FOREWORD

This yearbook is published annually after the close of the current school year. Its purpose is to serve as an annual report of the Executive Secretary and to provide a complete review of events sponsored during the year by the Association. All statewide events in which championships are determined are summarized and listed in the order in which they occurred.

A complete file of yearbooks published gives a complete summary of the activities of the Association since it was organized in December 1905. This does not mean that a yearbook has been published each year since 1905. The first one was published in 1927 and contained a summary of events from the beginning of the organization through the school year 1926-27. Additional yearbooks were published in 1934, 1940, 1942 and 1946. Each covered the activities of more than one year. Since 1946 the yearbook has been an annual publication.

REVIEW OF SDHSAA EVENTS FOR 1980-81

This volume of the YEARBOOK contains complete summaries of the statewide events and business of the SDHSAA for the school year of 1980-81. The annual audit of the Association's finances is not included because of the time of the year, but the audit is published each year in the Annual Meeting Bulletin which will be issued in mid-September.

On the next few pages you will find mention of these events, with complete summaries in the proper order later in the book.

WHAT IS THE ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION?

Purpose

The purpose of the South Dakota High School Activities Association is to direct and coordinate interscholastic activities carried on by the member high schools of South Dakota.

It shall have the duty and obligation to control, coordinate, and direct the operation of the interscholastic activity programs of its member schools. Among these programs shall be those in athletics, speech, music, student council, publications, and such like or related programs of activities as now or hereafter may be organized among member schools.

It shall also attempt to equalize activity opportunity by standardizing qualifications for participants, coaching and directing procedures, and treatment of visiting teams and participants in connection with activities.

SDHSAA Contribution to Athletics

In the good old days, anybody could play on the high school team, even the coach, principal, or a college athlete on vacation. Age, school status, reason for being in the district, and related factors were nobody's business. When game brawls and community feuds made conditions bad enough, school administrators awoke to the need for organized action. Since that time, not only in South Dakota but throughout the nation, state athletic and activities associations have proved their worth. Every student in every high school in the state is now assured that he competes under standards that are the same as those that exist in every other high school that voluntarily agrees to be a member of SDHSAA.

The SDHSAA has not been developed or dominated by any outside individual or group. Rather it has been created and is being expanded by school people because earlier unfavorable experiences have proved it necessary for the welfare of the school program. The amateur spirit cannot survive pressures which develop when controls are not provided.

History

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 for the purpose of managing and fostering high school athletics on a high plane. At that time a Board of Control of three members was chosen to administer the affairs of the Association. They were G. E. Miller, Superintendent of Hurley High School; R. L. Kirk, Superintendent, Aberdeen High School; and A. A. McDonald, Superintendent, Sioux Falls High School.

Initial concerns were primarily in track and field. During the ensuing years it became evident that the SDHSAA should assume the initiative for a well-

balanced athletic program to meet the needs of all schools and all students desiring to participate in athletics.

In 1923 the Association became a member of the National Federation of State Athletic Associations which now includes all state associations and several Canadian provinces.

Down through the years each non-athletic school activity formed its own organization. In 1961, largely through the efforts of the South Dakota High School Principals' Association, the member schools voted to become an Activities Association. This step merged all of these organizations into one association which is the present South Dakota High School Activities Association.

Organization

All memberships are voluntary. Any high school in the state, whether public, private, parochial, or institutional, if accredited by the South Dakota Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, may become a member of the Association by making formal application that is authorized by its Board of Education and by subscribing to the rules and by-laws of the Association. Membership once attained is continuous, provided the local school board enacts the annual resolution authorizing membership, the annual dues paid, and all other requirements are met.

The legislative body of the Association consists of the entire membership, which meets once each year. Each member school has one vote whether the voting is done at the annual meeting or by mail ballot.

The executive body is the Board of Control, which is made up of seven members. Five of these shall be superintendents or principals of member schools and two shall be Board of Education members of member schools. The Board of Control meets at least four times each year and is charged with interpreting the Constitution and By-Laws, organizing and directing tournaments and meets, determining penalties and forfeitures for violations of rules, settling disputes, registering sports officials, establishing the state office, and employing an executive secretary and staff to administer the Association.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS

The South Dakota High School Activities Association established a Distinguished Service Award program in 1976 with the first awards being presented at the State Basketball Tournaments in 1977. Purpose of the program is to recognize outstanding service to the youth of the state through various high school activities programs. Candidates for the award are nominated by the schools with the final selection being made by the Board of Control. The awards fall into three categories: Service Through the News Media, Service Through School Programs, and Service Through Community Support.

MILESTONES IN HISTORY OF SOUTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

- 1905 - School administrators organize South Dakota High School Athletic Association for purpose of sponsoring, coordinating and supervising interschool athletic competition.
- 1906 - State Track Meet, won by Sioux Falls, is first athletic event sponsored by the new Association.
- 1908 - Arrangements made for Black Hills schools to affiliate with Association. Membership totals 23.
- 1910 - Declamation contest held in conjunction with State Track Meet discontinued and placed in hands of separate committee.
- 1912 - Invitational basketball tournament at Huron College approved by Association as State Tournament. In finals, Redfield defeated Lake Preston 33-25.
- 1915 - Sioux Falls wins first State Debate Championship.
- 1917 - First Official State Basketball Tournament sponsored by Association. In finals, Huron defeated Aberdeen 23-22. Twenty-nine teams participated.
- 1918 - Membership totals 55 schools.
- 1920 - Hammer throw eliminated as a State Track Meet event.
- 1922 - South Dakota High School Journalism Association is founded.
- 1923 - Joined the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations. Charter members include Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, and Wisconsin. South Dakota is among the next group of four to join.
- 1927 - The Speech Association establishes state extemp contests.
- 1928 - Membership in Association is 268 schools.
First State Tennis and Golf Tournaments held at Brookings.
- 1930 - Mitchell wins first Class "B" basketball championship. District runners-up competed in this event while district champions went on to the Class "A" state meet. Plan discontinued after one year.
- 1935 - The Speech Association establishes state original oratory contests.
- 1936 - Schools split into Class "A" and Class "B" for basketball. Down to the present time, a champion has been determined in each class. The number of schools competing and the system of elimination used in Class "A" has varied from time to time. The Class "B" plan has remained constant since 1936.
- 1937 - Membership totals 315 schools.
Association hires first full-time executive secretary—R. M. Walseth.
- 1946 - Two classes established for state track competition. First State Cross Country Run held. Fifty-one boys from 12 schools competed.
- 1947 - Membership in Association is 284.
- 1951 - First All-State Band held in Sioux Falls.
- 1953 - State Speech Association establishes two classes of competition in forensics.
- 1958 - First Invitational State Wrestling Tournament approved by Association. Membership in Association is 264.
- 1960 - First Official State Wrestling Tournament is held. Won by Spearfish.
- 1961 - The Association becomes an Activities Association embracing speech, music, student council, and journalism, as well as athletics.
- 1962 - Dave Evans is hired as an Assistant Executive Secretary. The Association now has two full-time professional staff members.
- 1965 - Board of Control enlarged to include school board member.

- 1966 - Parochial and private schools become eligible for Association membership.
- 1967 - Three classes created for state cross country competition.
- 1968 - Membership in Association is 229.
- 1969 - Clar Lilevjen is hired as an Assistant Executive Secretary, bringing the professional staff to three persons.
First Girls' State Track, Golf, and Tennis Meets held by Association.
Three classes established in boys' track.
- 1970 - Board of Control enlarged to seven members to include one additional school administrator.
R. M. Walseth retires as the Association's first full-time Executive Secretary after 33 years of service.
Dave Evans is selected as the Executive Secretary of the Association.
Ralph Wilkinson is hired as an Assistant Executive Secretary in charge of the non-athletic activities.
- 1971 - Two classes established in wrestling.
- 1972 - First summer Student Council Workshop sponsored by the Association.
- 1973 - Two classes established for drama.
Two classes established for girls' track.
Membership in Association is 212.
- 1974 - Ruth Rehn is hired as an Assistant Executive Secretary, bringing the total number of professional staff members to four.
First State Girls' Gymnastics meet held by the Association.
Two classes established in boys' golf.
All 50 state associations are now members of the National Federation of State High School Associations.
- 1975 - Three classes established in girls' track.
First girls' State "A" & "B" Basketball Tournaments held in Aberdeen and Huron respectively.
- 1976 - Two classes established in gymnastics.
Board of Control membership re-structured to consist of two school board members and five school administrators.
First State Girls' Cross Country Meet held.
- 1977 - Two classes established in girls' golf.
Dave Evans retires as the Association's second Executive Secretary after 15 years of service—8 as an Assistant Executive Secretary, and 7 as the Executive Secretary.
Clar Lilevjen selected as the Executive Secretary of the Association.
Bernie Stocking is hired as an Assistant Executive Secretary.
- 1978 - Membership in Association is 212.
- 1979 - Clar Lilevjen retires as the Association's third Executive Secretary, serving 8 years as an Assistant Executive Secretary, and 2 years as the Executive Secretary. Marlyn Goldhammer is hired as the Executive Secretary.

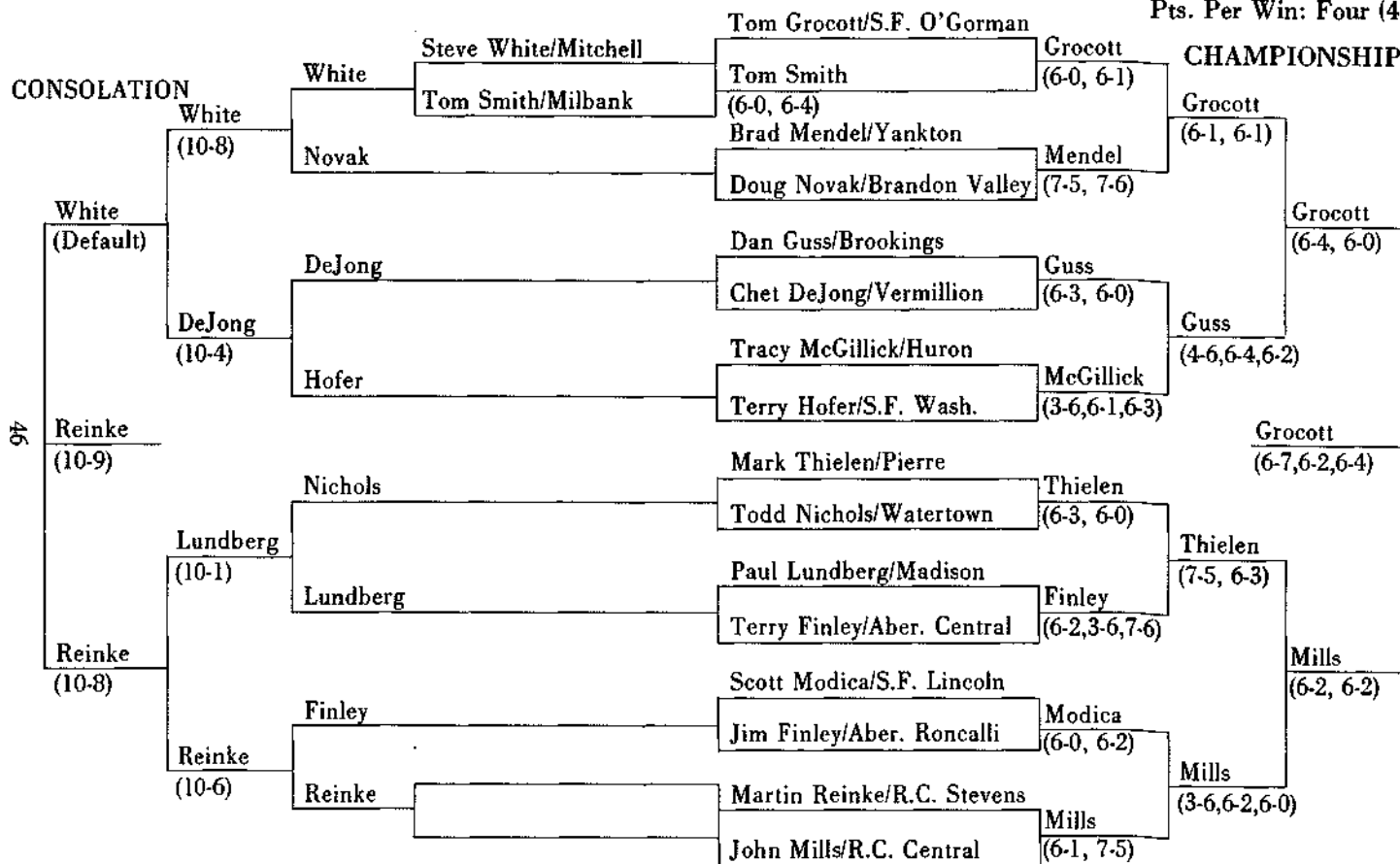

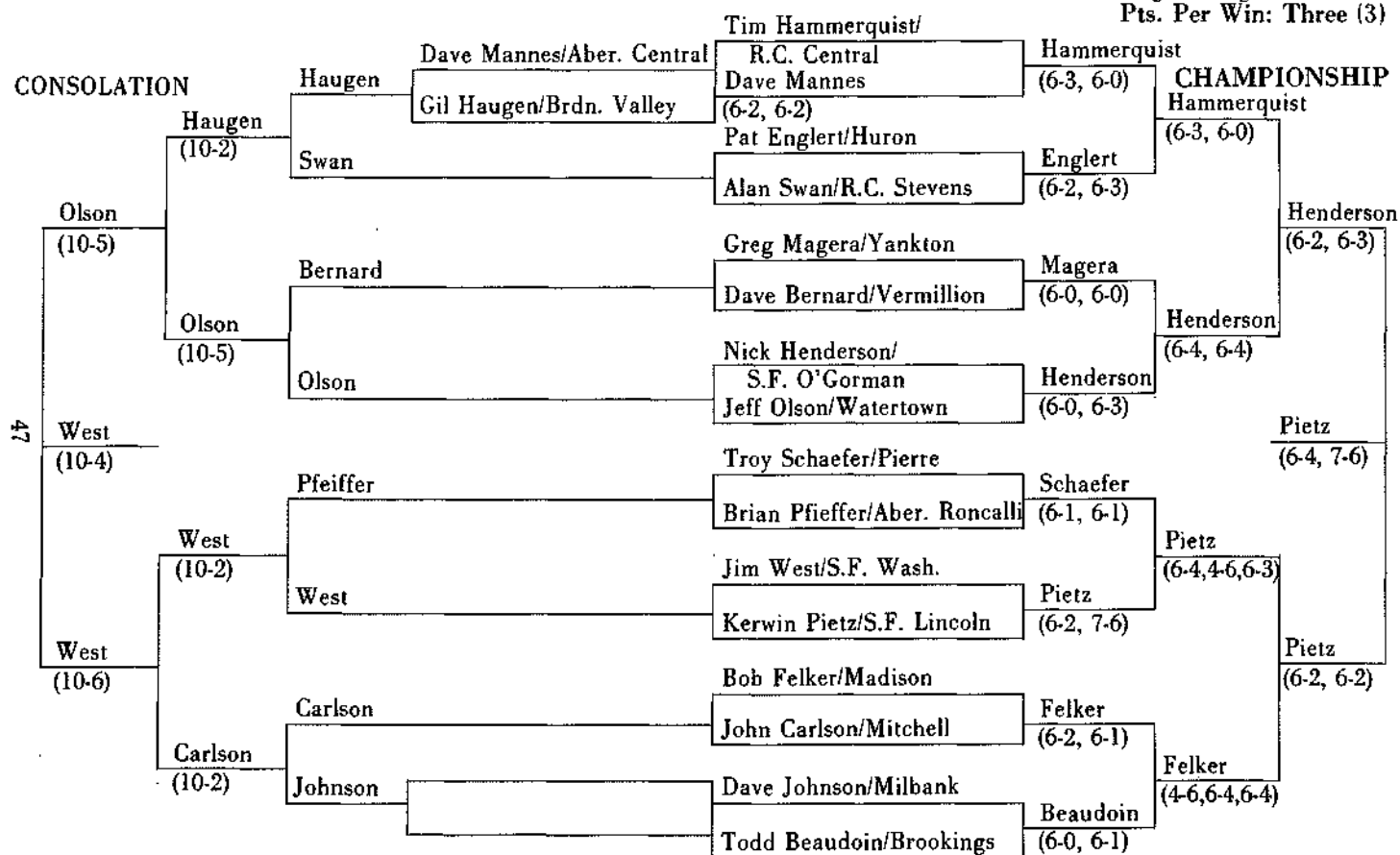

MUSIC

ALL-STATE CHORUS AND ORCHESTRA

The 1980 All-State Chorus and Orchestra was held in the Huron Arena, November 7-8, 1980. The statistics for the music event are as follows:

The director for the All-State Orchestra was Abraham Chavez, Jr. He is widely known in the United States as a violinist, professor and conductor. He has served for the past four seasons as Musical Director/Conductor of the El Paso Symphony Orchestra and as Director of the Instrumental Division in the Music Department of the University of Texas at El Paso. He also is Musical Director/Conductor of the El Paso Symphony Orchestra and the El Paso Philharmonic Orchestra.

The guest conductor for the Chorus was Dr. Karle Erickson, Associate Professor of Music and Director of Choral Studies at Lawrence University, Appleton, Wisconsin. His B.A. Degree is from St. Olaf College, and his Master's and Doctorate are from the School of Music, University of Illinois in Champaign - Urbana. His professional experience has included teaching summer sessions at the University of Illinois, University of Denver, and University of Georgia, directing a week-long choral music festival on the island of Guam, and public school choral-general music instruction in St. James, Minnesota and Sterling, Illinois. As a conductor, adjudicator, clinician or tenor soloist, he considers his task to be that of an educator as well as a professional musician.

Competition on the local level determines which students will attend the Chorus. Each school may send one or more quartets based on the enrollment of the school. The Orchestra members were selected by auditions which included performance and a written test.

The South Dakota Music Educators' Association cooperated with the SDHSAA in planning and operating this All-State Chorus and Orchestra.

ALL-STATE BAND

The All-State Band for 1981 was composed of 167 student musicians from 62 different high schools. The Band rehearsed in the auditorium of the Washington High School, Sioux Falls for two and one-half days before presenting their con-

cert on March 28, 1981. The Band was under the direction of Dr. Harry Begian. This year some 1286 students registered to be auditioned for the Band.

Dr. Harry Begian was named Director of Bands at the University of Illinois, Urbana Campus, in 1970. Immediately prior to this appointment, he was Director of Bands at Michigan State University for three years. Before his work at Michigan State, he had been Director of Bands at Wayne State University. Begian's work at both of these universities carried forward the reputation he earned during his many years at Detroit's Cass Technical High School where he developed one of the finest high school bands in the country. During his last few years at Cass, Begian headed the Music and Performing Arts Department.

Schools represented in the 1981 All-State Band are: Rapid City Stevens with 18 students; followed by Vermillion with 13; Aberdeen Central has 9; Canton has 7; Arlington, Redfield and Sioux Falls Lincoln with 6 each; Groton, Mitchell, and Sioux Falls Washington each have 5; Britton, Huron, Sioux Falls O'Gorman and Watertown have 4 students each; The schools with 3 students each in the band are Brookings, Centerville, Onida, Wessington Springs, and Yankton. Fourteen schools have two students each in the band. They are Aberdeen Roncalli, Chamberlain, Flandreau, Freeman, Hurley, Marion, Milbank, Parkston, Rapid City Central, Scotland, Sturgis, Tripp, White-Deubrook, and Winner. There are 29 schools with one student in the Band. They are Alcester, Beresford, Brandon, Clark, Clear Lake, Colman, Conde, Cresbard, Dell Rapids, Elk Point, Faulkton, Gettysburg, Gregory, Harrisburg, Hitchcock, Hoven, Ipswich, Kadoka, Langford, Lead, Leola, Martin, Mellette, Mobridge, Presho, Spearfish, Stickney, Tulare, and Webster.

The last statistical information about the 1981 All-State Band; there are 92 seniors, 54 juniors, 16 sophomores and 5 freshmen. This year 17 alternates were named. The alternates include four seniors, five juniors, six sophomores and two freshmen.

REGION MUSIC CONTESTS

The schools belonging to the SDHSAA are divided into eight regions with each region conducting music contests. Actually these contests are in the nature of a festival, as each individual or group is striving for a rating with no restrictions upon the judges as to the number of superior ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

All eight regions held contests in 1980-81. In seven regions solo and ensemble contests were held in February. In regions III, V and VII there were no large group contests. Region IV held both the solo and ensemble contests and large group contest on the same weekend.

SPEECH PROGRAMS FOR 1980-81

ORAL INTERPRETATION

The speech program with the largest number of students participating is the oral interpretation program. The students have six categories from which to make their selections. The schools are divided into two classes. The Class "B" schools have their contestants start competition at the district level. The winners from the district contests move on to the division contests. At this contest level, the Class "A" schools have their students enter the competition. The winners from the division level contests go to the STATE FESTIVAL. Statistics continue to show that the students from the Class "B" schools hold their own with the students from the Class "A" schools in both the division and at the State Festival.
