FOREWORD

This YEARBOOK is published annually after the close of the current school year. Its purpose is to serve as an annual report of the Executive Secretary and to provide a complete review of events sponsored during the year by the Association. All statewide events in which championships are determined are summarized and listed in the three sections of this book.

A complete file of published YEARBOOKS gives a complete summary of the activities of the Association since it was organized in December 1905. This does not mean that a YEARBOOK has been published each year since 1905. The first one was published in 1927 and contained a summary of events from the beginning of the organization through the school year 1926-27. Additional YEARBOOKS were published in 1934, 1940, 1942 and 1946. Each covered the activities of more than one year. Since 1946 the YEARBOOK has been an annual publication.

REVIEW OF SDHSAA EVENTS FOR 1984-85

This volume of the YEARBOOK contains complete summaries of the statewide events and business of the SDHSAA for the school year of 1984-85. The annual audit of the Association's finances is not included because of the time of the year, but the audit is published each year in the Annual Meeting Bulletin which will be issued in mid-September.

On the next few pages you will find mention of these events, with complete summaries in the proper order later in the book.

The past year was the twenty-fourth that the Association has been operated as an "Activities Association" and therefore the events mentioned and summarized are for all activities, not only athletics. The boys' athletic summaries are in the first section of the YEARBOOK, the girls' athletic summaries are in the second section, and the Student Council, Journalism, Music and Speech are in the third section of the book.

Even though all activities are directed from the central office, these activities could not be effectively administered without the use of committees made up of dedicated people who are interested in seeing that the particular activity goes well. Think of the many tournaments, meets and contests leading up to the state events. They could not be properly administered without the help of the dedicated professional educators at the local level. The Board of Control, the Executive Secretary, and the Assistant Executive Secretaries wish to thank those who have served on the numerous committees.

WHAT IS THE ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION?

Purpose

The purpose of the South Dakota High School Activities Association is to direct and coordinate interscholastic activities carried on by the member high schools of South Dakota.

It shall have the duty and obligation to control, coordinate, and direct the operation of the interscholastic activity programs of its member schools. Among these programs shall be those in athletics, speech, music, student council, publications, and such like or related programs of activities as now or hereafter may be organized among member schools.

It shall also attempt to equalize activity opportunity by standardizing qualifications for participants, coaching and directing procedures, and treatment of visiting teams and participants in connection with activities.

SDHSAA Contribution to Athletics

In the good old days, anybody could play on the high school team, even the coach, principal, or a college athlete on vacation. Age, school status, reason for being in the district, and related factors were nobody's business. When game brawls and community feuds made conditions bad enough, school administrators awoke to the need for organized action. Since that time, not only in South Dakota but throughout the nation, state athletic and activities associations have proved their worth. Every student in every high school in the state is now assured that he competes under standards that are the same as those that exist in every other high school that voluntarily agrees to be a member of the SDHSAA.

The SDHSAA has not been developed or dominated by any outside individual or group. Rather it has been created and is being expanded by school people because earlier unfavorable experiences have proved it necessary for the welfare of the school program. The amateur spirit cannot survive pressures which develop when controls are not provided.

History

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 for the purpose of managing and fostering high school athletics on a high plane. At that time a Board of Control of three members was chosen to administer the affairs of the Association. They were G. E. Muller, Superintendent of Hurley High School; R. L. Kirk, Superintendent, Aberdeen High School; and A. A. McDonald, Superintendent, Sioux Falls High School.

Initial concerns were primarily in track and field. During the ensuing years it became evident that the SDHSAA should assume the initiative for a well-balanced athletic program to meet the needs of all schools and all students desiring to participate in athletics.

In 1923 the Association became a member of the National Federation of State Athletic Associations which now includes all state associations and several Canadian provinces.

Down through the years each non-athletic school activity formed its own organization. In 1961, largely through the efforts of the South Dakota High School Principals' Association, the member schools voted to become an Activities Association. This step merged all of these organizations into one association which is the present South Dakota High School Activities Association.

Organization

All memberships are voluntary. Any high school in the state, whether public, private, parochial, or institutional, if accredited by the South Dakota Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, may become a member of the Association by making formal application that is authorized by its Board of Education and by subscribing to the rules and by-laws of the Association. Membership once attained is continuous, provided the local school board enacts the annual resolution authorizing membership, the annual dues paid, and all other requirements are met.

The legislative body of the Association consists of the entire membership which meets once each year. Each member school has one vote whether the voting is done at the annual meeting or by mail ballot.

The executive body is the Board of Control, which is made up of seven members. Five of these shall be superintendents or principals of member schools and two shall be Board of Education members of member schools. The Board of Control meets at least six times each year and is charged with interpreting the Constitution and By-Laws, organizing and directing tournaments and meets, determining penalties and forfeitures for violations of rules, settling disputes, registering sports officials, establishing the state office, and employing an executive secretary and staff to administer the Association.

The South Dakota High School Activities Association established a Distinguished Service Award program in 1976 with the first awards being presented at the State Basketball Tournaments in 1977. Purpose of the program is to recognize outstanding service to the youth of the state through various high school activities programs. Candidates for the award are nominated by the schools with the final selection being made by the Board of Control. Until 1983-84 the awards fell into three categories: Service Through The News Media, Service Through School Programs, and Service Through Community Support. Effective the 1985-86 school year, the categories were changed to include the following: Administrator, Board of Education Member, Coach, Contributor, Director, and Official.

MILESTONES IN HISTORY OF SOUTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

- 1905 - School administrators organize South Dakota High School Athletic Association for purpose of sponsoring, coordinating and supervising interschool athletic competition.
- 1906 - State Track Meet, won by Sioux Falls, is first athletic event sponsored by the new Association.
- 1908 - Arrangements made for Black Hills schools to affiliate with Association. Membership totals 23.
- 1910 - Declamation contest held in conjunction with the State Track Meet. This practice was subsequently discontinued and the administration of declamation placed under the control of local committees.
- 1912 - An invitational basketball tournament at Huron College was approved by the Association as a State Tournament. In the finals, Redfield defeated Lake Preston 33-25.
- 1915 - Sioux Falls wins first State Debate Championship.
- 1917 - First Official State Basketball Tournament sponsored by the Association. In the finals, Huron defeated Aberdeen 23-22. Twenty-nine teams participated.
- 1918 - Membership totals 55 schools.
- 1920 - Hammer throw eliminated as a State Track Meet event.
- 1922 - South Dakota High School Journalism Association is founded.
- 1923 - Joined the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations. Charter members include Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, and Wisconsin. South Dakota is among the next group of four to join.
- 1927 - The Speech Association establishes state extemp contests.
- 1928 - Membership in Association is 268 schools.
First State Tennis and Golf Tournaments held at Brookings.
- 1930 - Mitchell wins first Class "B" basketball championship and Huron wins first State "A". District runners-up competed in the "B", while district champions went on to the Class "A" state tournament. Plan discontinued after one year.
- 1935 - The Speech Association establishes state original oratory contests.
- 1936 - Schools split into Class "A" and Class "B" for basketball. Down to the present time, a champion has been determined in each class. The number of schools competing and the system of elimination used in Class "A" has varied from time to time. The Class "B" plan has remained constant since 1936.
- 1937 - Membership totals 315 schools.
Association hires first full-time executive secretary--R. M. Walseth.
- 1946 - Two classes established for state track competition. First State Cross Country Run held. Fifty-one boys from 12 schools competed.
- 1947 - Membership in Association is 284.
- 1951 - First All-State Band held in Sioux Falls.
- 1953 - State Speech Association establishes two classes of competition in forensics.
- 1958 - First Invitational State Wrestling Tournament approved by the Association. Membership in Association is 264.
- 1960 - First Official State Wrestling Tournament is held and was won by Spearfish.
- 1961 - The Association becomes an Activities Association embracing speech, music, student council, and journalism, as well as athletics.
- 1962 - Dave Evans is hired as an Assistant Executive Secretary. The Association now has two full-time professional staff members.
- 1965 - Board of Control enlarged to include school board member.
- 1966 - Parochial and private schools become eligible for Association membership.

- 1967 - Three classes created for state Cross County competition.
- 1968 - Membership in Association is 229.
- 1969 - Clar Lilevjen is hired as an Assistant Executive Secretary, bringing the professional staff to three persons.
First Girls' State Track, Golf, and Tennis meets held by the Association.
Three classes established in boys' track.
- 1970 - Board of Control enlarged to seven members to include one additional school administrator.
R. M. Walseth retires as the Association's first full-time Executive Secretary after 33 year of service.
Dave Evans is selected as the Executive Secretary of the Association.
Ralph Wilkinson is hired as an Assistant Executive Secretary in charge of the non-athletic activities.
- 1971 - Two classes established in wrestling.
- 1972 - First summer Student Council Workshop sponsored by the Association.
- 1973 - Two classes established for drama.
Two classes established for girls' track.
Membership in Association is 212.
- 1974 - Ruth Rehn is hired as an Assistant Executive Secretary, bringing the total number of professional staff members to four.
First State Girls' Gymnastics meet held by the Association.
Two classes established in boys' golf.
All 50 state associations are now members of the National Federation of State High School Associations.
- 1975 - Three classes established in girls' track.
First girls' State "A" and "B" Basketball Tournaments held in Aberdeen and Huron respectively.
- 1976 - Two classes established in gymnastics.
Board of Control membership re-structured to consist of two school board members and five school administrators.
First State Girls' Cross Country Meet held.
- 1977 - Two classes established in girls' golf.
Dave Evans retires as the Association's second Executive Secretary after 15 years of service--8 as an Assistant Executive Secretary, and 7 as the Executive Secretary.
Clar Lilevjen selected as the Executive Secretary of the Association.
Bernie Stocking is hired as an Assistant Executive Secretary.
- 1978 - Membership in the Association is 212.
- 1979 - Clar Lilevjen retires as the Association's third Executive Secretary, serving 8 years as an Assistant Executive Secretary, and 2 years as the Executive Secretary. Marlyn Goldhammer is hired as the fourth full-time Executive Secretary.
- 1981 - Clar Lilevjen, former Association Executive Secretary, died at his home in Spearfish.
First Official Football Play-offs held in five (5) classes with Bridgewater, Freeman, DeSmet, Winner, and Sioux Falls O'Gorman as Champions.
R. M. "Bus" Walseth, Association's first full-time Executive Secretary died in Pierre.
- 1982 - First Girls' State Volleyball Tournament held.
Moved into new office headquarters at 204 North Euclid Avenue in Pierre.
- 1983 - Membership in Association is 207. First year for cooperative sponsorship of school activities.
- 1984 - First year for two classes in Volleyball with Webster as "B" champion and Sioux Falls Washington as "A" champion. Track schools classified as follows: 16-64-122 in Class "AA", "A" and "B" respectively.

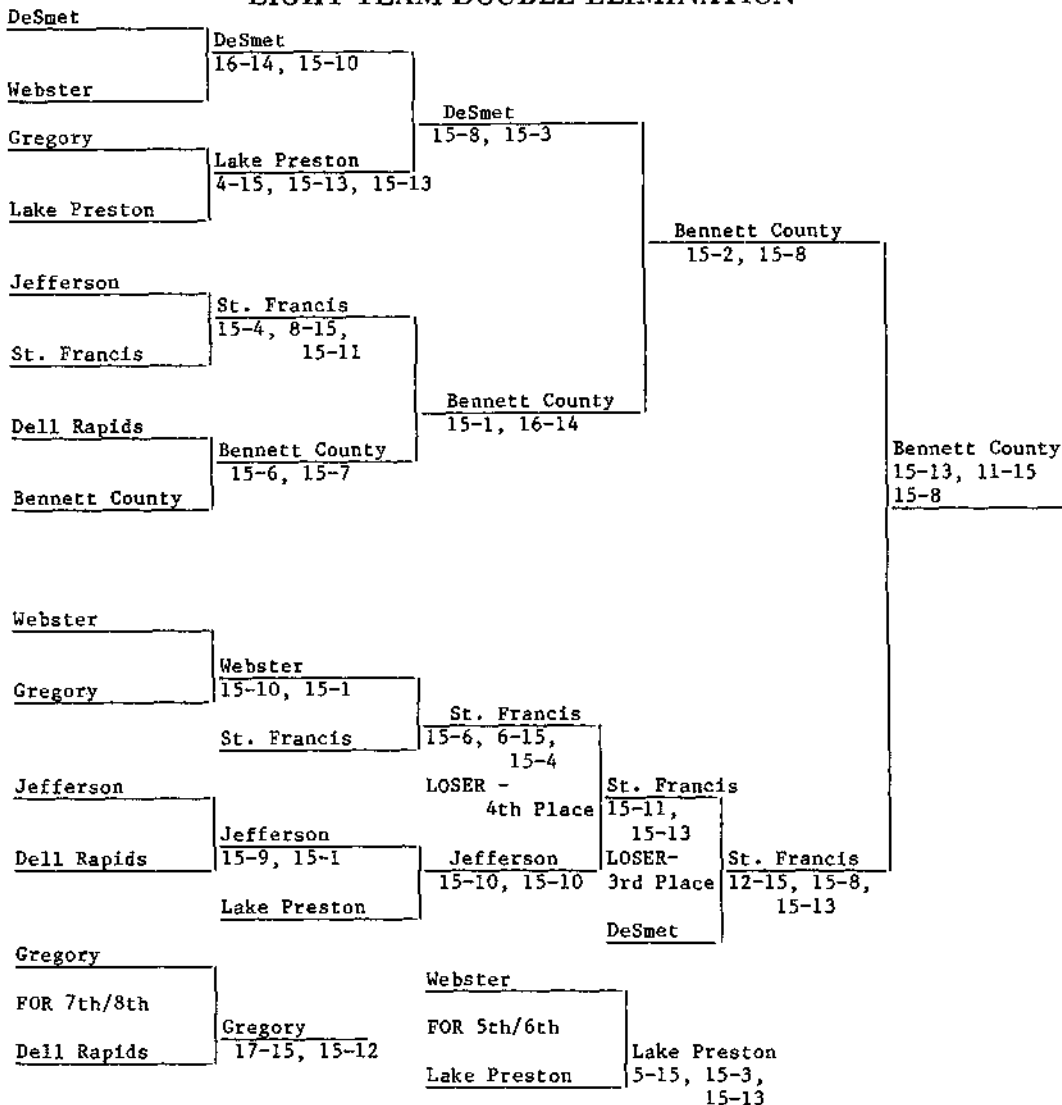

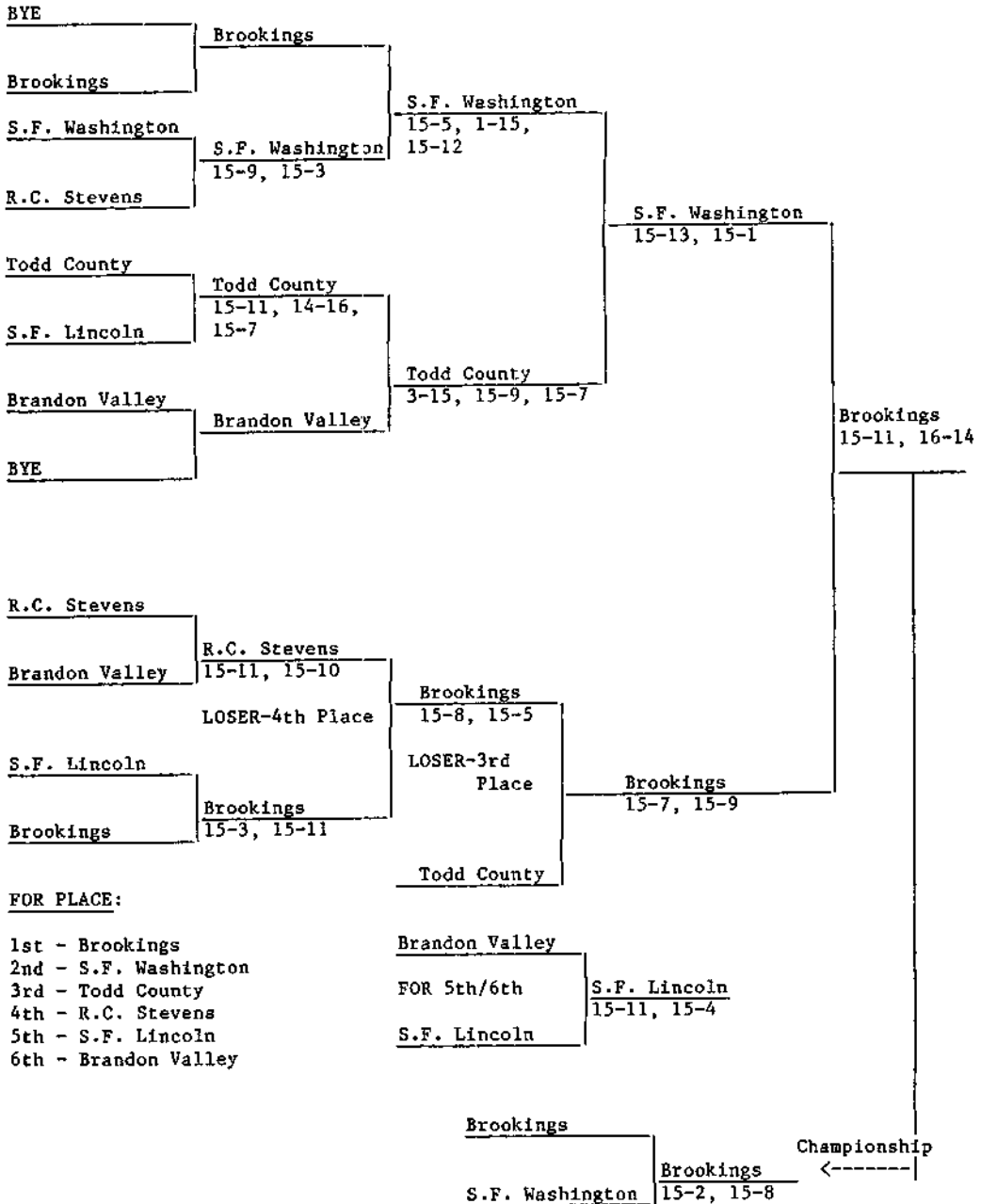

HIGH SCHOOL PRESS CONVENTION

D. J. Cline, Director of High School Journalism Activities for the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication at SDSU, was keynote speaker at the 1984 South Dakota High School Press Convention, October 8.

"If you want to look for the negative side of journalism in this state, you certainly can find it," Cline said. "In fact, one would have to say that the odds are against journalism in South Dakota high schools. Journalism usually is not on the administration's priority list."

Cline said that lack of administrative enthusiasm has not, however, killed off journalism in the state. "In fact," she said, "accomplishments in journalism have been remarkable. For example, there has been substantial improvement in the past ten years in the quality of both newspapers and yearbooks entered in the annual publications contest."

"South Dakota students have more potential than they give themselves credit for," Cline said. She urged students to "Go for It" this year and make their publications the best ever.

During the day 39 mini-workshops were conducted by a staff of 20 journalism faculty, advisors, journalism majors, and other professionals. Awards were made for outstanding publications. Scholarships were awarded, All-State Journalists and Photographers were recognized. Service certificates were presented to publication advisors, and the 1984 Founder's Award was presented to Watertown High School newspaper advisor, Dave McFarland.

Attendance at the convention was close to last year's level. The 1984 convention was the 60th year of a convention at SDSU.

During the general session of the Convention the All-State awards were presented by Ralph Wilkinson, SDHSAA. Four schools received "Top of Class" awards. This award is based upon the combined scores for their yearbook and newspaper which must have received an All-State rating. The school with the highest combined score in each division receives "Top of Class." "Top of Class" awards were presented to:

ALL-STATE CHORUS AND ORCHESTRA

The 1984 All-State Chorus and Orchestra was held in the Watertown Civic Arena, November 2-3, 1984. The statistics for the largest musical event in South Dakota are as follows:

The director for the All-State Orchestra was Dr. George Trautwein. Dr. George Trautwein is presently the Director of Instrumental ensembles at Wake Forest University, Wake Forest, NC. Many people may remember him as he was the music director with the South Dakota Symphony from 1972-1977. His engagements as a Guest Conductor list many noted orchestras such as the Wichita Symphony Orchestra, the Miami Philharmonic Orchestra and the National Orchestra of the Philippines (Manila). This list also contains many All-State organizations, music festivals and summer camps too numerous to mention. Dr. Trautwein has also been an artistic consultant with orchestras throughout the U. S. for the consulting firm of Douglas Richards Associates of Phoenix, Arizona and for the National Endowment of the Arts.

He is a member of the Advisory Board of the Avery Fischer Awards in New York City. He was named "Alumnus of the Year" by the School of Music of Indiana University, where he studied and received his music degree in Conducting and Opera Literature.

The Guest Conductor for All-State Chorus was Paul Ritter. Paul Ritter is currently the director of choirs and music department head at Great Falls High School in Great Falls, Montana. Mr. Ritter and the Delphian Choir have received regional and national acclaim, appearing at three divisional and two national MENC conventions, plus two ACDA regional conventions in the past ten years. He has also maintained an active role in choral affairs in the Northwest as past-president of the Montana Choral Directors Association and president-elect of the ACDA Northwest Division.

Mr. Ritter has been principal director of the Montana Youth Choir for the past twelve years. This 44 voice honor choir of young Montanans has completed thirteen consecutive European concert tours to outstanding critical acclaim. Ritter has traveled with the choir to Holland, West and East Germany, Austria, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Italy, France, Switzerland and Belgium.

Mr. Ritter received bachelors degrees in Music and History, and a Masters degree in Music from Montana State University. He is nearing completion of the doctorate at the University of Missouri at Kansas City. He has had additional study in Salzburg, Austria, and at the University of Denver. Mr. Ritter is a well-known adjudicator and conductor in the Northwest.

ALL-STATE BAND

The 1985 All-State Band was held at Corn Palace, Mitchell on March 21-22-23, 1985. The Band consisted of 163 students who auditioned in January with some 900 other students to vie for membership in this year's All-State Band.

Dr. James Jurrens is Chairman of the Music Department and Director of Bands at Southwestern State University, Weatherford, Oklahoma. He has held this position since 1970. His past teaching experience includes twelve years in public schools as well as the University of South Dakota at Springfield, Dakota Wesleyan University in South Dakota, and Minot State College in North Dakota.

Dr. Jurrens has composed and arranged twelve publications which have been published by Jenson Publications, Carl Fisher and Southern Music Publishing Company.

At present he serves as the Southwest District Chairman for the National Band Association. He is also president elect of OMEA.

The 1985 Band had representation from 51 schools. The schools and the number of students from each school are as follows:

Rapid City Stevens with 20 students; followed by Aberdeen Central with 16; Canton with 13; Sioux Falls Lincoln has 11 students; Brookings with 9; Yankton has 8; Webster with 7; Arlington with 6; Clear Lake, Mitchell and Vermillion each have 5 students; Sioux Falls Washington with 4; Groton, Madison, Redfield and Watertown each have 3; Avon, Freeman Public, Highmore, Hill City, Irene, Milbank and Scotland each have 2; Armour, Beresford, Centerville, DeSmet, Eureka, Faulkton, Freeman Academy, Gettysburg, Gregory, Harrisburg, Huron, Ipswich, Lake Preston, Langford, Lemmon, Marion, Mellette, Mission, Parkston, Pierre, Roscoe, Sioux Falls O'Gorman, Stickney, Sturgis, Tripp, Volga, Warner and Winner each have one student in the band.

Another set of statistical information about the membership of the 1985 All-State Band: 75 Seniors, 45 Juniors, 37 Sophomores and 6 Freshman. There were 14 alternates named this year and from this group there are 0 seniors, 5 Juniors, 5 Sophomores and 4 Freshmen.

REGION MUSIC CONTESTS

The schools belonging to the SDHSAA are divided into eight regions with each region conducting music contests. Actually these contests are in the nature of a festival, as each individual or group is striving for a rating, with no restrictions upon the judges as to the number of superior ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

All eight regions held contests in 1984-85. In seven regions solo and ensemble contests were held in February. In regions III, V and VII there were no large group contests. Region IV held both the solo and ensemble contests and large group contests on the same weekend.

SPEECH

ORAL INTERPRETATION

The speech program with the largest number of students participating is the oral interpretation program. The students have six categories from which to make their selections. The schools are divided into two classes. The Class "B" schools have their contestants start competition at the district level. The winners from the district contests move on to the division contests. At this contest level, the Class "A" schools have their students enter the competition. The winners from the division level contests go to the State Festival. Statistics continue to show that the students from the Class "B" schools hold their own with the students from the Class "A" schools in both the division and at the State Festival.
