALL-STATE CHORUS AND ORCHESTRA

The 1977 All-State Chorus and Orchestra was held at the Arena in Sioux Falls on Friday and Saturday, November 4-5, 1977. The statistics for the music event are as follows:

The Orchestra director for the All-State Orchestra was Dr. Marvin J. Rabin. Dr. Rabin is the director of the Wisconsin String Development Program for the University of Wisconsin Extension and School of Music. He is the founding conductor of the Wisconsin Youth Symphony Orchestra. Dr. Rabin has directed the South Dakota All-State Orchestra on two other occasions. His last appearance was in 1970.

Guest conductor for the Chorus was Dr. B. R. Henson, Professor of Music and Director of Choral Activities at the University of Oklahoma. He has been guest lecturer at leading music schools and guest conductor of major symphony orchestra and choral festivals in thirty-three states.

Competition on the local level determines which students will attend the Chorus. Each school may send one or more quartets based on the enrollment of the school. The Orchestra members were selected by auditions which included performance and a written test.

The South Dakota Music Educators' Association cooperated with the SDHSAA in planning and operating this All-State event.

ALL-STATE BAND

The twenty-eighth All-State Band had a membership of 167 when they assembled in Watertown on March 30-31, April 1, 1978. This year some 1190 students registered at the audition centers to be auditioned for the Band. The final membership represented fifty-five schools. The band students spent the two and one-half days in rehearsal for the Grand Concert on Saturday, April 1st.

The guest conductor for this year's All-State Band was Mr. Miies Johnson, Director of the St. Olaf College Band, St. Olaf College, Northfield, Minnesota. Mr. Johnson is active in the College Band Directors National Association and is currently serving as national chairman of the Conductors' Symposium. He last appeared in South Dakota in 1970.

Schools represented in the 1978 All-State Band were: Rapid City Stevens with twenty-one students; followed by Huron with thirteen; Vermillion with 10; Webster with 8; and Arlington with seven. Sioux Falls Washington, Sully Buttes, Watertown, and Yankton each had five students in the band; Aberdeen Central,

Beresford, Mitchell, Redfield, and Wessington Springs had four each. There were ten schools with three students in the Band — Brookings, Canton, Chamberlain, Deubrook (White), Freeman, Hitchcock, Hoven, Madison, Milbank, and Sioux Falls Lincoln. Seven schools had two students in the Band — Clark, Flandreau, Highmore, Mellette Northwestern, Rapid City Central, Sturgis, and Winner. The twenty-four schools that had one student in the Band are: Andes Central (Lake Andes), Armour, Bristol, Bridgewater, Britton, Carthage, Castlewood, Chester, Cresbard, Dupree, Faith, Gettysburg, Faulkton, Gregory, Groton, Harrisburg, Ipswich, Miller, Philip, Scotland, Selby, Warner, White Lake and Wolsey.

Looking at the members of the Band by classes, there were 80 seniors, 61 juniors, 20 sophomores, and 6 freshmen in the Band.

REGION MUSIC CONTESTS

The SDHSAA schools are divided into eight regions, with each region conducting music contests. Actually, these contests are in the nature of a festival, as each individual or group is striving for a rating with no restrictions upon the judges as to the number of superior ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

All eight regions held contests in 1977-78. In seven regions solo and ensemble contests were held in February. In regions III, V and VII there were no large group contests. Region IV held both the solo and ensemble contests and large group contest on the same weekend.

SPEECH PROGRAMS FOR 1977-78

ORAL INTERPRETATION

The speech program with the largest number of students participating is the oral interpretation. New sections were added again to the program so that there are six sections for the students to choose from. The schools are divided into two classes. The Class "B" schools have their contestants start at a district contest. The winners from the district contests move to the divisional contests. At this contest the Class "A" schools have their students enter the competition. The winners from the division level contests go to the State Festival. Statistics continue to show that the students from the Class "B" schools hold their own with those from the Class "A" schools in both the division and at the State Festival.

DEBATE

The championships in both Class "A" and Class "B" at the State Debate Tournament were won by first-time winners. Sioux Falls Lincoln's two-man team composed of Scott Anderson and Tod Edell, won the first state championship for their school. Carl Swanson, Lincoln's coach, has now achieved the distinction of being the most recent coach in the state to have teams that won the Class "B" State Championship, the District N.F.L. Championship, and the Class "A" State Championship.

The Class "B" champions, Tyndall-Tabor High School, have a long history of debate teams that have been at the state tournament. This is the first state championship Tyndall-Tabor has won however since the Class "A" - Class "B" divisions were set up in 1953. Tyndall-Tabor's two-man team of Tim Kniffen and Merlin VanGerpen were coached by Scott Shephard. Both the Lincoln and Tyndall-Tabor teams went through the six rounds of debate without a loss.

The runner-up trophy went to Sisseton High School in the Class "A". The team was composed of Peggy Kempton and Karen Thevdt. Mrs. Mary Bares is the Sisseton High School Debate Coach. In Class "B" the runner-up trophy went to a two-man team from Highmore. Team members are Dayton Sloat and Philip Sloat. The Highmore team was coached by Doug Tschetter.

In Class "A" the two third place teams were teams from Sioux Falls Washington and Rapid City Stevens. In Class "B" the two third-place teams were teams from Groton and Clear Lake.
