This yearbook is published annually after the close of the current school year. Its purpose is to serve as an annual report of the Executive Secretary and to provide a complete review of events sponsored during the year by the Association. All statewide events in which championships are determined are summarized and listed in the order in which they occurred.

A complete file of yearbooks published gives a complete summary of the activities of the Association since it was organized in December 1905. This does not mean that a yearbook has been published each year since 1905. The first one was published in 1927 and contained a summary of events from the beginning of the organization through the school year 1926-27. Additional yearbooks were published in 1934, 1940, 1942 and 1946. Each covered the activities of more than one year. Since 1946 the yearbook has been an annual publication.

REVIEW OF SDHSAA EVENTS FOR 1978-79

This volume of the YEARBOOK contains complete summaries of the statewide events and business of the SDHSAA for the school year of 1978-79. The annual audit of the Association's finances is not included because of the time of the year, but the audit is published each year in the Annual Meeting Bulletin which will be issued in mid-September.

On the next few pages you will find mention of these events, with complete summaries in the proper order later in the book.

The past year was the sixteenth that the Association has been operated as an "Activities Association" and therefore the events mentioned and summarized are for all activities, not only athletics. The boys' athletic summaries are in the first section of the YEARBOOK, the girls' athletic summaries are in the second section, and the section on the other activities in the third section of the book.

WHAT IS THE ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION?

Purpose

The purpose of the South Dakota High School Activities Association is to direct and coordinate interscholastic activities carried on by the member high schools of South Dakota.

It shall have the duty and obligation to control, coordinate, and direct the operation of the interscholastic activity programs of its member schools. Among these programs shall be those in athletics, speech, music, student council, publications, and such like or related programs of activities as now or hereafter may be organized among member schools.

It shall also attempt to equalize activity opportunity by standardizing qualifications for participants, coaching and directing procedures, and treatment of visiting teams and participants in connection with activities.

SDHSAA Contribution to Athletics

In the good old days, anybody could play on the high school team, even the coach, principal, or a college athlete on vacation. Age, school status, reason for being in the district, and related factors were nobody's business. When game brawls and community fueds made conditions bad enough, school administrators awoke to the need for organized action. Since that time, not only in South Dakota but throughout the nation, state athletic and activities associations have proved their worth. Every student in every high school in the state is now assured that he competes under standards that are the same as those that exist in every other high school that voluntarily agrees to be a member of SDHSAA.

The SDHSAA has not been developed or dominated by any outside individual or group. Rather it has been created and is being expanded by school people because earlier unfavorable experiences have proved it necessary for the welfare of the school program. The amateur spirit cannot survive pressures which develop when controls are not provided.

History

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 for the purpose of managing and fostering high school athletics on a high plane. At that time a Board of Control of three members was chosen to administer the affairs of the Association. They were G. E. Miller, Superintendent of Hurley High School; R. L. Kirk, Superintendent,

Aberdeen High School; and A. A. McDonald, Superintendent, Sioux Falls High School.

Initial concerns were primarily in track and field. During the ensuing years it became evident that the SDHSAA should assume the initiative for a well-balanced athletic program to meet the needs of all schools and all students desiring to participate in athletics.

In 1923 the Association became a member of the National Federation of State Athletic Associations which now includes all state associations and several Canadian provinces.

Down through the years each non-athletic school activity formed its own organization. In 1961, largely through the efforts of the South Dakota High School Principals' Association, the member schools voted to become an Activities Association. This step merged all of these organizations into one association which is the present South Dakota High School Activities Association.

Organization

All memberships are voluntary. Any high school in the state, whether public, private, parochial, or institutional, if accredited by the South Dakota Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, may become a member of the Association by making formal application that is authorized by its Board of Education and by subscribing to the rules and by-laws of the Association. Membership once attained is continuous, provided the local school board enacts the annual resolution authorizing membership, the annual dues paid, and all other requirements are met.

The legislative body of the Association consists of the entire membership, which meets once each year. Each member school has one vote whether the voting is done at the annual meeting or by mail ballot.

The executive body is the Board of Control, which is made up of seven members. Five of these shall be superintendents or principals of member schools and two shall be Board of Education members of member schools. The Board of Control meets at least four times each year and is charged with interpreting the Constitution and By-Laws, organizing and directing tournaments and meets, determining penalties and forfeitures for violations of rules, settling disputes, registering sports officials, establishing the state office, and employing an executive secretary and staff to administer the Association.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS

The South Dakota High School Activities Association established a Distinguished Service Award program in 1976 with the first awards being presented at the State Basketball Tournaments in 1977. Purpose of the program is to recognize outstanding service to the youth of the state through various high school activities programs. Candidates for the award are nominated by the schools with the final selection being made by the Board of Control. The awards fall into three categories: Service Through the News Media, Service Through School Programs, and Service Through Community Support.

27th ANNUAL COACHING SCHOOL

Sioux Falls, August 7, 8, 9

The twenty-seventh Annual Coaching Clinic attendance was comparable to past clinics with approximately 345 coaches and other school officials present from 100 High Schools and Colleges of South Dakota. An outstanding clinic was conducted by six (6) High School coaches from the state of Kansas. They were: Glenn Percy, head football coach at Shawnee Mission East High in Shawnee Mission; Fred McCracken, head boy's gymnastics coach at Shawnee Mission West High in Shawnee Mission; Joan Lundstrom, volleyball coach at Lawrence High School in Lawrence; Bob Mannebach, basketball coach at Sacred Heart High School in Salina; Ken Koover, wrestling coach at Topeka High in Topeka; and Don Kornhaus, head track coach at Ottawa High of Ottawa, Kansas. An added feature to this years clinic was having Bernie Saggau, Executive Secretary of the Iowa High School Athletic Association, speak to a General Session on the first night of the school.



MUSIC

ALL-STATE CHORUS AND ORCHESTRA

The All-State Chrous and Orchestra for 1978 was held at the Rushmore Plaza Civic Center in Rapid City on Friday and Saturday, November 3-4, 1978. The statistics for the music event are as follows:

Guest conductor for the Chorus was Mr. Bruce G. Lunkley. He is the chairman of Music and Professor of Music at Austin College, Sherman, Texas. Since 1970 he has been a visiting clinician, recitalist and summer graduate instructor at Black Hills State College, Spearfish, South Dakota.

The 1978 Orchestra was under the direction of Dr. William L. Jones. He is Music Director and Administrator of the Greater Twin Cities' Youth Symphonies, Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Competition on the local level determines which students will attend the Chorus. Each school may send one or more quartets based on the enrollment of the school. The Orchestra members were selected by auditions which included performance and a written test.

The South Dakota Music Educators' Association cooperated with the SDHSAA in planning and operating this All-State event.

ALL-STATE BAND

All-State Band had a membership from 52 high schools this year in Sturgis. When the twenty-ninth annual All-State Band started to rehearse in Sturgis there were 167 of the best high school musicians in the state under the direction of Dr. Francis McBeth. These band members were among the 1292 students that registered at the audition centers. This was an increase of more than 100 students over last year that auditioned. The final membership of the band represents fifty-two high schools. The All-State Band spent two and one-half days in rehearsal for the Grand Concert on Saturday evening, March 24th.

The guest conductor, Dr. Francis McBeth, is Professor of Music, Resident Composer and Chairman of the Theory-Composition Department at Ouachita University in Arkadelphia, Arkansas. He was conductor of the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra in Little Rock for many years until his retirement in 1973, whereupon he was elected Conductor Emeritus in honor of his work with this professional orchestra. Dr. McBeth composed and conducted the commissioned number for the twenty-fifth All-State Band that was in Pierre in 1975.

Schools represented in the 1979 All-State Band were: Rapid City Stevens with twenty students; followed by Vermillion with ten, Huron, Arlington and Water-

town with 0; Canton and Aberdeen Central with 7 and Webster with 6. The next four schools each had five students in the band—Rapid City Central, Sioux Falls Lincoln, Yankton and Sioux Falls Washington. Groton, Clark and Wessington Springs each had four members in the band. There were eight schools with three students in the band—Hoven, Milbank, Redfield, Sully Buttes (Onida), Freeman, Mitchell, Brookings and Scotland. With two students in the Band, there were eight schools—Gregory, Leola, Elk Point, Highmore, Hitchcock, Chamberlain, Kimball and Britton. The twenty-one schools that had one student in the band were: Beresford, Lennox, Faith, Carthage, Lead, Marion, Dupree, Baltic, Hudson, Madison, Sturgis, Flandreau, Menno, Sioux Falls O'Gorman, Harrisburg, Hurley, Pierre, Spearfish, Armour, Bristol and Mellette.

Looking at the members of the band by classes, there were 102 seniors, 42 juniors, 21 sophomores and 2 freshmen in the twenty-ninth All-State Band.

REGION MUSIC CONTESTS

The SDHSAA schools are divided into eight regions, with each region conducting music contests. Actually these contests are in the nature of a festival, as each individual or group is striving for a rating with no restrictions upon the judges as to the number of superiors ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

All eight regions held contests in 1978-79. In seven regions solo and ensemble contests were held in February. In regions III, V and VII there were no large group contests. Region IV held both the solo and ensemble contests and large group contest on the same weekend.

SPEECH PROGRAMS FOR 1978-79

ORAL INTERPRETATION

The speech program with the largest number of students participating is the oral interpretation program. New sections were added to the program so that the students have six sections to choose from. The schools are divided into two classes. The Class "B" schools have their contestants start at a district contest. The winners from the district contests move to the divisional contests. At this contest the Class "A" schools have their students enter the competition. The winners from the division level contests go to the State Festival. Statistics continue to show that the students from the Class "B" schools hold their own with the students from the Class "A" schools in both the division and at the State Festival.

The D. C. Reutter Awards were initiated by the Reutter family in cooperation with the South Dakota Speech Communication Association. The Awards were established in memory of the late D. C. Candidates for the awards are selected on the basis of integrity of ideas, thoroughness of research, ability to communicate ideas in debating, good character and sportsmanship. Each recipient is awarded a medal as a token for his outstanding achievements.

Two ballots by the high school debaters and coaches determined the award winners. The first ballot serves as a nominating ballot. The second ballot results determine the winners.
