WHAT IS THE ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION?

Purpose

The purpose of the South Dakota High School Activities Association is to rect and coordinate interscholastic activities carried on by the member h schools of South Dakota.

It shall have the duty and obligation to control, coordinate, and direct operation of the interscholastic activity programs of its member schools. Amounthese programs shall be those in athletics, speech, music, student council, publications, and such like or related programs of activities as now or hereafter may organized among member schools.

It shall also attempt to equalize activity opportunity by standardizing quafications for participants, coaching and directing procedures, and treatment visiting teams and participants in connection with activities.

SDHSAA Contribution to Athletics

In the good old days, anybody could play on the high school team, even t coach, principal, or a college athlete on vacation. Age, school status, reason f being in the district, and related factors were nobody's business. When gabrawls and community feuds made conditions bad enough, school administrators awe to the need for organized action. Since that time, not only in South Dakota be throughout the nation, state athletic and activities associations have proved the worth. Every student in every high school in the state is now assured that he copetes under standards that are the same as those that exist in every other his school that voluntarily agrees to be a member of the SDHSAA.

The SDHSAA has not been developed or dominated by any outside individual group. Rather it has been created and is being expanded by school people becau earlier unfavorable experiences have proved it necessary for the welfare of t school program. The amateur spirit cannot survive pressures which develop wh controls are not provided.

History

The SDHSAA was organized in 1905 for the purpose of managing and fosteri high school athletics on a high plane. At that time a Board of Control of thr members was chosen to administer the affairs of the Association. They were G. Muller, Superintendent of Hurley High School; R. L. Kirk, Superintendent, Aberdeligh School; and A. A. McDonald, Superintendent, Sioux Falls High School.

Initial concerns were primarily in track and field. During the ensuing yea: it became evident that the SDHSAA should assume the initiative for a well-balance athletic program to meet the needs of all schools and all students desiring a participate in athletics.

In 1923 the Association became a member of the National Federation of Stat Athletic Associations which now includes all state associations and several Canadian provinces.

Down through the years each non-athletic school activity formed its own organzation. In 1961, largely through the efforts of the South Dakota High School rincipals' Association, the member schools voted to become an Activities Associaion. This step merged all of these organizations into one association which is he present South Dakota High School Activities Association.

rganization

All memberships are voluntary. Any high school in the state, whether public, rivate, parochial, or institutional, if accredited by the South Dakota Division of lementary and Secondary Education, may become a member of the Association by aking formal application that is authorized by its Board of Education and by sub-ribing to the rules and by-laws of the Association. Membership once attained is ontinuous, provided the local school board enacts the annual resolution authoring membership, the annual dues paid, and all other requirements are met.

The legislative body of the Association consists of the entire membership tich meets once each year. Each member school has one vote whether the voting is one at the annual meeting or by mail ballot.

The executive body is the Board of Control, which is made up of seven embers. Five of these shall be superintendents or principals of member schools id two shall be Board of Education members of member schools. The Board of Concol meets at least six times each year and is charged with interpreting the Contitution and By-Laws, organizing and directing tournaments and meets, determining nalties and forfeitures for violations of rules, settling disputes, registering forts officials, establishing the state office, and employing an executive secrety and staff to administer the Association.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS

SCHOOL SERVICE 1977-1983

The South Dakota High School Activites Association established a Distinguishe Service Award program in 1976 with the first awards being presented at the Stat Basketball Tournaments in 1977. Purpose of the program is to recognize outstandin service to the youth of the state through various high school activities programs Candidates for the award are nominated by the schools with the final selectio being made by the Board of Control. Until 1983-84 the awards fell into thre categories: Service Through The News Media, Service Through School Programs, an Service Through Community Support. Effective the 1985-86 school year, th categories were changed to include the following: Administrator, Board of Education Member, Coach, Contributor, Director, and Official.

MILESTONES IN HISTORY OF SOUTH DAKOTA HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

- 1905 School administrators organize South Dakota High School Athletic Association for purpose of sponsoring, coordinating and supervising interschool athletic competition.
- 1906 State Track Meet, won by Sioux Falls, is first athletic event sponsored by the new Association.
- 1908 Arrangements made for Black Hills schools to affiliate with Association.

 Membership totals 23.
- 1910 Declamation contest held in conjunction with the State Track Meet. This practice was subsequently discontinued and the administration of declamation placed under the control of local committees.
- 1912 An invitational basketball tournament at Huron College was approved by the Association as a State Tournament. In the finals, Redfield defeated Lake Preston 33-25.
- 1915 Sioux Falls wins first State Debate Championship.
- 1917 ~ First Official State Basketball Tournament sponsored by the Association. In the finals, Huron defeated Aberdeen 23-22. Twenty-nine teams participated.
- 1918 ~ Membership totals 55 schools.
- 1920 Hammer throw eliminated as a State Track Meet event.
- 1922 South Dakota High School Journalism Association is founded.
- 1923 Joined the National Federation of State High School Athletic Associations. Charter members include Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, and Wisconsin. South Dakota is among the next group of four to join.
- 1927 The Speech Association establishes state extemp contests.
- 1928 Membership in Association is 268 schools.

First State Tennis and Golf Tournaments held at Brookings.

- 1930 Mitchell wins first Class "B" basketball championship and Huron wins first State "A". District runners-up competed in the "B", while district champions went on to the Class "A" state tournament. Plan discontinued after one year.
- 1935 The Speech Association establishes state original oratory contests.
- 1936 Schools split into Class "A" and Class "B" for basketball. Down to the present time, a champion has been determined in each class. The number of schools competing and the system of elimination used in Class "A" has varied from time to time. The Class "B" plan has remained constant since 1936.
- 1937 ~ Membership totals 315 schools.

 Association hires first full-time executive secretary--R. M. Walseth.
- 1946 Two classes established for state track competition. First State Cross Country Run held. Fifty-one boys from 12 schools competed.
- 1947 Membership in Association is 284.
- 1951 First All-State Band held in Sioux Falls.
- 1953 State Speech Association establishes two classes of competition in forensics.
- 1958 First Invitational State Wrestling Tournament approved by the Association. Nembership in Association is 264.
- 1960 First Official State Wrestling Tournament is held and was won by Spearfish.
- 1961 The Association becomes an Activities Association embracing speech, music, student council, and journalism, as well as athletics.
- 1962 Dave Evans is bired as an Assistant Executive Secretary. The Association now has two full-time professional staff members.

- 165 Board of Control enlarged to include school board member.
- 166 Parochial and private schools become eligible for Association membership.
- 367 Three classes created for state Cross County competition.
- 168 Membership in Association is 229.
- 169 Clar Lilevjen is bired as an Assistant Executive Secretary, bringing the professional staff to three persons. First Girls' State Track, Golf, and Tennis meets held by the Association.
- Three classes established in boys' track.

 170 Board of Control enlarged to seven members to include one additional school administrator.
 - R. M. Walseth retires as the Association's first full-time Executive Secretary after 33 year of service.

Dave Evans is selected as the Executive Secretary of the Association.

Ralph Wilkinson is hired as an Assistant Executive Secretary in charge of the non-athletic activities.

- 171 Two classes established in wrestling.
- 172 First summer Student Council Workshop sponsored by the Association.
- 173 Two classes establised for drama. Two classes established for girls' track.
- Membership in Association is 212.

 174 Ruth Rehn is hired as an Assistant Executive Secretary, bringing the total number of professional staff members to four.

First State Girls' Gymnastics meet held by the Association.

- Two classes established in boys' golf.
 All 50 state associations are now members of the National Federation of
 State High School Associations.
- '75 Three classes established in girls' track.

 First girls' State "A" and "B" Basketball Tournaments held in Aberdeen and

 Board of Control membership re-structured to consist of two school board members and five school administrators.

Clar Lilevjen selected as the Executive Secretary of the Association. Bernie Stocking is hired as an Assistant Executive Secretary.

- 179 Clar Lilevjen retires as the Association's third Executive Secretary, serving 8 years as an Assistant Executive Secretary, and 2 years as the Executive Secretary. Marlyn Goldhammer is hired as the fourth full-time Executive Secretary.
- '81 Clar Lilevjen, former Association Executive Secretary, died at his home in Spearfish.
 - First Official Football Play-offs held in five (5) classes with Bridgewater, Freeman, DeSmet, Winner, and Sioux Falls O'Gorman as Champions.
 - R. M. "Bus" Walseth, Association's first full-time Executive Secretary died in Pierre.
- '82 First Girls' State "A" and "B" Volleyball Tournaments held.

 Moved into new office headquarters at 204 North Euclid Avenue in Pierre.
- 183 Membership in Association is 207. First year for cooperative sponsorship of school activities.



FOUNDER'S AWARD WINNER

Richard Anderson, a Webb, lowa native was named the recipient of the 1986 Founder's Award. The award is given annually to an outstanding journalism teacher in South Dakota.

Anderson has been teaching in the Yankton School District for 25 years. He has advised the high school newspaper, the Woksape, for 18 years. During that time the paper has received 13 consecutive All-State ratings for excellence.

Anderson is active on the Community Concert Board in Yankton, teaches a third and fourth grade Sunday School class at the United Methodist Church and is a member of a newly formed Centennial Commission. He is a member of the South Dakota Education Association and National Education Associations.

He is a past chairman of the United Way Board of Directors and has been the chairman of the Help Mobile, a group of outstanding teachers who traveled around South Dakota and presented activities which they have used in their classrooms.

Anderson has served on several committees appointed by the State Board of Education. He was named an outstanding young educator by the Yankton Jaycees. He has also been the president of the Supervisors of School Publications, served on the SDHSAA Journalism Advisory Committee and directed the Publications Institute one year.

MUSIC

ALL-STATE CHORUS AND ORCHESTRA

The 1986 All-State Chorus and Orchestra was held in the Sioux Falls Arena November 7-8, 1986. The statistics for the largest musical event in South Dakot are as follows:

The director for All-State Orchestra was Mr. Robert Culver from Ann Arbor Michigan. Robert Culver, Associate Professor of Music Education in The University o Michigan School of Music, is a performing violist, conductor, and string specialist. A graduate of the University of Oregon and the Eastman School of Music he has been violist with the Rochester Philharmonic, the Detroit Symphony, and the Hughes Quartet of The Ohio State University.

Professor Culver has attained an international reputation as a public school orchestral conductor and has been a key figure in the development of string orchestras throughout the United States. At The University of Michigan he has majoresponsibility for preparing string specialists as teachers at public school and collegiate levels. He also continues an extensive involvement as conductor of regional and all-state ensembles.

Prior to joining the Michigan faculty, Professor Culver was string specialist in the Corvallis, Oregon, Public Schools; orchestra director in the Springfield and Salem, Oregon, Public Schools; a member of the faculty of The Ohio State University and conductor of the youth orchestras in Columbus, Ohio, in conjunction with the Columbus Symphony Orchestra.

He is active internationally as a recitalist and a clinician in the development of school orchestras and string programs. In 1982, with grants to the Australia: String Teachers Association from the Australian Council and the Ministries of Education of the individual Australian states, Culver began the direction of a series of far-reaching programs to remold and upgrade instrumental music teaching, from university level down to elementary school, throughout Australia.

The director for All-State Chorus was Mr. Eph Ebly of Kansas City, Missouri. Eph nly, Chairman of the Division of Conductin g Studies at the University of Missouriansas City Conservatory of Music, is among the most sought-after Choral Clinicians this country. He has conducted over 36 All-State Festival Choirs, and as eacher, conductor, lecturer and clinician, he has made guest appearances in over 35 tates, Canada and Europe.

The popularity of his unique and enthusiastic approach to teaching is evidenced / UMKC's selection of Dr. Ehly for the Amoco Foundation's "OUTSTANDING TEACHING VARD." In September, 1980, his alma mater, Kearney State College in Nebraska, prented him the first "OUTSTANDING ALUMNI AWARD" during its Diamond Jubilee Celebraton. In 1979 the Missouri Choral Directors Association presented him with the LUTHER SPADE CHORAL DIRECTOR OF THE YEAR AWARD" for his contributions to the choral ft.

The Heritage Chorale, a select ensemble under Dr. Ehly's direction, has become ecognized as one of the most outstanding collegiate choirs in the United States. Leir unique and flexible sound is the result of a choral philosophy Ehly has develoed through the years of secondary, collegiate and professional conducting experences. They have toured throughout Europe and Japan.

The Kansas City Civic Chorus under Ehly's direction, performs regularly with the insas City Symphony, The Lyric Opera and the Kansas City Civic Orchestra. Following a performance of Berlioz's "L'Enfance du Christ" the conductor, Sarah Caldwell, toke of the Chorus thus: "... the most flexible ... the best prepared ... erhaps the best community choir I have worked with."

Dr. Ehly is a firm believer in the solo voice, and when conducting choral groups, strives to create an exciting sound by accepting blends rather than forcing it. lerefore, each group he conducts has its own distinctive coloration of sound, but thin a framework of acceptable vocal techniques. Ehly's knowledge and experience avant-garde choral music, i.e., music which uses advanced compositional chniques, combined with his use of present-day practices of good vocal techniques, we steadily gained acclaim for Dr. Ehly and his choirs. Dr. Ehly is a past recipint of two faculty grants which took him to France, England, Sweden, Denmark, Gerny, Italy, Poland, Soviet Union, Austria and Switzerland. While in these suntries, he studied choral music which utilizes advanced compositional chniques.

He received his Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Colorado and s MM degree from George Peabody College, Nashville, Tennessee. His BA degree is som Kearney State College in Kearney, Nebraska. Notable teachers he has studied th include: Robert Bays, Jean Berger, Julius Hereford, Warner Imig, George Lynn, buis Nicholas, Vincent Persichetti and Lynn Whitten.

Presently, Ehly teaches graduate classes at UMKC which offers the DMA and MM igrees in Choral Conducting. UMKC offers an active summer choral program in which he choral division sponsors numerous workshops, among them the NATIONAL CHORAL (MPOSIUM with leading teachers and conductors from all over the world.

Mr. Curtis is Director of Bands and conductor of the University Wind Symphony t California State University, Long Beach. He is internationally recognized as one f the foremost wind ensemble conductors on the current scene. With 27 years of rofessional experience to his credit, Mr. Curis has conducted over 70 performances n Europe, the Orient, and Australia, including a live concert broadcast from the restigious radio studio of Suisse Romane Radio in Geneva, Switzerland, and a igital recording released in 1981 by CBS-Sony of Japan. In 1983, he received a rant from Yamaha International to conduct and co-produce, with saxophone artist Leo otts, a televised musical special entitled, "The Saxophone Experience." Mr. Curtis ecently completed a book, co-authored with David L. Kuehn, entitled A Guide to uccessful Instrumental Conducting. His accomplished style and technique as a rofessional musician and educator has merited invitations as a guest conductor/ linician in music camps, directors workshops, and conducting symposiums. His fresh nterpretations and the ability to achieve full tonal colors from wind performance rgainzations provide his audiences with a unique listening experience. Mr. Curtis olds honorary membership in Phi Mu Alpha, Kappa Kappa Psi and Pi Kappa Lambda, and n addition to being Past-president of the Western Division of the College Band Dirctors National Association, is also member of the American Bandmasters Association. n 1980, the California State University, Long Beach Associated Students acknowleged Ir. Curtis' contributions to education by designating him "Professor of the Year."

REGION MUSIC CONTESTS

The schools belonging to the SDHSAA are divided into eight regions with each region conducting music contests. Actually these contests are in the nature of a festival, as each individual or group is striving for a rating, with no restrictions upon the judges as to the number of superior ratings which may be awarded in each category. There is no advancement to a state contest.

All eight regions held contests in 1986-87. In seven regions solo and ensemble contests were held in February. In regions III, V and VII there were no large group contests. Region IV held both the solo and ensemble contests and large group contests on the same weekend.

The speech program with the largest number of students participating is the ora interpretation program. The students have six categories from which to make thei selections.
